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Crime in Arkansas, 1993, is a report on crime, based on summary information submitted by law enforcement agencies as a part of the Arkansas Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program.

While this document is a comprehensive report on crime, it must be understood that it includes only the number of arrests and incidents known and reported by law enforcement agencies. It does not include any data relating to prosecution, adjudication or correction. Likewise, it does not attempt to draw any conclusions about the cause of crime.

UCR data pertains to the number of criminal events in specific geographic areas, rather than the effectiveness or activities of agencies. It should not be used to evaluate or directly compare one agency to another.

In 1993, index crime in Arkansas increased 1.9% compared to 1992. With the exception of a decrease in 1992, index crime in Arkansas has increased each year since 1984. Also in 1993, the number of arrests went up 2.3% from 1992.

If the statistics in this report tell us anything, it is that we must continue to enhance our efforts. To effectively fight crime, the entire criminal justice community needs more funding and assistance. A high priority must be placed on dealing with crime, beginning with an overall awareness of the problem. This report is presented as an aid in the process.

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Section 1

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program In Arkansas

Background

The development of a nationwide Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program began more than 50 years ago. In 1930, Congress authorized the FBI to collect crime statistics from local police departments. All information came from reports that law enforcement agencies routinely compile for their own efficient administration. The underlying philosophy was and is oriented toward law enforcement statistics for use by law enforcement agencies.

In an effort to obtain a complete picture of crime on a national level, the data is collected on certain offenses that become known to police. An overview can then be obtained through examination of seven offenses which were selected because of their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, and likelihood of being reported to police. These offenses, which now comprise the Crime Index, are murder and non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft, and motor vehicle theft. By congressional mandate, arson was added as the eighth index offense in late 1978.

To provide nationwide uniformity in the reporting of data, a set of standard definitions for specific criminal acts was devised. This standardization was necessary to overcome the variation in definitions from state to state. Reporting agencies are required to submit their data in accordance with the UCR definition of offenses. Because of the variance in punishment for the same offenses in different states, there is no possibility to distinguish between felony or misdemeanor crimes in a program such as this.

In recent years, the FBI has actively assisted individual states in the development of state-operated UCR programs compatible with the national system. These state programs have increased the participation of law enforcement agencies due to mandatory reporting requirements. State programs also provide direct and frequent contact with local agencies, assuring more completeness and quality of information provided by them. With the development of a state UCR program, data is more readily available for use by the state, and the FBI ceases collection of data directly from individual law enforcement agencies within the state. Instead, compiled information from all reporting agencies is forwarded to the national program by the state program.

On January 1, 1974 the Arkansas Crime Information Center initially began the collection of monthly UCR data in our state. The following year, Act 742 of 1975 was approved, which included a section making the reporting of UCR data to ACIC mandatory for law enforcement agencies.

Purposes of the Arkansas UCR Program

Information from the UCR Program will assist in determining the overall scope of reported crime in Arkansas. It should be an important aid in making effective management studies and decisions.

While many purposes and objectives can be stated, the primary goals are:

1. To collect, verify, and analyze summary information on crime reported by law enforcement agencies in Arkansas.
2. To provide data back to law enforcement administrators for use in operational planning and assessments.
3. To give an overview of crime, its magnitude and trends, and to provide this information to the Governor, the Legislature, and to the general public.
4. To develop base data and statistics for use in improving the efficiency, effectiveness, and performance of the Arkansas criminal justice system.
5. To provide the FBI with complete UCR data to be included in the national crime reports.

Reporting Procedures

The Arkansas UCR program uses a summary reporting procedure. Contributing law enforcement agencies are responsible for compiling their own crime figures and submitting them once a month to ACIC. Agencies are furnished training in scoring and classifying offenses, in use of tally books, and in procedures for completing the reporting forms.

A sound record-keeping system is necessary for the effective operation of any law enforcement agency. This record system is a basis for crime reporting by an agency. Upon request, ACIC will make internal records, forms and technical assistance available to any agency.

On a monthly basis, law enforcement agencies report the number of offenses that become known to them during the month. This count is taken from the complaints received by the agency from victims, other sources or as discovered by officers. Whenever complaints of a crime are determined through investigation to be unfounded or false, they are eliminated from the count. The number of "actual offenses known" are reported to ACIC without regard to whether anyone is arrested for the crime, stolen property recovered, or any other restrictive consideration. Law enforcement agencies report monthly the total number of these crimes which they clear by either arrest or exceptional means. To supplement the offense information, data such as the value of property stolen and recovered, circumstances surrounding homicides, additional information concerning assaults on police officers and other pertinent information is collected.

In addition, monthly reports on the number of persons arrested on all criminal offenses are collected. These reports provide age, sex and race information, with the adult and juvenile arrests separate.

Arkansas Crime Index

The Crime Index is used as a basic measurement of crime. It is the figure which is often publicized by the news media and which is widely used to assess the criminality of a given location. Many of the figures presented in this report indicate the volume, fluctuations and distribution of crime in Arkansas on the basis of this Crime Index. The eight offenses making up the Crime Index are:

1. Murder
2. Forcible Rape
3. Robbery
4. Aggravated Assault
5. Burglary
6. Theft
7. Motor Vehicle Theft
8. Arson

These crimes were selected for use as an index due to their serious nature, their frequency of occurrence and the reliability of reporting from citizens to law enforcement agencies. The Crime Index is the total number of index crimes that come to the attention of law enforcement.

In reviewing crime index figures, the reader should keep in mind that there is currently no way of determining the total number of actual crimes committed. The Crime Index has been established to measure only the instances of crime which come to the attention of law enforcement agencies.

Violent crime refers to events such as murder, rape, and assault that may result in injury to a person. Robbery is also considered a violent crime because it involves the use or threat of force against a person.

Property crimes are unlawful acts with the intent of gaining property, but do not involve the use of threat of force against an individual. Theft, burglary, motor vehicle theft, and arson are examples of property crimes.

The *Crime Rate* is one of the most quoted crime statistics and is based on the number of Index Crime per 100,000 population.

In UCR, an offense is considered to be *cleared* (solved) when at least one offender is arrested. The arrest of one person can clear several crimes, or several persons may be arrested in the process of clearing one crime. Offenses may also be cleared by exceptional means when the offender commits suicide; makes a dying declaration; confesses while in custody or serving time for another crime; is prosecuted in another jurisdiction for the same offense; when the victim refuses to prosecute or another jurisdiction refuses to extradite. When examining clearance data, keep in mind that not all crimes are cleared within the calendar year in which the offense occurs. Also note that the recovery of property stolen with regard to a specific offense does not, by itself, constitute a clearance for UCR purposes.

Data Comparisons and Limitations of UCR

While UCR is the best source of crime statistics available at the present time, it has been subject to much criticism during its history. Some of these criticisms may be valid. However, the criticism is softened when it is remembered that the program was developed to furnish information for use primarily by law enforcement agencies.

The obvious tendency with a publication of this kind is to make comparisons of data between jurisdictions, whether they be between agencies, or counties, or regions. Caution should be exercised for the many reasons which will become apparent as the reader continues through this publication. Comparisons may not be appropriate because of the great variety of factors which affect the extent and fluctuation of crime and which are not taken into consideration in either raw data or crime rates. All crimes are considered "equal" in computing crime rates. One theft affects a crime rate the same as one murder.

The Uniform Crime Reporting program is designated to measure offenses reported and persons arrested. Difficulty will arise if this distinction is not kept uppermost in mind. Crime relates to events, but arrest relates to persons, and this is not a one-to-one correspondence. While UCR is the best information available, no claim is made that they represent "all crime".

Summary

The information collected for this report portrays the most accurate and realistic assessment available on the crime situation in Arkansas. However, individuals using these tabulations are again cautioned against drawing conclusions by making direct comparisons between agencies. Numerous factors affect the amount and type of crime from place to place. More valid use can be made of these figures by determining deviations from state averages or through comparisons with averages for similar population groups.

It is important to remember that crime is a social problem, and therefore, a concern of the entire community. The efforts of law enforcement are limited to factors within its control.

Crime Summary

Facts At A Glance

- There were 116,689 serious crimes reported, with a 29% clearance rate (page 75).
- The crime rate for the State of Arkansas was established at 4,870 serious crimes for every 100,000 inhabitants (pages 10 and 75).
- 177,513 arrests were made in the state. Ten percent of these involved persons under 18 (pages 88 and 89).
- The value of property stolen amounted to \$93,982,942. Recovered property was estimated to be \$39,718,780 with a recovery rate of 42% (page 78). This and the 1992 value are the only annual decreases in value of stolen property since 1978. The value that year was an estimated \$29 million.
- The theft of jewelry and precious metals account for a property loss amounting to over \$8 million, a slight increase over 1992 and 26% higher than in 1988. Theft of TVs/radios and cameras amounted to \$8.4 million, slightly less than in 1992 and the lowest figure since 1988 (page 78).
- Firearms were used in 72% of all murder/non-negligent manslaughter reported (page 24), and 48% of all robberies (page 34).
- 1,026 reported rapes occurred during 1993, an increase of 4% compared to 1992 (page 28).
- 10,008 aggravated assaults were reported. Of these 3,174 (32%) were committed by the use of hands, fists, or feet and 3,145 (31%) using firearms (pages 38 and 40).
- Residential burglaries accounted for 71% of all burglaries reported. The estimated value of property stolen in all burglaries is almost \$22 million, with almost one-third of this taken in daytime residential burglaries (page 45).
- 7,784 motor vehicle thefts were reported, amounting to an approximate value loss of over \$43 million. Compared to 1992, the number of these thefts increased slightly (1%) and the value loss of the vehicles remained approximately the same also (pages 52 and 78).
- For the year of 1993, there were three Arkansas law enforcement officers killed by felonious means while on duty (page 62).
- There were 399 assaults on officers reported, and 38% of these resulted in personal injury to the officer (page 65). These numbers have remained constant for three years, 1991 through 1993.

