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## Crime and Arrests in Wisconsin - 1988

### Introduction

This report, prepared by the Wisconsin Statistical Analysis Center (SAC), presents data on crime and arrests in Wisconsin during 1988. From 1970 through 1981 the state Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program, operated by the Crime Information Bureau of the Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ), collected, compiled, and reported crime and arrest data for Wisconsin. Beginning in 1971, DOJ also provided data to the national UCR system, a program of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Effective December 31, 1981, the state program operated by DOJ was discontinued. The 1981 data collected by DOJ were transmitted directly to the FBI, and the 1981 Wisconsin Crime and Arrests report, prepared by SAC, was based for the most part on information provided to SAC by the FBI. In 1982 and again in 1983 Wisconsin law enforcement agencies transmitted their UCR data directly to the FBI, but in addition provided copies of the principal offense and arrest forms to the Statistical Analysis Center. As of 1984, Wisconsin resumed its status as part of the national UCR system. Since 1984, Wisconsin law enforcement agencies have provided complete UCR data to SAC, which in turn has transmitted the data to the FBI via computer tape.

### The National UCR Program

The national Uniform Crime Reporting Program was initiated in 1930 by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP). After soliciting input from law enforcement agencies throughout the country, an IACP committee developed uniform crime definitions and reporting procedures which could be used by law enforcement agencies in every state. The FBI was designated as the national clearinghouse for UCR data. The Committee on Uniform Crime Records of the IACP continues to serve the national program in an advisory capacity. In 1956, the National Sheriff's Association also established a Committee on Uniform Crime Reports to act as an advisory body to the program. The FBI regularly receives data on reported crime and arrests from law enforcement agencies throughout the country. The data are provided either by individual law enforcement agencies or by state UCR programs which collect and compile data for their states and convey the data to the FBI. From these data the FBI publishes its annual report, Crime in the United States.

### The Wisconsin UCR Program

The FBI recognized the Wisconsin Council on Criminal Justice (WCCJ) as the administrator of the Wisconsin State Uniform Crime Reporting Program effective January 1, 1984. It should be noted that the WCCJ was changed to the Office of Justice Assistance as of October 1, 1987. As indicated above, the original Wisconsin UCR program, operated by DOJ, was discontinued in 1981. The program operated by DOJ from 1970 through 1981 required that all law enforcement agencies submit UCR data either directly or through the county sheriff's office. It also required that DOJ submit the prescribed data to the FBI. DOJ expanded the national UCR program's classifications to collect more detailed and appropriate data on Wisconsin crime and arrests. From the statewide UCR data, DOJ published its annual report Wisconsin Crime and Arrests, as well as quarterly, semi-annual, and other summary reports.

In November, 1981, the WCCJ received a grant from the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Statistics, to develop the Wisconsin Statistical Analysis Center. The SAC was mandated by executive order to collect and analyze criminal justice data, produce statistical reports on crime and the justice system, and promote development of criminal justice information systems. From 1981 through 1983, SAC assumed a substantial number of the functions of the state UCR

program to meet the information needs of state and local criminal justice decision-makers, elected officials and interested citizens. Since January, 1984, Wisconsin once again has designated a State UCR Program officially recognized by the FBI and part of the national system of state UCR programs.

#### Issues in Comparison of this Report with Earlier Reports

Care should be exercised in making comparisons of the data in this report with the data contained in previous annual reports. Adjustments may be required for the following reasons:

-- Shifting of a law enforcement agency from one population category to another based on annual re-estimation of the jurisdiction's population.

-- On occasion, the Federal Government designates an additional Wisconsin county as being included in a Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area. This would shift a Sheriff's Office from the Rural Areas category to the Suburban Sheriffs' group. (See footnote 5 on page 15 for a listing of Suburban Sheriffs' Offices.)

-- Populations are estimated for non-census years. Rates for 1988 are calculated using 1980 census data, updated with 1988 estimates published by the Demographic Services Center, Wisconsin Department of Administration.


-- County totals shown in Tables 1-9 of this report are estimates which compensate for instances of missing data when appropriate. In the 1981 Wisconsin Crime and Arrests report, these totals were actual totals of data reported, even when data were missing. Thus, caution should be exercised in comparing county totals of 1981 with subsequent years.

-- Both adult and juvenile 1981 arrest data for the City of Milwaukee published in the 1981 Wisconsin Crime and Arrests have been revised. Readers interested in comparing 1981 Milwaukee data with other years are urged to contact SAC.

## 1988 Crime and Arrest Facts At A Glance

- There were 193,987 serious crimes (Index Offenses) reported in 1988, a decrease of 3.5 percent from the 1987 total. (page 6)
- The thirteen percent decrease in reported Violent Offenses is the largest decline in the past decade. (page 19)

<sup>1</sup> The crime clock should be viewed with caution. Since it is the most aggregate representation of UCR data, it is designed to convey the annual reported crime experience by showing the relative frequency of Index Offense occurrence. This method of display does not imply a regularity in the commission of Index Offenses; rather it shows the ratios of crimes to fixed periods of time.