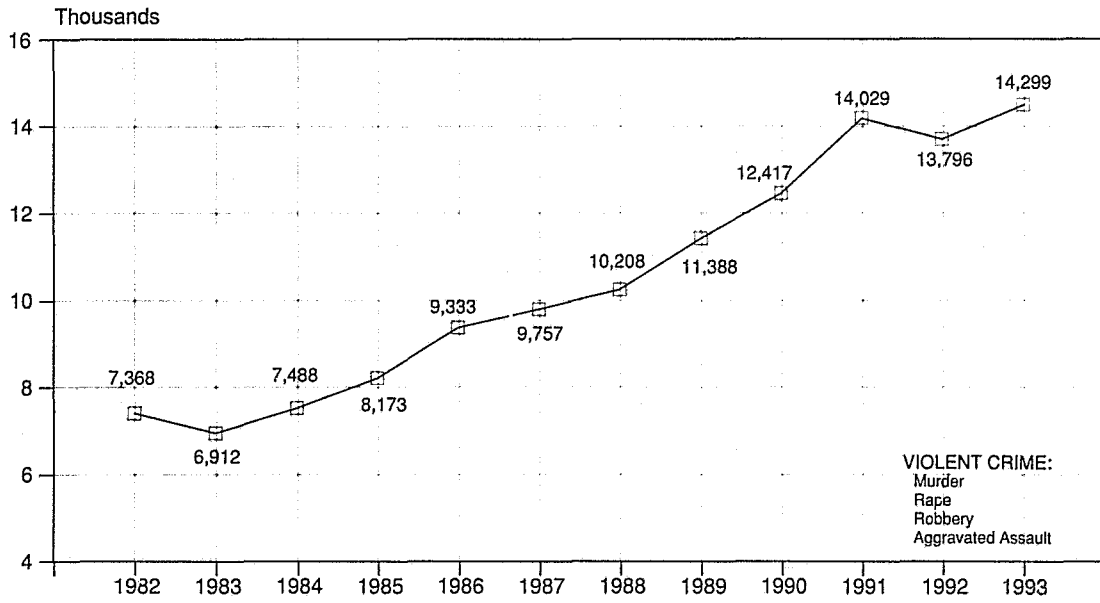

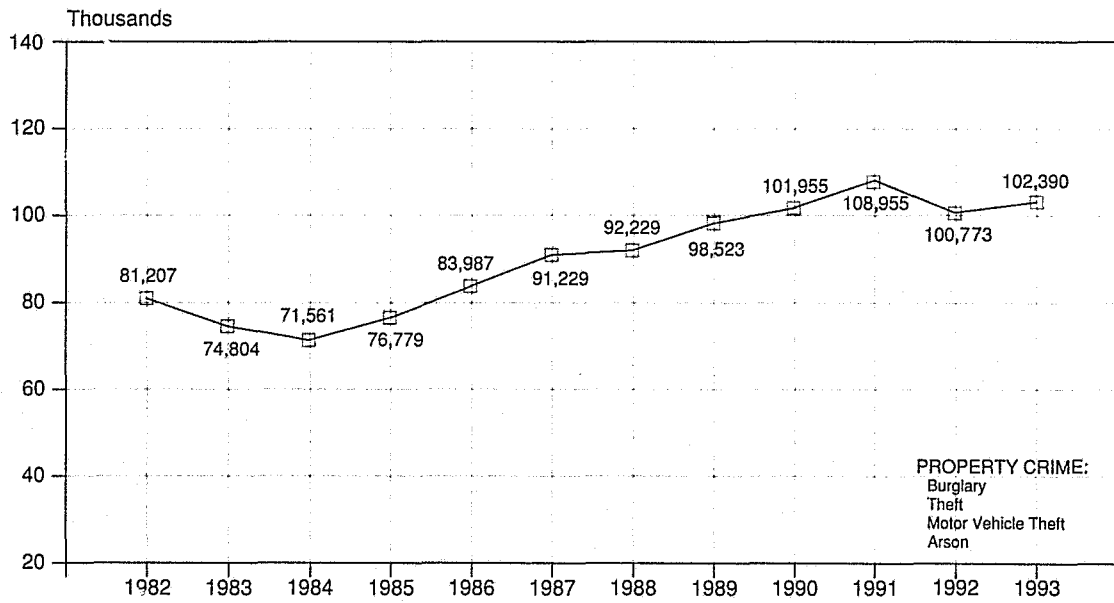

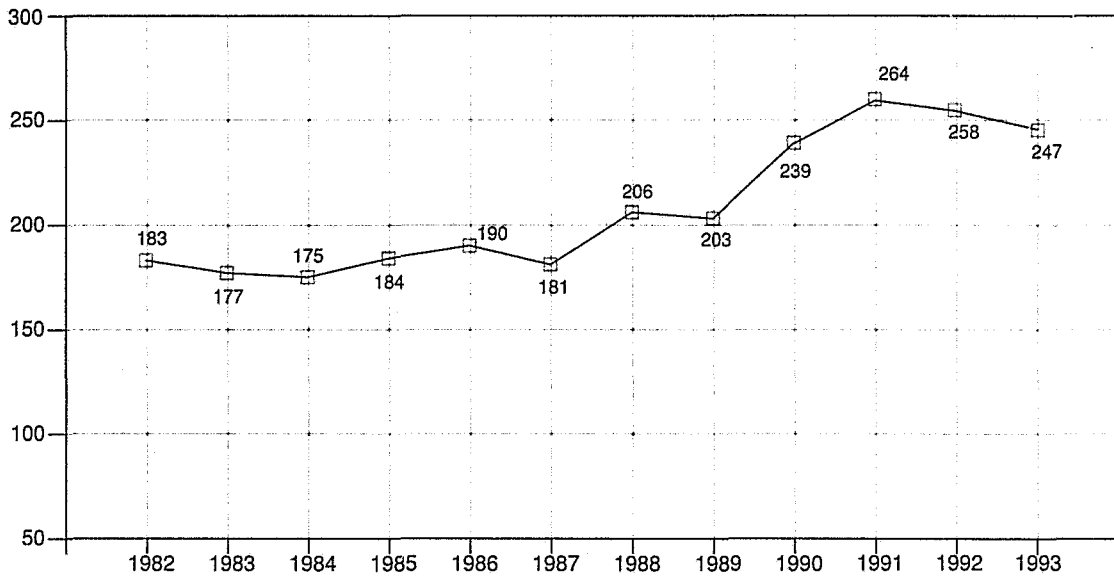
Yearly Violent Crime Trend



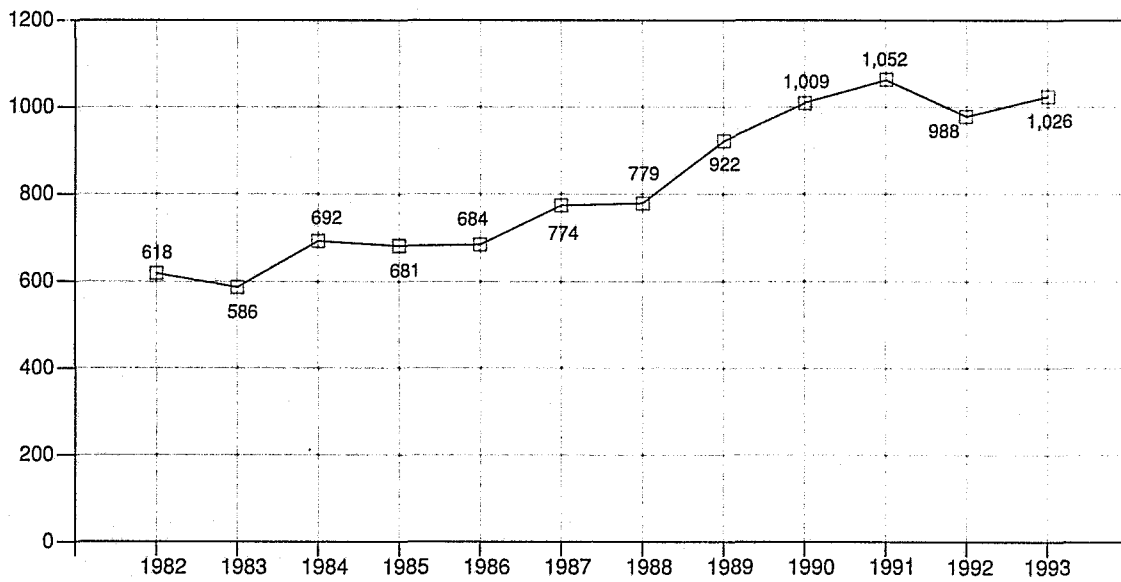
Yearly Property Crime Trend



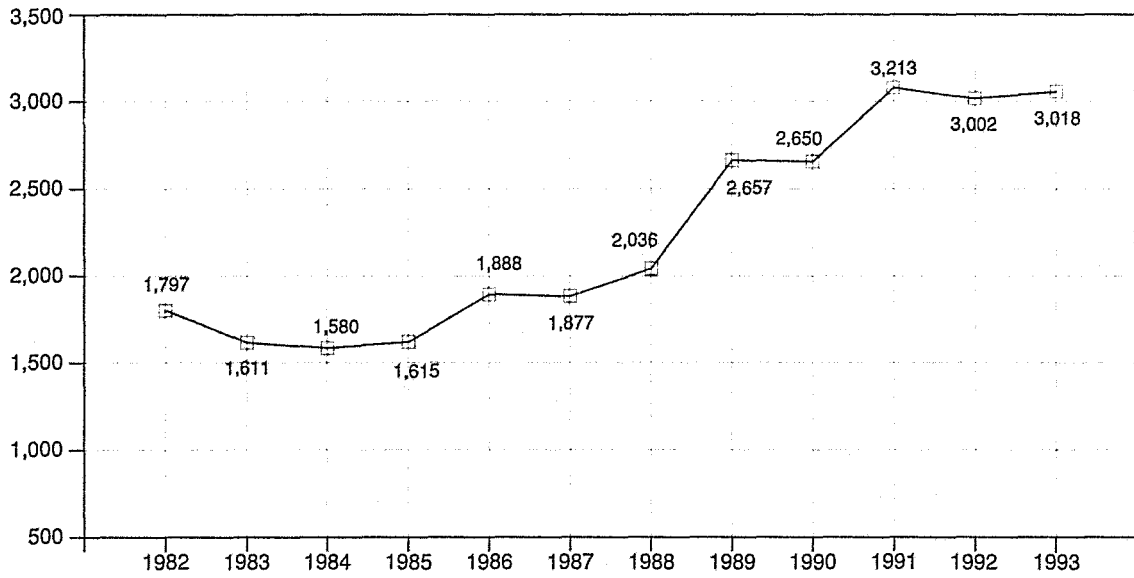
Murder Trend



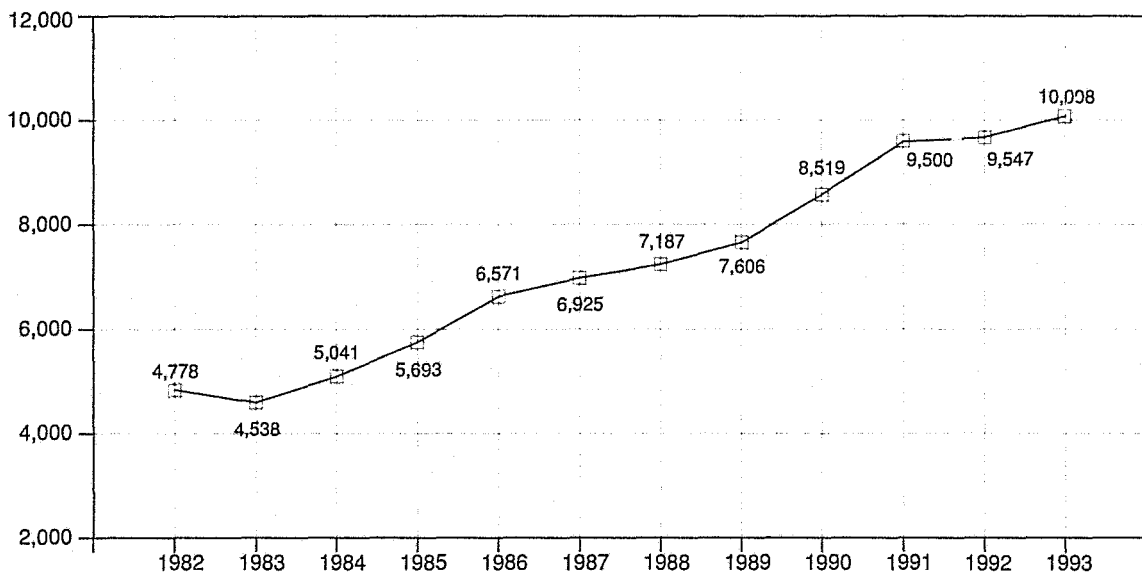
Rape Trend



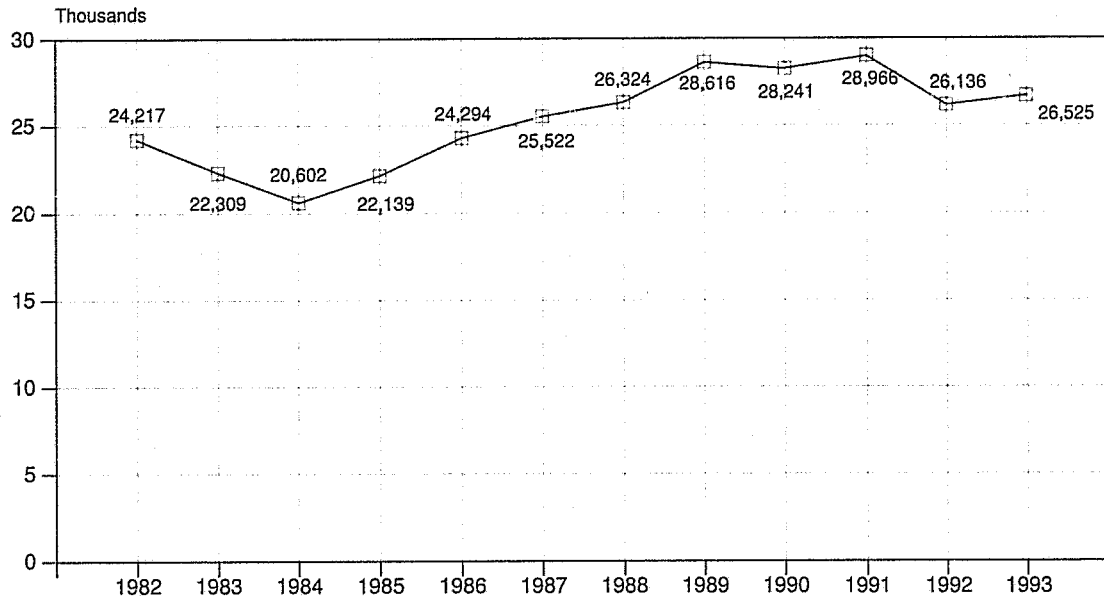
Robbery Trend



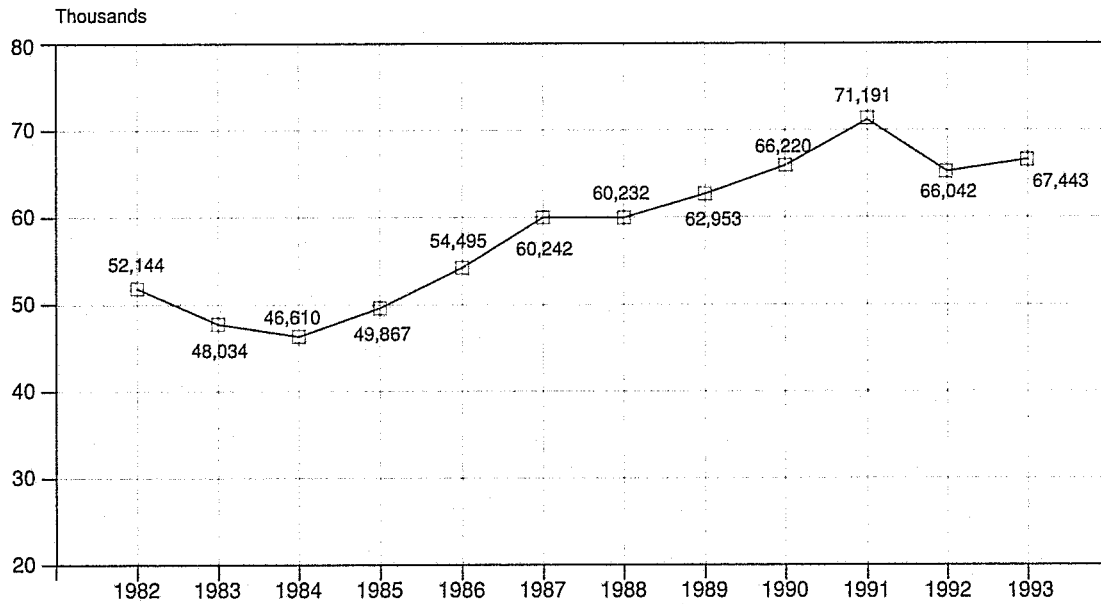
Aggravated Assault Trend



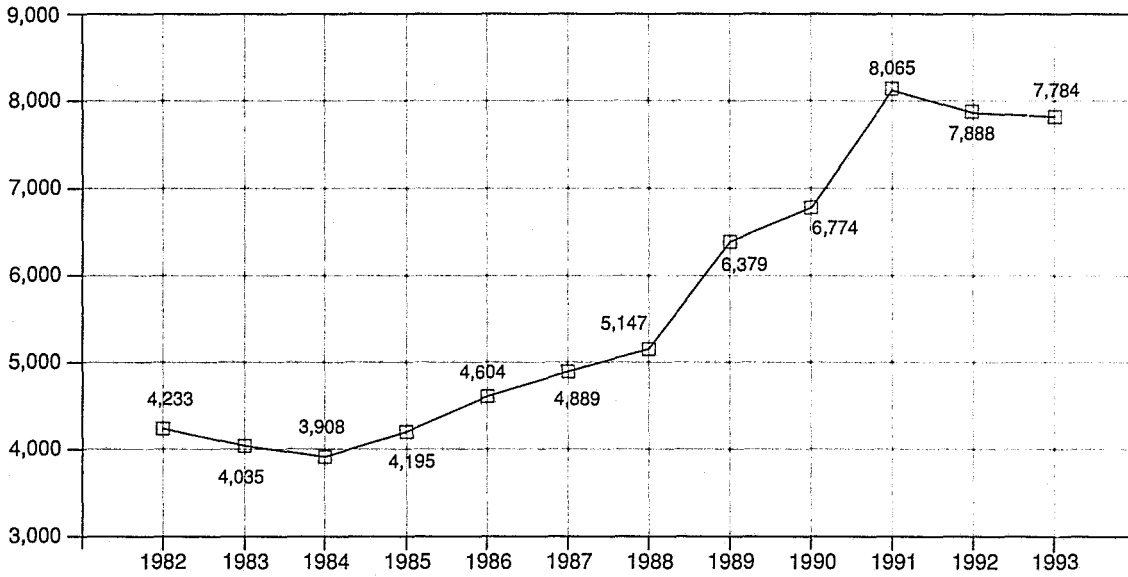
Burglary Trend



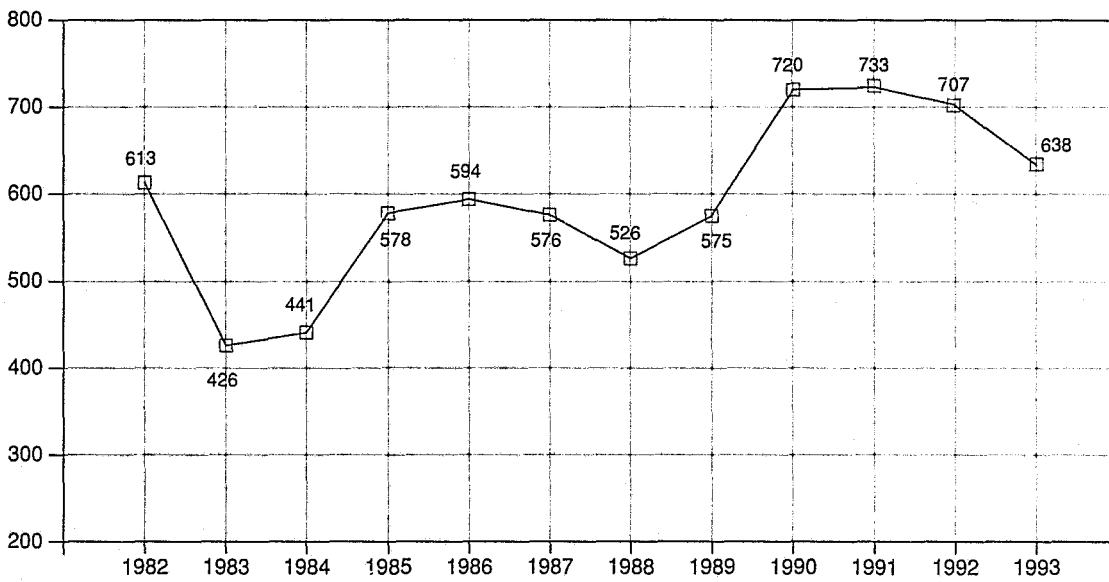
Theft Trend

Metropolitan Crime

Contributing Agencies and Population Coverage

For the year of 1993, 182 law enforcement agencies throughout the state contributed Uniform Crime Reports monthly and directly to the Arkansas Crime Information Center. Each month all of the 75 county Sheriff's Departments and 102 Police Departments participated. In addition, Public Safety Departments at four universities and the state university medical center submitted data to the program. Uniform Crime Reports received from these agencies represent statistical data covering approximately 99% of the estimated Arkansas population.