## An Overview of 1987 and 1988 Crime and Arrests in Wisconsin

The following tables and maps present an overview of 1987 and 1988 crime and arrests in Wisconsin. Table 1 shows that reported Index Offenses have decreased by 3.5 percent from 1987. While reported violent offenses have decreased by 13 percent from 1987, property offenses have decreased by 2.9 percent. The overall decrease in violent offenses is due to decreases in murder, forcible rape and, particularly, aggravated assault. Murder decreased by 14.7 percent, from 170 to 145. Forcible rape decreased by 3.6 percent, from 985 to 950. Aggravated assault decreased by 20.6 percent, from 7,659 to 6,078. However, robbery increased by 2.5 percent, from 3,175 to 3,254. It should be noted that violent offenses constituted only 5.4 percent of Index Offenses for Wisconsin in 1988.

Property crimes comprise the balance of the Crime Index. The overall decrease in reported property crimes from 1987 to 1988 is due to substantial decreases in reported burglary and theft. However, reported motor vehicle theft and arson increased during 1988. Burglary decreased by 12.3 percent, from 40,348 to 35,373. Theft decreased by 1.3 percent, from 135,654 to 133,838. Motor vehicle theft increased by 10.5 percent, from 11,803 to 13,043, and arson increased by 6.1 percent, from 1,231 to 1,306.

The next three tables present a comparison of statewide arrests in 1987 and 1988. Adult arrests for total Index Offenses decreased by 2.0 percent, while juvenile arrests for total Index Offenses decreased by 1.4 percent. Total arrests for Index Offenses, combining both adults and juveniles, decreased by 1.8 percent. Juvenile arrests constituted 43.4 percent of all arrests for Index Offenses in 1988, compared to 43.2 percent in 1987. Total adult arrests rose by 6.4 percent, from 221,788 to 235,970 while total juvenile arrests increased by 1.0 percent, from 88,103 to 88,959. Total arrests for adults and juveniles combined increased by 4.8 percent from 309,890 in 1987 to 324,929 in 1988.

Juvenile arrests comprised 27.4 percent of all arrests for 1988, but they comprised 43.4 percent of arrests for Index Offenses. Among the Index Offenses, juvenile arrests comprised 18.2 percent of all arrests for violent offenses and 46.5 percent of all arrests for property offenses.

Following the set of four tables are two maps showing rates of violent and property crime in each Wisconsin county for 1988. On each map, counties are ranked in four groups according to number of offenses per 100,000 population. The statewide rate, shown on each map, is based on the statewide number of offenses and population. This rate is within the fourth quartile because most of the highest crime rates are in those counties with largest populations.

An analysis of total Index Offenses, violent offenses, property offenses, and each separate offense appears in the following section of this report. Ten-year trends in offenses, offense rates, clearances, and arrest ratios are then presented, followed by data on law enforcement officers killed and assaulted.



# VIOLENT CRIME IN WISCONSIN - 1988


OFFENSES PER 100,000 RESIDENTS, BY COUNTY



# PROPERTY CRIME IN WISCONSIN - 1988


OFFENSES PER 100,000 RESIDENTS, BY COUNTY


QUARTILE 3

## **CRIME INDEX OFFENSES**

Definition:<sup>1</sup> Crime Index Offenses are murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Attempts are included (an attempted murder is classified as an aggravated assault).

### **1988 Summary Analysis**

- There were an estimated 193,987 Crime Index Offenses reported during 1988, a 3.5 percent decrease from 1987.
- One Index Offense was reported approximately every two minutes, 43 seconds during 1988.
- The most frequent month for Crime Index Offenses was August (19,419), the least frequent was February (12,368).
- The Crime Index Offense rate per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was 4,028.4 in 1988, a decrease of 3.9 percent from the 1987 rate of 4,192.9 per 100,000.
- The 1988 rate of 4,028.4 per 100,000 is approximately 30 percent less than the estimated 1988 rate of 5,716 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- In terms of the population groupings of Wisconsin jurisdictions, the larger the population category, the higher the rate of Index Offenses.
- Total Index Offenses have increased by 6.1 percent between 1978 and 1988.
- An estimated total of 57,720 persons were arrested for Index Offenses in 1988. Of these, 56.6 percent were adults.
- Overall, 23.8 percent of Index Offenses were cleared in 1988. This rate varied widely, however, from over 79 percent for murder to 14.7 percent for burglary. The 1988 clearance rate of 23.8 percent was somewhat less than the 1987 rate of 24.3 percent.





TOTAL INDEX OFFENSES - BY MONTH





## **VIOLENT OFFENSES**

**Definition:** Four Crime Index Offenses involve face-to-face confrontation between victim and perpetrator, and are referred to as violent offenses. These are murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault.


### **1988 Summary Analysis**

- There were an estimated 10,427 violent offenses reported during 1988, a 13.0 percent decrease from 1987. This was the largest decrease in violent crime during the past decade.
- Violent Index Offenses accounted for 5.4 percent of the total Crime Index in 1988.
- Approximately one violent offense was reported every 50 minutes during 1988.
- The most frequent month for violent crimes was September (947), the least frequent month was April (776).
- The rate of occurrence for violent offenses in 1987 was 216.5 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents. This figure represents a decrease of 13.5 percent from the 1987 rate of 250.4 per 100,000.
- The 1988 rate of 216.5 per 100,000 is approximately 65 percent less than the estimated 1988 rate of 637 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- In general, the 1988 violent offense rate was greater in jurisdictions with larger populations.
- Violent Index Offenses have increased 68.6 percent between 1978 and 1988.
- An estimated total of 6,314 persons were arrested for violent offenses in 1988. Nearly 82 percent of the 1988 arrests were adults.
- Overall, 54.3 percent of violent offenses were cleared in 1988, compared to a 55.0 percent clearance rate in 1987.