Section 3

1993 Crime Index Data

Murder

Murder is defined in Uniform Crime Reporting as the willful killing of another. The classification, as in all of the other Crime Index offenses, is based solely on police investigation as opposed to the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury, or other judicial body.

Deaths caused by negligence, suicide, accident, or justifiable homicide are not included in the count for this offense classification. Attempts to kill or assaults to kill are counted as aggravated assaults and not as murder.

Murder in 1993

There were 247 murders in Arkansas in 1993, a decrease of 4% from 1992, but still an increase of 20% from five years ago. There were 10 murders for every 100,000 population, with a clearance rate of 87%.

There were also eight incidents of manslaughter and 11 justifiable homicides in the state.

Murder accounted for less than 1% of the total Crime Index and only 2% of the violent Crime Index.

The state's five largest law enforcement jurisdictions (representing more than 55,000 people each) accounted for 47% of the murders.

The victims of murder were more likely to be black (56%) than white, male (73%) than female and the most frequent age range was 19 through 23 (17%). The most frequent suspect was also black (65%), male (89%) and the most frequent age range was 17 through 19 and 21 through 23 (35%). Almost half (49%) of the known offenders were age 15 through 25. Only 27 offenders were women. There were 54 murders committed by unknown perpetrators.

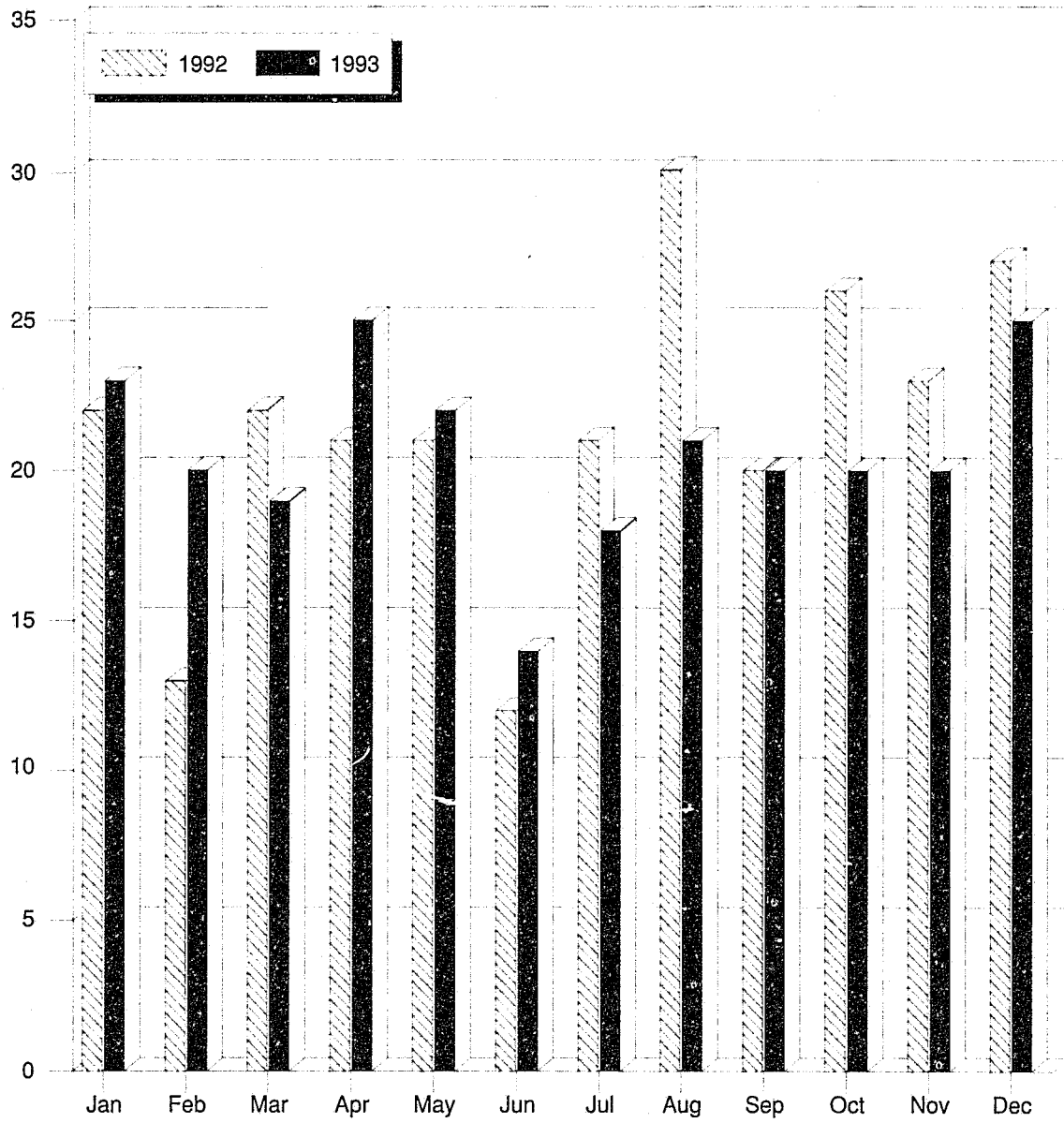

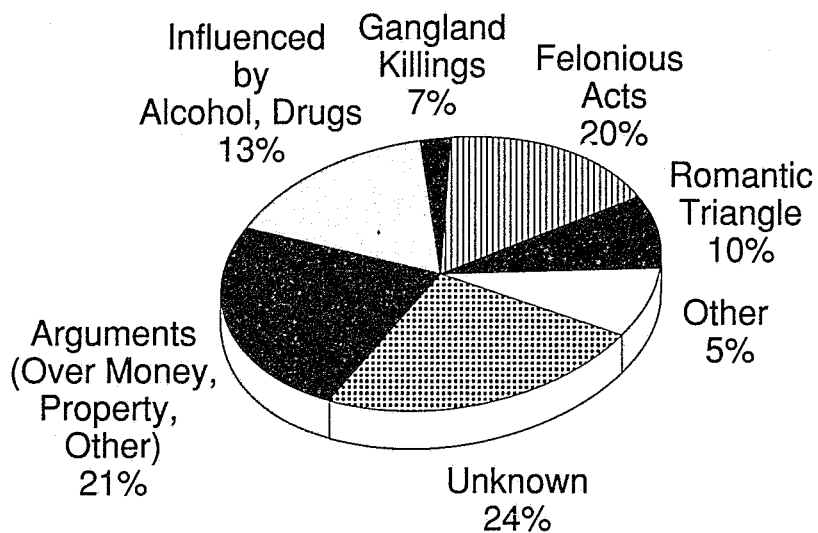

Murder Circumstances



A felony murder is defined as a killing which occurs in conjunction with the commission of another crime. During 1993, of the 51 felony murders, seven occurred in conjunction with rape, 27 with robbery, two with burglary, one with a motor vehicle theft, and 14 with drug offenses.

Murder

The oldest victim was a 92 year old black female. The youngest victims were a black female and a white female, both less than a year old. There was a decrease of 35% in the number of victims from age 11 to age 20 compared to 1992 and an increase of 21% in victims aged 40 to 55.