#### VIOLENT OFFENSES - BY YEAR




#### VIOLENT OFFENSES - BY MONTH

### VIOLENT OFFENSE RATE





## **PROPERTY OFFENSES**

Definition: Four Crime Index Offenses do not involve face-to-face confrontation between victim and perpetrator, and are referred to as property offenses. These offenses are burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson.


### **1988 Summary Analysis**

- There were an estimated 183,560 property offenses reported in 1988, a 2.9 percent decrease from 1987.
- Property Index Offenses accounted for 94.6 percent of the total Crime Index in 1988.
- Approximately one property offense was reported every two minutes, 52 seconds in Wisconsin during 1988.
- The most frequent month for property offenses was August (18,480) while the least frequent month was February (11,576).
- The rate of occurrence for property offenses in 1988 was 3,811.8 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents. This figure represents a decrease of 3.3 percent from the corresponding 1987 rate of 3,942.5 per 100,000.
- The 1988 rate of 3,811.8 per 100,000 is approximately 25 percent less than the estimated 1988 rate of 5,079 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- Property offense rates declined in all jurisdictions except police agencies serving communities with between 5,000 and 9,999 residents.
- Property Index Offenses have increased 3.9 percent between 1978 and 1988.
- An estimated total of 51,406 arrests were made for property offenses in 1988. Approximately 46.5 percent of those arrested were juveniles and 72.4 percent of those arrested were White.
- Overall, 22.1 percent of property offenses were cleared in 1988, compared to a 22.3 percent clearance rate in 1987.



PROPERTY OFFENSES - BY YEAR




PROPERTY OFFENSES - BY MONTH



## MURDER

Definition: Murder and nonnegligent manslaughter are the willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another. The classification of this offense, as for all other Crime Index Offenses, is based on police investigation as opposed to the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury, or other judicial body. Not included in the count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence, suicide, or accident; justifiable homicides, which are the killings of felons by law enforcement officers in the line of duty or by private citizens during commission of the felony; and attempts to murder or assaults to murder, which are classified as aggravated assaults.


### 1988 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 145 murders reported in 1988, a 14.7 percent decrease from 1987.
- Murder accounted for 0.1 percent of the total Crime Index and 1.4 percent of all violent Index Offenses.
- Approximately one murder was reported every 2 days and 12 hours during 1988.
- The most frequent month for murder was July (18), the least frequent month was February (7).
- The 1988 murder rate was 3.0 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents compared to 3.5 per 100,000 in 1987.
- The 1988 rate of 3.0 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 65 percent less than the estimated 1988 rate of 8.5 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The murder rate decreased or remained the same for all categories of law enforcement agencies except those in cities between 5,000 and 9,999 residents and rural Sheriff's Offices.
- The volume of Wisconsin murders has increased 22.9 percent from 1978 to 1988.
- Firearms were involved in nearly 52 percent of 1988 murders, while knives were used in approximately 24 percent of all 1988 murders.
- In those cases where the relationship of victim and offender was determined, the parties were known to each other in approximately 82 percent of 1988 murders.
- The average age of murder victims was 33.3 years while the average age of known offenders was 29.5 years.
- An estimated 175 persons were arrested for murder in 1988 compared to 271 persons in 1987. Ninety-two percent of those arrested in 1988 were adults and 54 percent were Black.
- The murder clearance rate was 79.5 percent in 1988. This figure is somewhat smaller than the 90.6 percent clearance rate in 1987.



**MURDER - BY YEAR**




**MURDER - BY MONTH**



### MURDER RATE







### MURDER - TYPE OF WEAPON




## SEXUAL ASSAULT AND FORCIBLE RAPE

Definition: Sexual assault is sexual contact or sexual intercourse with another person without consent of that person. Sexual assault is proscribed under Wisconsin statutes, but is not part of the Federal Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program. Forcible rape is part of the Crime Index and as such is reported as part of the Federal UCR Program. It is the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included; however, statutory rape (without force) is not included.



#### Sexual Assault - 1988 Summary Analysis

Information on sexual assault is vital to an understanding of crime trends in Wisconsin. Rape is not a legally meaningful category in this state. However, rape is part of the Crime Index and information on rape is vital to the national UCR program. Furthermore, many years of information on rape are available for Wisconsin, and current information on rape is valuable for purposes of comparison. Jurisdiction-by-jurisdiction listings for rape appear in many of the tables at the end of this publication. This listing of rapes will continue in future years as long as rape continues to be part of the Crime Index.

Following are some highlights of the sexual assault figures presented on the following four pages.

- There were an estimated 5,169 sexual assaults reported during 1988, a 3.3 percent decrease from the estimated 1987 total of 5,345. (Note: these figures are estimated totals, all other figures used in this section are reported data.)
- Approximately 19 percent of all sexual assaults were rapes. For victims over 16, the proportion of rapes was more than twice as high, 37.5 percent.
- Approximately 74 percent of all sexual assault victims were juveniles. Nearly 65 percent of all victims were 15 years old or less.
- Victim sex was 86 percent female, while offender sex was 96 percent male.
- Nearly 73 percent of all sexual assaults were committed by family members or friends and acquaintances, while 15 percent were committed by strangers. For those sexual assaults that are rapes, nearly 59 percent were committed by family members or friends and acquaintances, and 33 percent by strangers.

## SEXUAL ASSAULT

Summary data on sexual assaults are presented in the following tables and graphs. In the tables below, sexual assaults are shown by degree for all victims, victims 15 and under, and for victims 16 and over. This is because the two most severe degrees of assault, first and second, may be so classified either by the nature of the assault or the age of the victim. Looking only at assaults of victims age 16 and over shows the distribution of assaults by degree based solely on the nature of the assault, not victim age. Most sexual assaults, even first and second degree assaults, are not rapes according to the Uniform Crime Reporting definition, and this also is shown in the table below.

Graphs showing the age and sex of victims and offenders, and relationship between victim and offender, are presented on subsequent pages. Data are also presented on arrests, victim injury, and weapons used in the commission of sexual assaults.



### AGE OF SEXUAL ASSAULT VICTIMS AND OFFENDERS








## **ROBBERY**

Definition: Robbery is the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or putting the victim in fear.


### **1988 Summary Analysis**

- There were an estimated 3,254 robberies reported in 1988, a 2.5 percent increase since 1987.
- Robbery accounted for 1.7 percent of the total Crime Index and 31.2 percent of all violent Index Offenses.
- Approximately one robbery was reported every two hours, 42 minutes in 1988.
- The most frequent month for robbery was November (354), the least frequent was August (214).
- The 1988 robbery rate was 67.6 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, an increase of 2.1 percent from the 1987 rate of 66.2 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1988 robbery rate of 67.6 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was less than a third of the estimated 1988 rate of 219 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The 1988 robbery rates were much greater for those agencies serving greater populations.
- The number of estimated robberies has increased 39.3 percent from 1978 to 1988.
- "Strong-arm" robberies made up 45.1 percent of all robberies during 1988.
- While highway robberies accounted for 54 percent of all 1988 Wisconsin robberies, they made up only 31 percent of the total value stolen in all robberies.
- An estimated total of 1,336 persons were arrested for robbery in 1988. Over 68 percent of those arrested were Black. In addition, nearly 70 percent were adults.
- The robbery clearance rate was 30.5 percent in 1988, a slight decrease from the 1987 clearance rate of 31.4 percent.



ROBBERY - BY YEAR




ROBBERY - BY MONTH



ROBBERY - TYPE OF WEAPON 1988




Value of Property Stolen - 1988

## AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Definition: Aggravated assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. Attempts are included, since it is not necessary that an injury results when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime were successfully completed.


### 1988 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 6,078 aggravated assaults reported in 1988, a 20.6 percent decrease from 1987. (Note: The volume of reported aggravated assault has changed dramatically since 1984, as shown in the graph on the following page. Many law enforcement agencies in Wisconsin have changed their policies regarding domestic violence in recent years; these changes have affected the level of reported aggravated assault. Also, changes in Wisconsin statutes governing domestic violence likely will affect aggravated assault figures in future years.)
- Aggravated assault accounted for 3.9 percent of the total Crime Index and 58.4 percent of all violent Index Offenses.
- Approximately one aggravated assault was reported every hour and 27 minutes during 1988.
- The most frequent month for aggravated assault was August (601), the least frequent was November (435).
- The 1988 aggravated assault rate was 126.2 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents. This figure represents a decrease of 21.2 percent from the 1987 rate of 160.1 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1988 aggravated assault rate of 126.2 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately one-third of the estimated 1988 rate of 372 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The 1988 aggravated assault rate decreased in all categories of jurisdictions except cities of between 5,000 and 9,999 residents.
- The number of estimated aggravated assaults has increased 99.1 percent from 1978 to 1988.
- The proportion of aggravated assaults involving the use of a personal weapon (hands, fists, or feet) declined from 48 percent in 1984 to 38 percent in 1988.
- An estimated total of 4,210 persons were arrested for aggravated assaults in 1988; approximately 86 percent of those arrested were adults.
- The 1988 total clearance rate for aggravated assault was 65.1 percent, a slight increase from the 1987 clearance rate of 64 percent.
- There were 24,197 "Other Assists, - Simple, Not Aggravated" reported in 1988; the clearance rate for simple assault was 64.5 percent.



AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - BY YEAR




AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - BY MONTH

**AGGRAVATED ASSAULT RATES**





## BURGLARY

Definition: Burglary is defined as the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. The use of force to gain entry is not required to classify an offense as burglary. Burglary in this program is categorized into three subclassifications: forcible entry, unlawful entry where no force is used, and attempted forcible entry.