Rape

Forcible rape, as defined under this program, is the carnal knowledge of a female through the use of force or the threat of force. Assaults to commit forcible rape are also included; however, statutory rape (without force) is not counted in this category.

Rape in 1993

There were 1,026 rapes in Arkansas during 1993. This is an increase in actual and attempted rapes of 4% compared to 1992, and is 32% higher than in 1988. Approximately one-fourth of the victims were age 12 through 15.

Rape accounted for 0.9% of the total Crime Index and 7% of the Violent Crime Index. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions in the state (representing populations of more than 55,000 each) accounted for 43% of all rapes.

The number of rapes has increased 32% in five years and 48% in ten years.

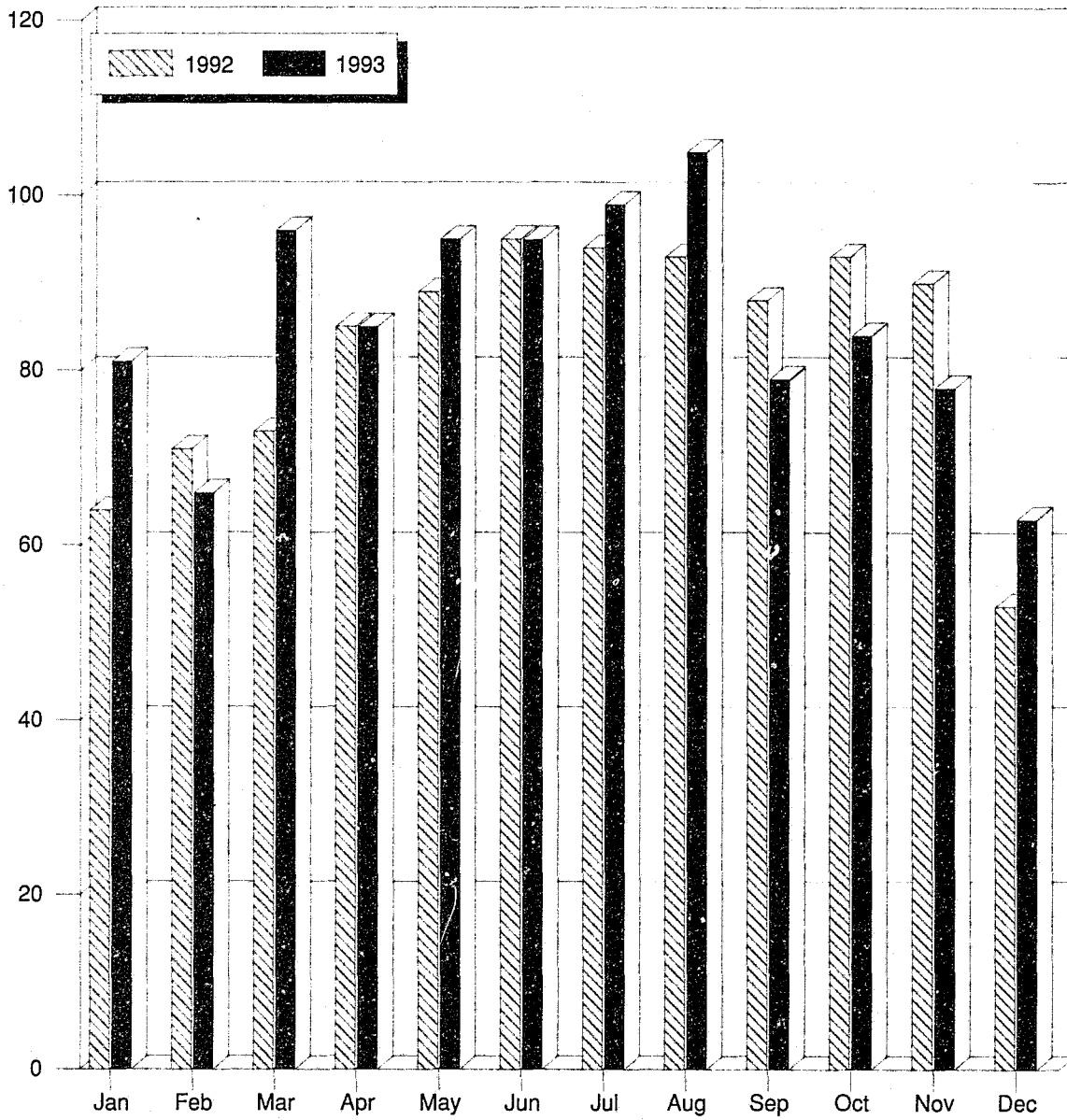

Robbery

Robbery is the taking of property or things of value from a person by use of force or threat of force. Assault to commit robbery and attempts are included. This is a violent crime and frequently results in injury to the victim.

Robbery in 1993

There were 3,018 robberies in Arkansas in 1993. Robberies represented 3% of the total Crime Index and 21% of the Violent Crime Index. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions (representing populations of more than 55,000 each) accounted for almost two-thirds of all robberies (61%).

Firearms were used in 48% of the robberies and 36% were strong arm robberies with no weapon involved. Although the number of robberies remained almost the same as in 1992, the average value of property stolen in 1993 was \$843, an increase of 65% from 1992.

Street robberies accounted for more than one-third of all robberies. The value of property here has increased steadily over the last four years; an average value of \$260 in 1990, \$370 in 1991, \$410 in 1992 and \$485 in 1993. All types of robberies decreased with the exception of residential robberies which increased 15%.

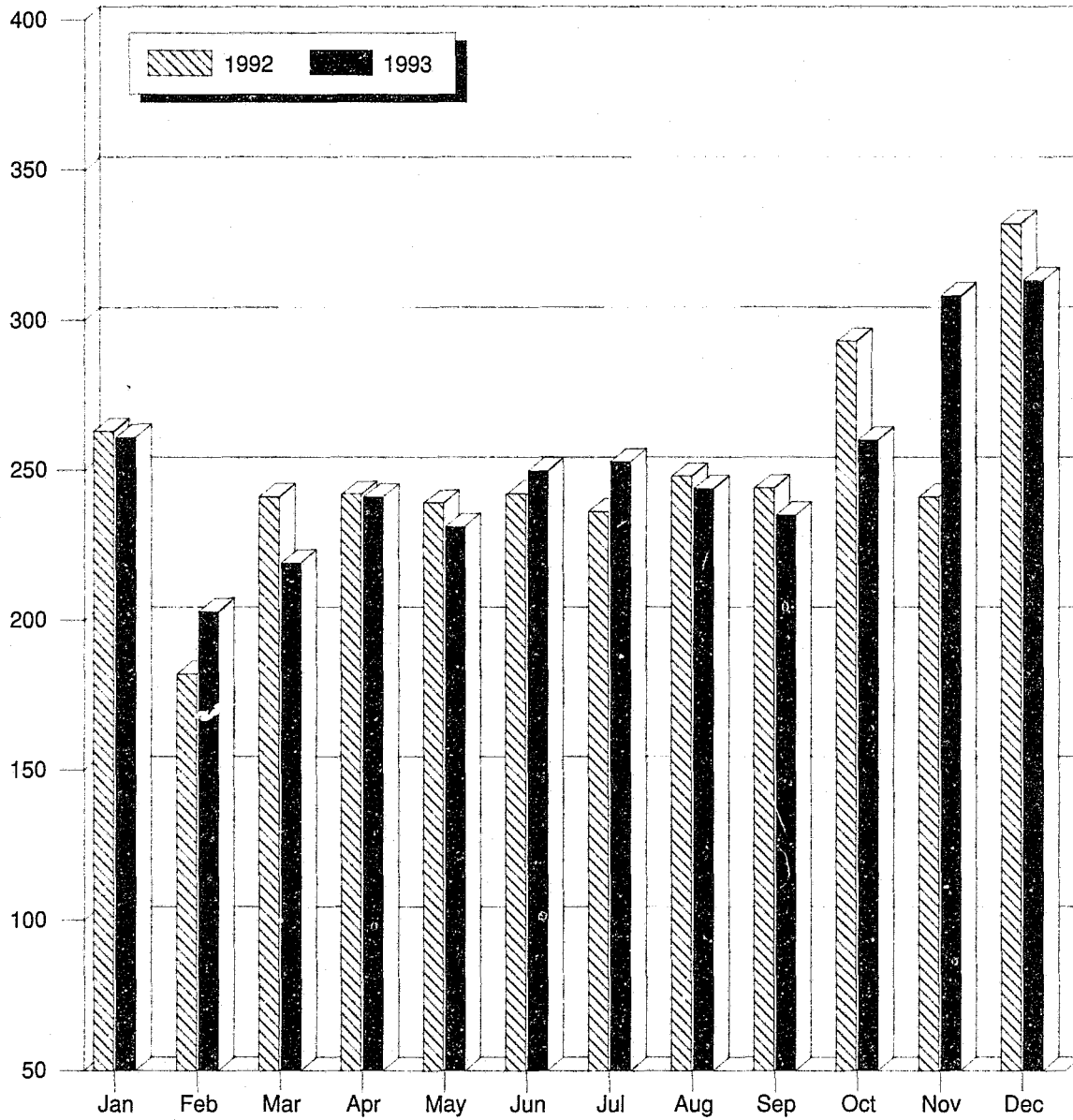

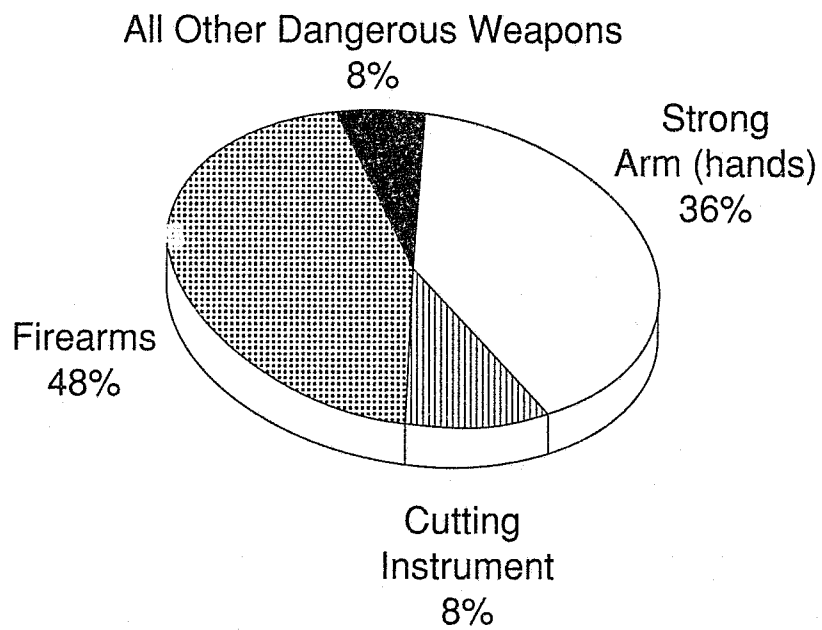

Aggravated Assault

Aggravated assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or other means likely to produce death or serious bodily harm. Attempts are included.