### 1988 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 35,373 burglaries reported in 1988, a 12.3 percent decrease from 1987.
- Burglary accounted for 18.2 percent of the total Crime Index and 19.3 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- Approximately one burglary was reported every 14 minutes, 54 seconds during 1988.
- The most frequent month for burglary was September (3,459) while the least frequent month was February (2,271).
- The 1988 burglary rate was 734.6 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents. This figure represents a decrease of 12.7 percent from the 1987 rate of 841.5 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1988 burglary rate of 734.6 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 44 percent less than the estimated 1988 rate of 1,313 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The 1988 burglary rate decreased in all population categories.
- The number of estimated burglaries has decreased 10.6 percent from 1978 to 1988.
- The proportion of burglaries in which no forcible entry was needed increased from 21 percent in 1987 to over 23 percent during 1988.
- Residential burglaries made up approximately two-thirds of all burglaries, both in terms of volume and value of property stolen.
- The average value of property stolen in a burglary was \$676. This figure is somewhat less than the 1987 average figure of \$691.
- An estimated total of 6,472 persons were arrested for burglary in 1988. Nearly 77 percent of those arrested were White and over 53 percent were juveniles.
- The burglary clearance rate was 14.7 percent in 1988, a figure somewhat less than the 1987 clearance rate of 16.8 percent.



### BURGLARY - BY YEAR







## THEFT

Definition: Theft is the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. It includes crimes such as shoplifting, pocket-picking, purse-snatching, thefts from motor vehicles, thefts of motor vehicle parts and accessories, bicycle thefts, etc., in which no use of force, violence, or fraud occurs. In the Uniform Crime Reporting program, this crime category does not include embezzlement, "con" games, forgery, and worthless checks. Motor vehicle theft is also excluded from this category for crime reporting purposes inasmuch as it is a separate Crime Index Offense.


### 1988 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 133,833 thefts reported in 1988, a 1.3 percent decrease from 1987.
- Theft accounted for 69.0 percent of the total Crime Index and 72.9 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- One theft was reported approximately every three minutes, 56 seconds during 1988.
- The most frequent month for theft was August (13,828), while the least frequent month was February (8,482).
- The 1988 theft rate was 2,779.3 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, an decrease of 1.8 percent from the 1987 rate of 2,829.2 per 100,000.
- The 1988 theft rate of 2,779.3 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately eleven percent less than the estimated 1988 rate of 3,135 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- Theft rates declined in all jurisdictions except those cities with over 250,000 residents and those with less than 5,000 residents.
- The number of estimated thefts has increased 7 percent from 1978 to 1988.
- The average value stolen per theft during 1988 was \$269, a figure somewhat higher than the \$253 average in 1987.

- The theft clearance rate was 23.6 percent in 1988, a bit lower than the 1987 figure of 23.9.



THEFT - BY YEAR




THEFT - BY MONTH



## MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Definition: Motor vehicle theft is defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. This definition excludes the taking of a motor vehicle for temporary use by those persons having lawful access.


### 1988 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 13,043 motor vehicle thefts reported in 1988, a 10.5 percent increase from 1987.
- Motor vehicle thefts accounted for 6.7 percent of the total Crime Index and 7.1 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- One motor vehicle theft was reported approximately every 40 minutes, 24 seconds in 1988.
- The most frequent month for motor vehicle theft was October (1,406), the least frequent month was February (748).
- The 1988 motor vehicle theft rate was 270.8 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, a 10 percent increase from the 1987 rate of 246.2 per 100,000.
- The 1988 motor vehicle theft rate of 270.8 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 53 percent less than the estimated 1988 rate of 581 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The motor vehicle theft rate in 1988 increased in all population categories except those police agencies in cities between 25,000 and 49,999 residents.
- The number of estimated motor vehicle thefts has increased 21.5 percent from 1978 to 1988.
- The proportion of motor vehicle thefts involving an auto has remained fairly stable since 1984.
- Approximately 70 percent of the value of stolen motor vehicles was recovered during 1988, a decline from the 1987 recovery rate of 77 percent.
- An estimated total of 3,580 persons were arrested for motor vehicle theft during 1988; 61 percent of those arrested were juveniles.
- The motor vehicle theft clearance rate was 25.2 percent in 1988, somewhat higher than the 23.1 percent clearance rate in 1987.



#### MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT - BY YEAR




#### MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT - BY MONTH



## ARSON

Definition: Arson is defined as any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc. Only fires determined through investigation to have been willfully or maliciously set are classified as arsons. Fires of suspicious or unknown origins are excluded.


### 1988 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 1,306 arsons reported in 1988, a 6.1 percent increase from 1987.
- Arson accounted for 0.7 percent of the total Crime Index and 0.7 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- One arson was reported approximately every 6 hours and 44 minutes during 1988.
- The 1988 arson rate was 27.1 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, a 5.4 percent increase from the 1987 rate of 25.7 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1988 arson rate of 27.1 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 46 percent less than the estimated 1988 rate of 50 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The arson rate increased most dramatically in police agencies serving cities over 250,000 residents, those between 5,000 and 9,999 residents, and in suburban sheriffs offices.
- The total estimated loss from arson was \$11,038,673 in 1988. This represents an average loss figure of \$8,504.
- The number of estimated arsons has declined 11.2 percent from 1979 to 1988.
- An estimated total of 487 persons were arrested for arson in 1988. Nearly 62 percent of those arrested were juveniles and over 79 percent were White.
- The arson clearance rate was 30.5 percent in 1988, an increase from the 28.8 percent cleared in 1987.