Aggravated Assault in 1993

There were 10,008 aggravated assaults in Arkansas during 1993. Aggravated assaults accounted for 9% of the Crime Index and for 70% of the Violent Crimes, with an increase of 39% since 1988. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions (representing populations of more than 55,000 each) accounted for 60% of all aggravated assaults in the state.

Almost one-fourth of all those arrested for aggravated assault were age 16 through age 21.

There were 18,383 additional non-aggravated assaults reported during 1993, an increase of 10% since 1992.

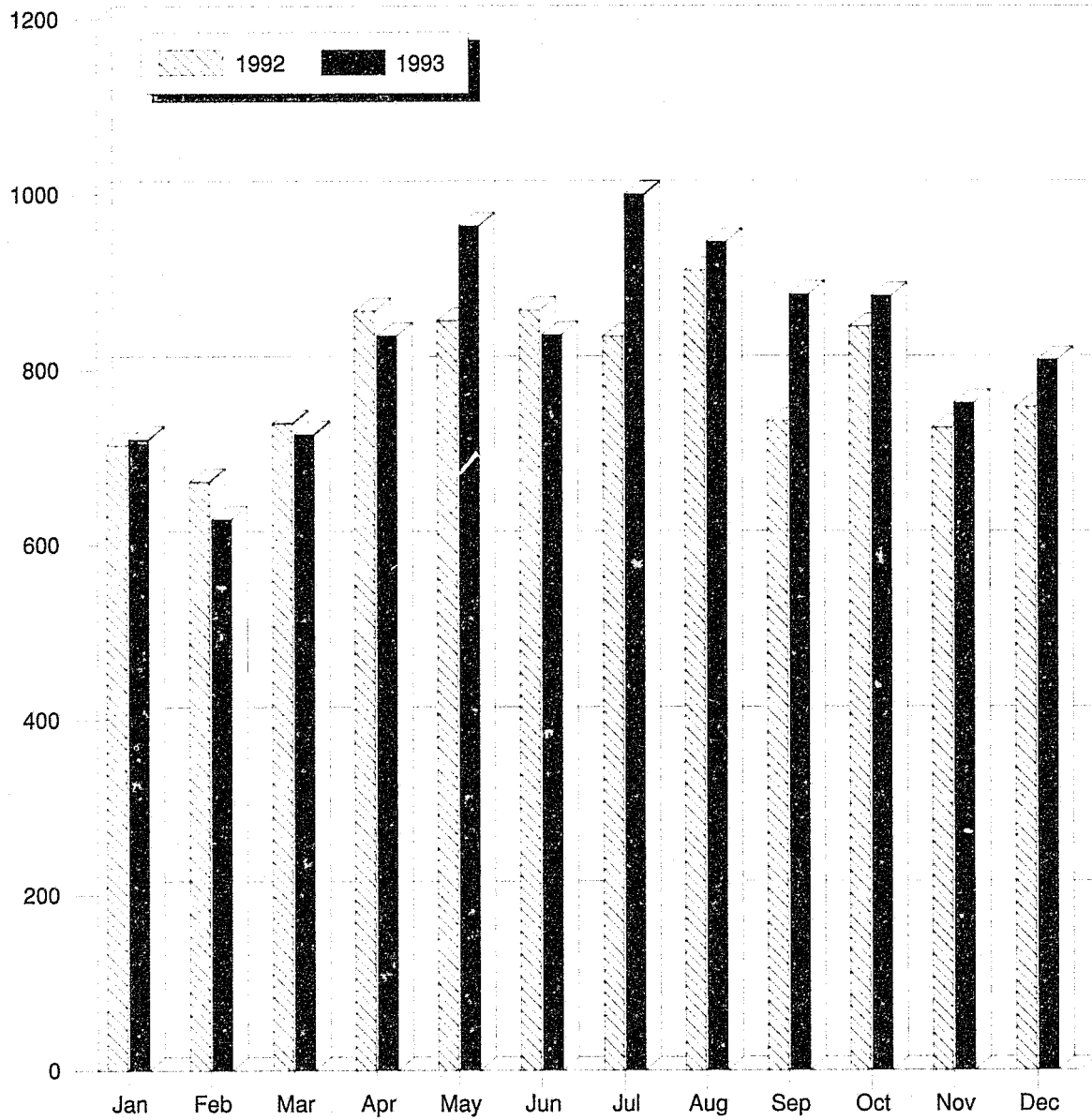

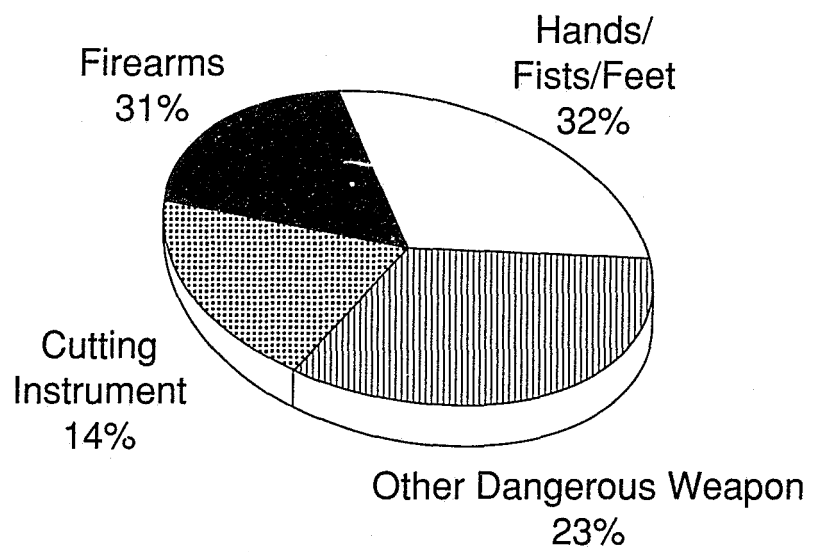

Burglary

Burglary is the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft. The use of force to gain entry is not required to classify the crime as burglary. The subclassifications of burglary are: forcible entry, unlawful entry without force, and attempted forcible entry.

Burglary in 1993

There were 26,525 burglaries in Arkansas in 1993. Burglaries accounted for 23% of the state's Crime Index Offenses and 26% of the Property Crimes. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions (representing populations of more than 55,000 each) accounted for 40% of the burglaries in the state. Burglary increased only 2% over 1992 and less than 1% compared to five years ago.

In 1993 there were more 18 year olds arrested for burglary than any other age, and 43% of those arrested were 18 years or younger.

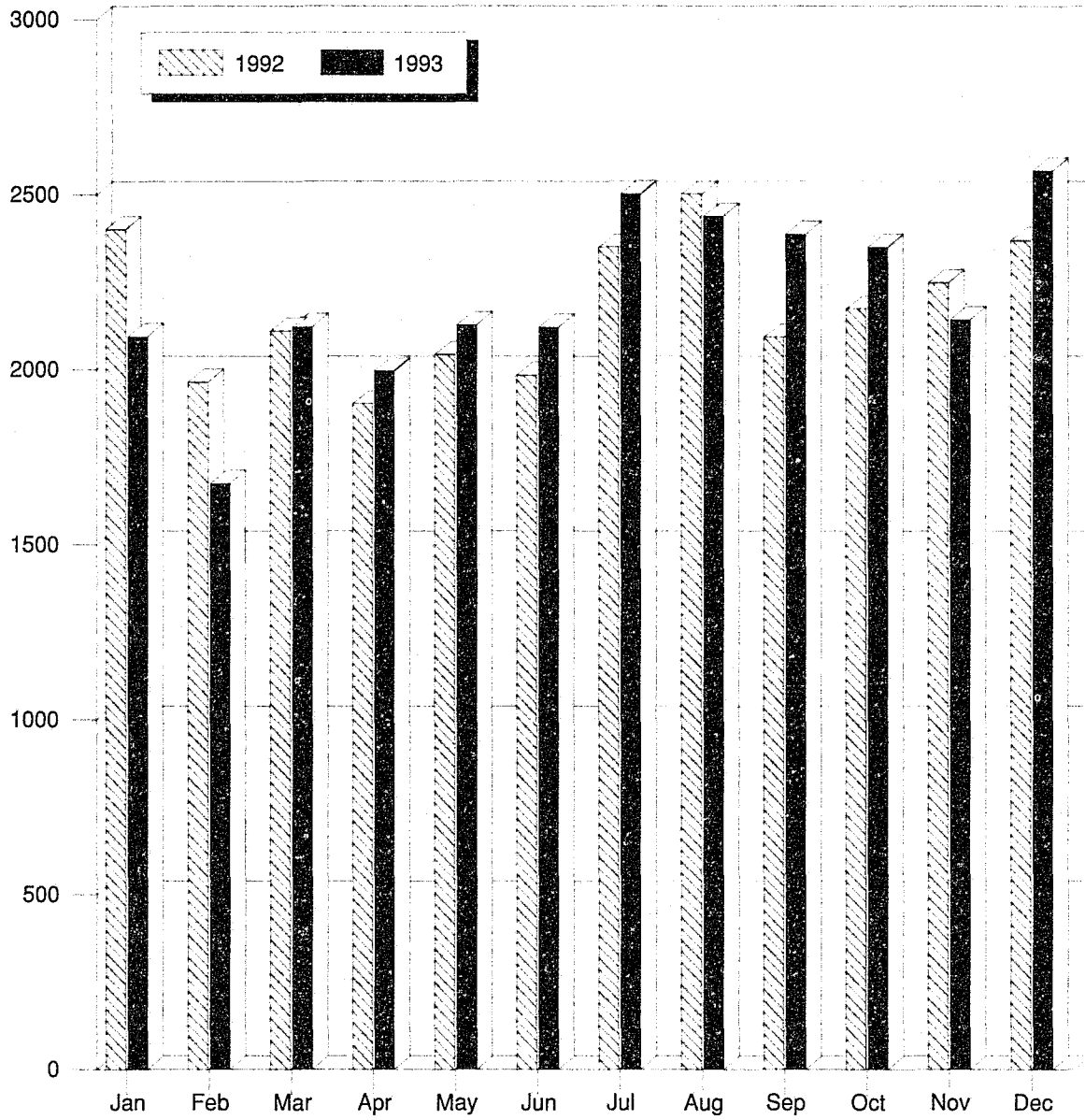

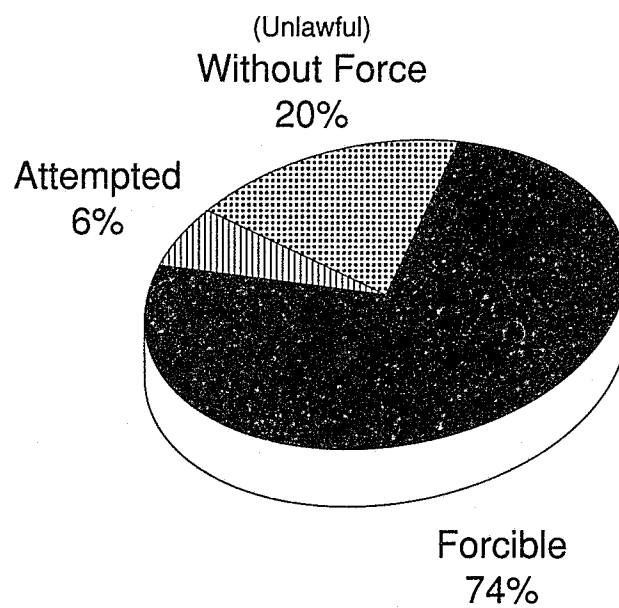

Theft

Theft is the unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence, or fraud.

Theft in 1993

There were 67,443 thefts reported in Arkansas in 1993, with a value of \$27.8 million stolen. Thefts accounted for 58% of the Crime Index, and 66% of the Property Crime. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions (representing populations of more than 55,000 each) accounted for 39% of all thefts.

The number of thefts has increased 2% since 1992, and overall there were 12% more thefts than in 1988. The average property value per theft was \$412 in 1993, almost the same as in 1992, but an increase of 8% from 1991. The total property value of thefts, \$27.8 million is 3% higher than 1992 and 34% higher than five years ago.

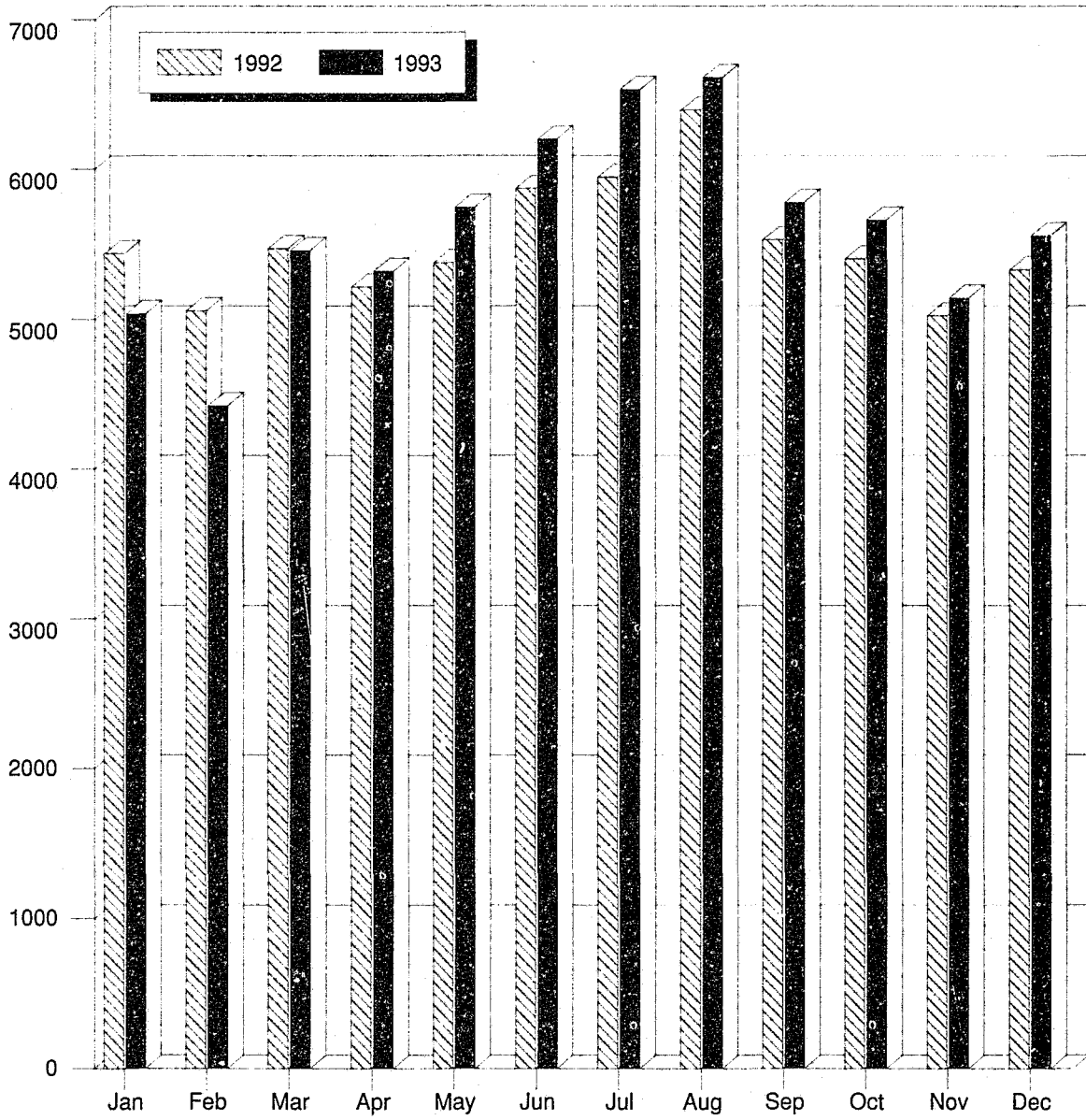

The incidence of purse snatching in Arkansas is 16% higher than ten years ago, but shoplifting has almost doubled (+85%). The theft of parts from motor vehicles has decreased 27% in ten years.

Motor Vehicle Theft

Motor vehicle theft is defined as the unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, including attempts. This excludes the taking for temporary use by those persons having unlawful access to the vehicle.

Motor Vehicle Theft in 1993

There were 7,784 motor vehicles stolen in Arkansas in 1993. The value of stolen motor vehicles was \$43 million. Motor vehicle thefts accounted for 7% of the Crime Index Offenses, and 8% of the Property Crime Offenses. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions (representing populations of more than 55,000 each) accounted for 52% of all motor vehicle thefts. There has been a slight decrease in motor vehicle theft for the past two years, and these are the first yearly decreases since 1984. The increase over the last five years is 51%.

For the sixth year in a row, over half of those arrested for motor vehicle theft were age eighteen or younger. Almost half of the 93 females arrested were ages 13 through 15.