ARSON - BY YEAR




ARSON - BY MONTH

## Arrest Summary for Selected Non-Index Offenses

### Simple Assault

Definition: Simple assault is an assault or an attempted assault where no weapon is used and which does not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

- There were an estimated 16,133 simple assault arrests in 1988, representing a 9 percent increase when compared to 1987.
- Of the total, 82 percent were adults and 18 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 85 percent and females 15 percent of the persons arrested for simple assault.

### Vandalism

Definition: Vandalism is defined as the willful destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or persons having custody or control.

- There were an estimated 10,950 vandalism arrests in 1988, a increase of 2 percent compared to 1987.
- Adults accounted for 54 percent and juveniles 46 percent of persons arrested for vandalism in 1988.
- Males accounted for 88 percent and females 12 percent of the arrests.

### Weapons Violations

Definition: These offenses include all the violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing, and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, and attempts.

- There were an estimated 5,925 arrests reported for weapons violations, a 6 percent increase compared to 1987.
- Of the total, 78 percent were adults and 22 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 90 percent and females 10 percent of those arrested.

## Drug Abuse Violations

Definition: Drug abuse violations are defined as the unlawful sale/manufacture, possession/use of the narcotics and drugs listed below:

- a. Opium or Cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine).
  - b. Marijuana, hashish, etc.
  - c. Synthetic narcotics — manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction (demerol, methadones).
  - d. Other — dangerous non-narcotic drugs (amphetamines, barbituates, hallucinogens).
- 
- There were an estimated 8,850 arrests reported for drug abuse violations, a 10 percent increase compared to 1987.
  - Adults accounted for 86 percent and juveniles 14 percent of the arrests.
  - Males accounted for 87 percent of the arrests, while females accounted for the remaining 13 percent.
  - Arrests for possession/use of drugs accounted for 68 percent of the arrests; the remaining 32 percent were for the sale/manufacture of drugs. During 1987, 26 percent of total drug arrests were for sale/manufacture.
  - Arrests for opium/cocaine accounted for 28 percent of all drug arrests, marijuana arrests accounted for 63 percent of all drug arrests, arrests for synthetic narcotics accounted for 2 percent of all drug arrests, and other drug arrests accounted for 7 percent of all drug arrests.

## Fraud

Definition: Included in this category are fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. It includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

- There were an estimated 7,103 arrests for fraud in 1988, an increase of 32 percent compared to 1987.
- Adults accounted for 96 percent of the arrests, while juveniles accounted for the remaining 4 percent.
- Males accounted for 53 percent of the arrests and females accounted for 47 percent.

### Driving Under the Influence

Definition: The offense of driving under the influence is defined as the driving or operating of any motor vehicle while drunk or under the influence of alcohol or narcotics.

- There were an estimated 34,363 arrests reported for driving under the influence in 1988, a decrease of 7 percent compared to 1987.
- Ninety-eight percent of the arrests were adults and only two percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 86 percent of the arrests, while females accounted for the remaining 14 percent.

### Disorderly Conduct

Definition: In this category are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace (disorderly person).

- There were an estimated 40,825 arrests for disorderly conduct in 1988, an increase of 2.6 percent compared to 1987.
- Adults accounted for 75 percent of the arrests, while juveniles accounted for the remaining 25 percent.
- Males accounted for 83 percent of the arrests, while females accounted for the remaining 17 percent.

### Liquor Laws

Definition: Included in this category are state or local liquor law violations, with the exception of "driving while under the influence."

- There were an estimated 38,987 arrests reported for liquor law violations in 1988, an increase of nearly 20 percent compared to 1987.
- Adults were responsible for 67 percent of the arrests, while the remaining 33 percent were juveniles. Juveniles accounted for 42 percent of the arrests in 1987 and 51 percent in 1988. The dramatic change in proportions largely was due to the change in the legal drinking age.
- Males accounted for 71 percent of the liquor law arrests, while females accounted for the remaining 29 percent.

### **Curfew Violations**

**Definition:** In this category are juvenile arrests made for violations of local curfew ordinances.

- There were an estimated 5,688 arrests reported for curfew violations in 1988. This represents a 10 percent increase compared to 1987.
- Males represented 74 percent and females 26 percent of those arrested.

### **Runaways**

**Definition:** This category is limited to juveniles taken into protective custody, under provisions of local statutes, as runaways.

- There were an estimated 9,028 runaway arrests reported in 1988, a decrease of 2.4 percent compared to 1987.
- Females accounted for 54 percent and males accounted for 46 percent of those arrested.

### Summary of Offense and Arrest Trends: 1978 - 1988

The following four tables present statewide data on: (1) the number of Index Offenses, (2) offense rates for Index Offenses, (3) clearance rates for Index Offenses, and (4) the ratio of arrests to offenses for Index Offenses for each year from 1978 through 1988. Each table shows the percent change from 1978 to 1988. Certain adjustments, noted in footnotes to each table, were made in the total Crime Index and property offense categories to make the data comparable from year to year.

The total number of known Index Offenses in Wisconsin increased from 1978 through 1981, declined through 1985, rose in 1986 and 1987, but decreased in 1988 (see graph, page 14). The number of Index Offenses increased by 6.1 percent for the decade, from 181,541 in 1978 to 193,987 in 1988<sup>1</sup>. The 3.2 percent increase in offense rates for the decade is less than the increase in number of offenses, because the population of the state increased during this period.

The number of violent offenses increased by 68.6 percent for the decade, from 6,184 in 1978 to 10,427 in 1988. The number of property offenses increased by 3.9 percent for the decade, from 175,357 to 183,560. Thus, while both violent and property offenses have increased during the past decade, the rate of increase has been much greater for violent crimes, especially since 1981. This is made clear in the graphs on pages 20 and 26.

While the clearance rates for all Index Offenses has increased since 1978, overall Violent Offense clearance rates have declined while Property Offense clearance rates have increased. Clearance rates increased during the decade for forcible rape. However, clearance rates for murder, robbery and aggravated assault have decreased. Among the property offenses, clearance rates have increased for theft while they have decreased for burglary and motor vehicle theft.

Overall, arrest ratios have increased over the past decade, indicating that during this time arrests have increased more rapidly than offenses. However, in terms of specific offenses, this is true only of murder, aggravated assault and theft. For these three offenses, arrests have increased more rapidly than offenses during the decade.

### Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted


The following tables present statewide information on law enforcement officers killed or assaulted during 1988. During 1988, one Wisconsin police officer was killed due to an accident while in the performance of duty.

There were 929 reported assaults on police officers in 1988, a 4.5 percent increase compared to the 889 reported assaults in 1987. Of the 929 reported assaults, 895 or 96 percent were cleared. Over 60 percent of assaults occurred during the nighttime hours from 8 p.m. through 4 a.m. Injuries resulted from 50 percent of reported assaults, while 94 percent of assaults involved personal weapons (hands, feet or fists) rather than firearms, knives or other dangerous weapons. In addition, this section shows both the type of assignment and type of activity at the time the assault occurred and the number of assaults on law enforcement officers since 1984.



ASSAULTS BY TYPE OF ASSIGNMENT



### Arrests by County and Law Enforcement Agency - 1988

Tables 5 through 8 present data on adults and juveniles arrested by Wisconsin law enforcement agencies during 1988. The tables present the total number of arrests, the total numbers of Part I and Part II arrests, and the number of arrests for each Part I and Part II offense separately, for each reporting agency. Information on adults is presented in Tables 5 and 7, information on juveniles in Tables 6 and 8.

As indicated in the introduction to this report, data are not available for all 12 months of 1988 for every reporting agency. In the following tables, as in Tables 1 through 4, the number of months of data available for each reporting agency is listed. Although only the known data are presented for each jurisdiction, an estimated yearly total can be calculated for any jurisdiction with less than 12 months of data reported. The estimated totals can be calculated by multiplying the number in the table by a correction factor which can be obtained by dividing 12 by the number of months of data reported. (Thus, if 11 months of data are presented for an agency, for example, the agency's figures should be multiplied by 12/11, or 1.09). As is the case in other tables, the more months of data reported, the more accurate will be the yearly estimates. Estimates based on a small number of months of reported data should be interpreted cautiously. This estimation procedure should also be applied with caution when the number of arrests is small.

The following tables show, for each county, county total arrests for each offense. For those counties in which not every jurisdiction reported 12 months of data for 1988, the county totals shown are estimates. These estimates were obtained as in Table 1, by calculating and summing the estimated annual total for each jurisdiction within the county. As in the previous table, when estimates are used for county totals, the notation "(EST)" follows the "County Total" label.

At the end of each table there are statewide totals of the reported arrests in each category and estimates of the actual statewide totals. The estimated totals were obtained by calculating the estimated yearly totals, as described above, for each reporting agency with less than 12 months of data and summing the estimates for these agencies and the reported figures for the other agencies.

These tables also contain population figures for each jurisdiction. Tables 5 and 7 contain adult population figures. Tables 6 and 8 contain juvenile population figures. These adult and juvenile figures were derived from the 1988 Department of Administration (DOA) population estimates, Official Population Estimates for 1988, using adult and juvenile population proportions provided in the 1980 census and updated with 1983 DOA estimates. The population figures presented for county sheriffs' offices are the county populations minus the populations of any municipalities in the county for which UCR data are reported separately. These figures can be used to calculate arrest rates for any of the jurisdictions in the State. Arrest rates are calculated by dividing the number of arrests by the relevant population and multiplying the result by 100,000. This rate per 100,000 is comparable across jurisdictions of varying sizes.

### Statewide Arrests, by Gender and Offense

The first and second of the following tables present statewide data on adult and juvenile arrests by gender during 1988. Like other state and county level data presented in this report, these tables present estimated totals. Note that the state total in these listings may differ slightly from the corresponding totals shown in Tables 5 through 8. This is because of small differences in the procedure used to make estimates of missing data in the two types of tables.

### Statewide Property Information

The third table, Property Stolen and Recovered by Type of Property, shows the monetary value of property both stolen and recovered by category of property for the entire State in 1988. The table also shows the percent of value recovered for each type of property.

### Number of Full Time Law Enforcement Employees in Wisconsin as of 31 October, 1988

The data in this table come from a yearly survey conducted each fall by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. For every jurisdiction, it shows the number of sworn law enforcement employees (male and female), the number of civilian employees (male and female), and the total number of employees for every UCR jurisdiction. In addition, the table lists the total population for each jurisdiction, and both the number of law enforcement employees and the total number of employees per 1,000 population. It should be noted that figures for the number of officers per 1,000 population for some agencies are absent since no permanent resident population is assigned (e.g., UW Campus Security Agencies, DNR, State Patrol).

## GLOSSARY

ADULT: A person 18 years of age or older.

ARREST: Taking into physical or other legal custody for commission of an offense in the local reporting jurisdiction. An arrest has occurred when a law enforcement officer detains a person with the intention of seeking charges against them for a specific offense and a record is made of the detention (see p. 60, Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook). Arrests for all criminal offenses are scored. Arrests for ordinance violations are included. Arrests for traffic offenses, with the exception of driving under the influence of intoxicants, are not scored. Included are those persons released without having been formally charged. (See Juvenile Arrest.)

ARREST RATE: The number of arrests for a particular offense, or group of offenses, per 100,000 population. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Arrests} \times 100,000}{\text{Population}}$$

Arrest rates per population unit are employed to remove the effects of differing sizes of law enforcement service areas, permitting the examination of arrest on an equalized population basis. "Per 100,000 population" is generally utilized to preclude rates for infrequently occurring arrests from being expressed as unmeaningfully small numbers.

CLEARANCE: An offense is cleared, or solved for crime reporting purposes, when at least one person is arrested, charged with commission of the offense and turned over to the court for prosecution. Provision is also made for clearance in certain "exceptional" situations (see p. 42, Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook).

CLEARANCE RATE (TOTAL): The number of clearances divided by the total number of offenses, expressed as a percent. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Clearances} \times 100\%}{\text{Number of Offenses}}$$

Offenses are reported as they become known to law enforcement agencies. Clearances are scored as they are made. Therefore, it is possible for the clearance rate to exceed 100 percent for a time period. Both clearances by arrest and exceptional clearances are included.

CRIME FACTORS: Historically, the causes and origins of crime have been the subjects of investigation by many disciplines. No definitive conclusions have yet been reached; many factors affect the volume and type of crime that occurs from place to place. Caution should, therefore, be exercised in comparing statistical data of individual communities or counties solely on the basis of their populations.

More appropriate use can be made of the statistics by relating the experience of a particular area to group averages, or by employing a ranking procedure, and encompassing both crime and other socio-economic information.

CRIME INDEX: The total of eight serious offenses used as an indicator of crime. Crime Index offenses are murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft and arson. The first four of these are referred to as violent crimes, and the latter four as property crimes. Definitions of each of these offenses are given in the section "Statewide Index Offenses and Arrests."

JUVENILE: A person 17 years of age or younger.

JUVENILE ARREST: For purposes of Uniform Crime Reporting, a juvenile should be counted as "arrested" when the circumstances are such that if he or she were an adult, an arrest would be tallied (see Uniform Crime Reporting Manual, p. 60). All violations by juveniles where some police or other official action is taken beyond a mere admonishment, including status offenses, are included. Law enforcement contacts with juveniles where no offense has been committed are not scored as arrests. Juveniles taken into custody for their own protection, such as in neglect cases, are not scored as being arrested if they have not committed an offense. (See Arrest)

JUVENILE CRIME: The only measure of juvenile crime available through Uniform Crime Reporting is the number of juvenile arrests (number, rate, and percentage of total arrests).

OFFENSE RATE: The number of known offenses per 100,000 population. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Offenses}}{\text{Population}} \times 100,000$$

Offense rates per population unit are employed to remove the effect of differing sizes of law enforcement service areas, permitting the examination of reported crime on an equalized population basis. "Per 100,000 population" is generally utilized to preclude the rates for infrequently occurring offenses from being expressed as unmeaningfully small numbers.

More specific crime or victimization rate measures may also be utilized, such as residential burglaries per 100,000 residences, motor vehicle thefts per 100,000 registered vehicles, or forcible rapes per 100,000 females in typically victimized age groups.

PART I OFFENSES: The eight index crimes in addition to manslaughter by negligence.

PART II OFFENSES: All crime categories not already designated as Part I, excluding all traffic violations except Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated.

PERCENT CHANGE: The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Value in Current Period} - \text{Value in Base Period}}{\text{Value in Base Period}} \times 100\%$$

POPULATION: Totals as well as juvenile and adult sub-totals are based on Official Population Estimates for 1988, Wisconsin Department of Administration, Demographic Services Center.

STATUS OFFENSES: Offenses which are only offenses when they are committed by a juvenile. For purposes of the Wisconsin UCR Program, status offenses consist of curfew violations, runaways, and liquor law violations.

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