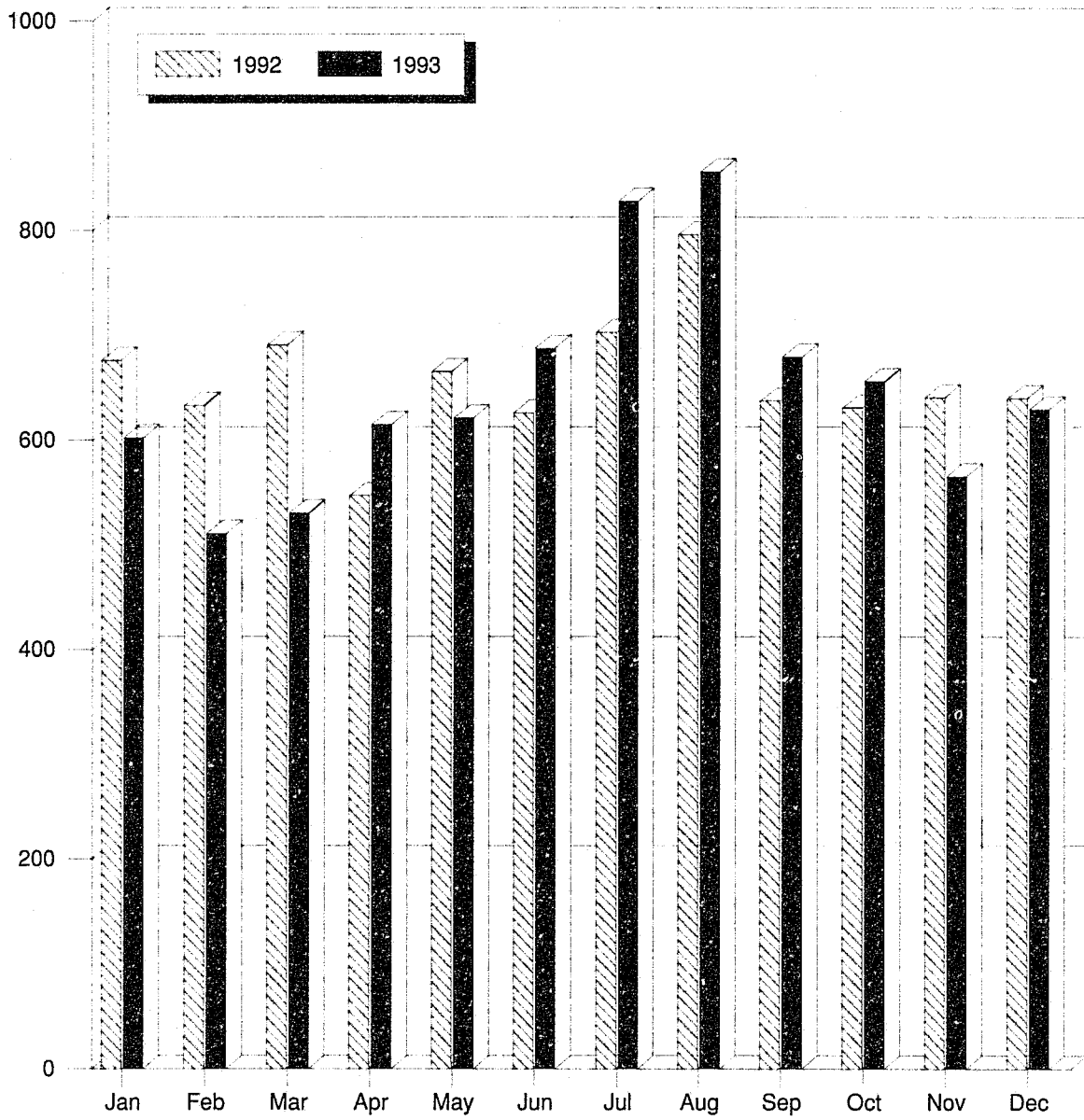

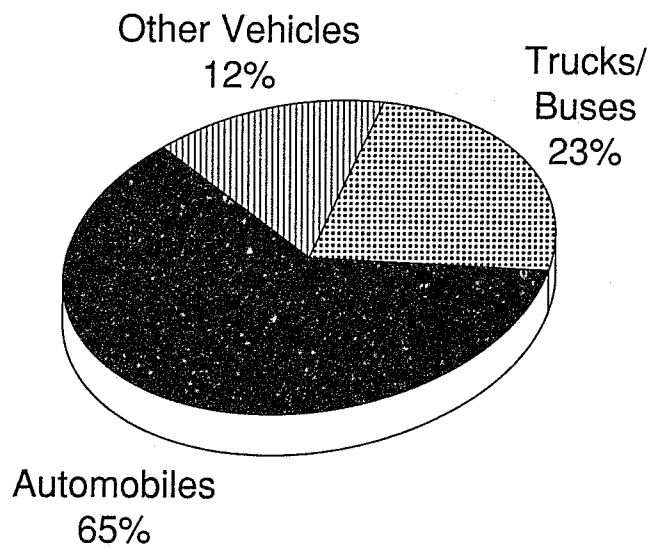

Arson

Arson is defined as any willful or malicious burning or attempts to burn, with or without attempt to defraud.

Arson in 1993

There were 638 arsons reported in Arkansas in 1993. The value of the property damage was \$6.9 million. Although arson decreased 10% the value of the property damage decreased 37% with the largest decreases being in commercial property (-76%) and in public or community property (-80%). The average damage per arson amounted to \$10,887 in 1993 and \$15,646 in 1992. Arson accounted for less than 1% of the Property Crime Offenses and the total Crime Index Offenses. The five largest law enforcement jurisdictions (representing populations of more than 55,000 each) accounted for 45% of the arson in the state.

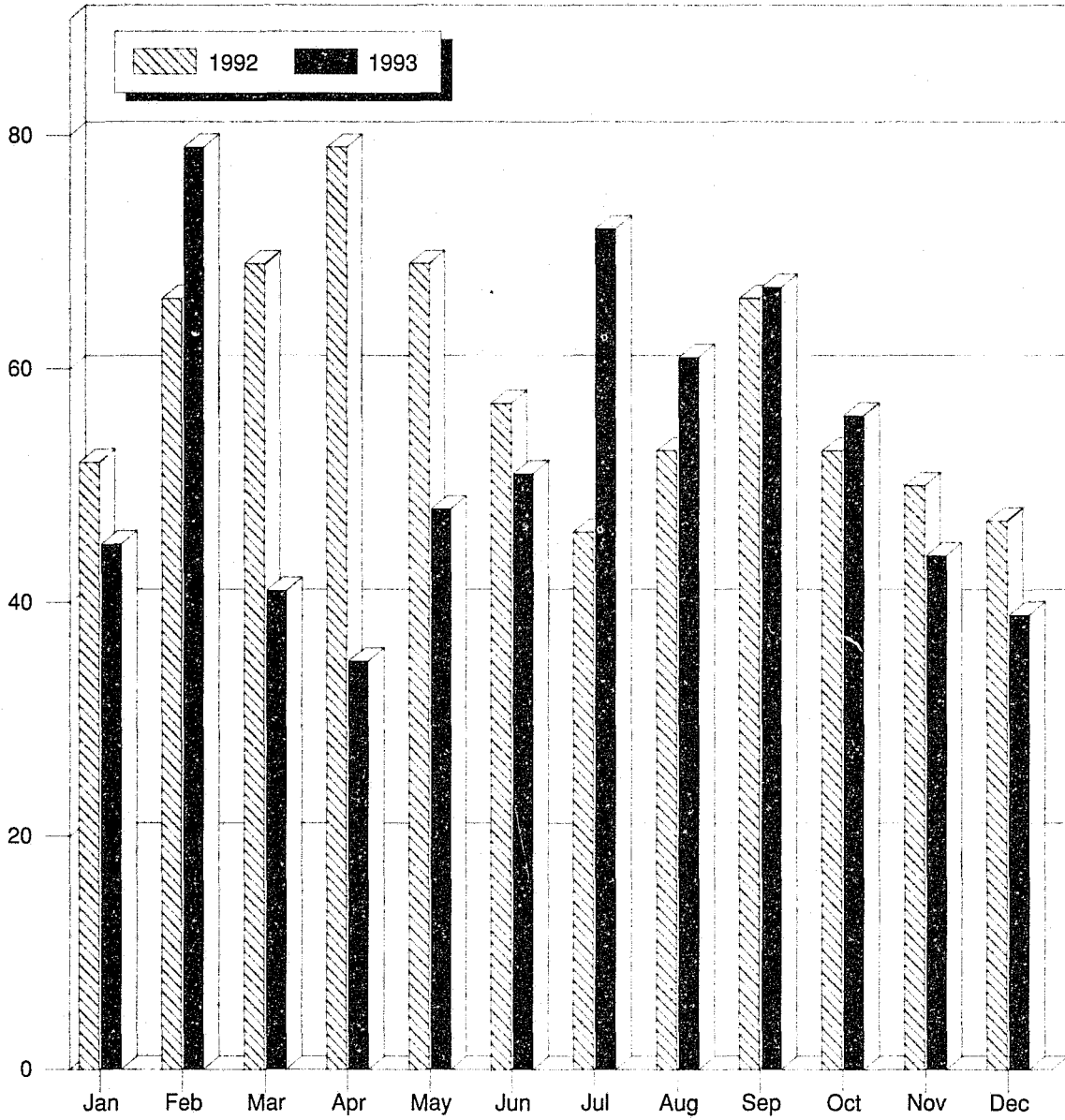

Law Enforcement Officers Assaulted

Law Enforcement Officers Killed in 1993

Three Arkansans were among the 68 law enforcement officers nationwide who died during 1993 in the line of duty. Nationally this is an increase of 10% from 1992.

Special Agent Robert J. Williams of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, was one of four officers shot and killed when agents tried to execute a warrant at the Branch Davidian compound near Waco, Texas on February 28, 1993.

Officer Henry Callanen, 62, a 35-year veteran of the Little Rock Police Department, was shot in the left side about 12:40 a.m. on May 15, 1993 during a robbery attempt at a local restaurant. Callanen was working off duty at the restaurant but wearing his uniform when the shooting occurred. He was rushed to the hospital but pronounced dead about 1:00 a.m. on May 16th. Both offenders were arrested, charged and convicted. One conviction was life without parole.

Officer Jeff Richardson, 31, a Cave City (Sharp County) police officer was killed on May 21, 1993 when another vehicle turned in front of him during a pursuit. Officer Richardson was killed at the scene in the near head-on collision. The other driver died a few hours later. The fleeing suspect was arrested, jailed and charged with felonious fleeing.

Law Enforcement Officers Assaulted

In 1993, 399 assaults on sworn officers in Arkansas were reported to the Uniform Crime Reporting Program. Compared to the 386 assaults in 1992, this is an increase of 3%. The number in 1993 is still 4% lower than 1991 when there were 414 assaults on officers, the highest number of assaults recorded for any one year.

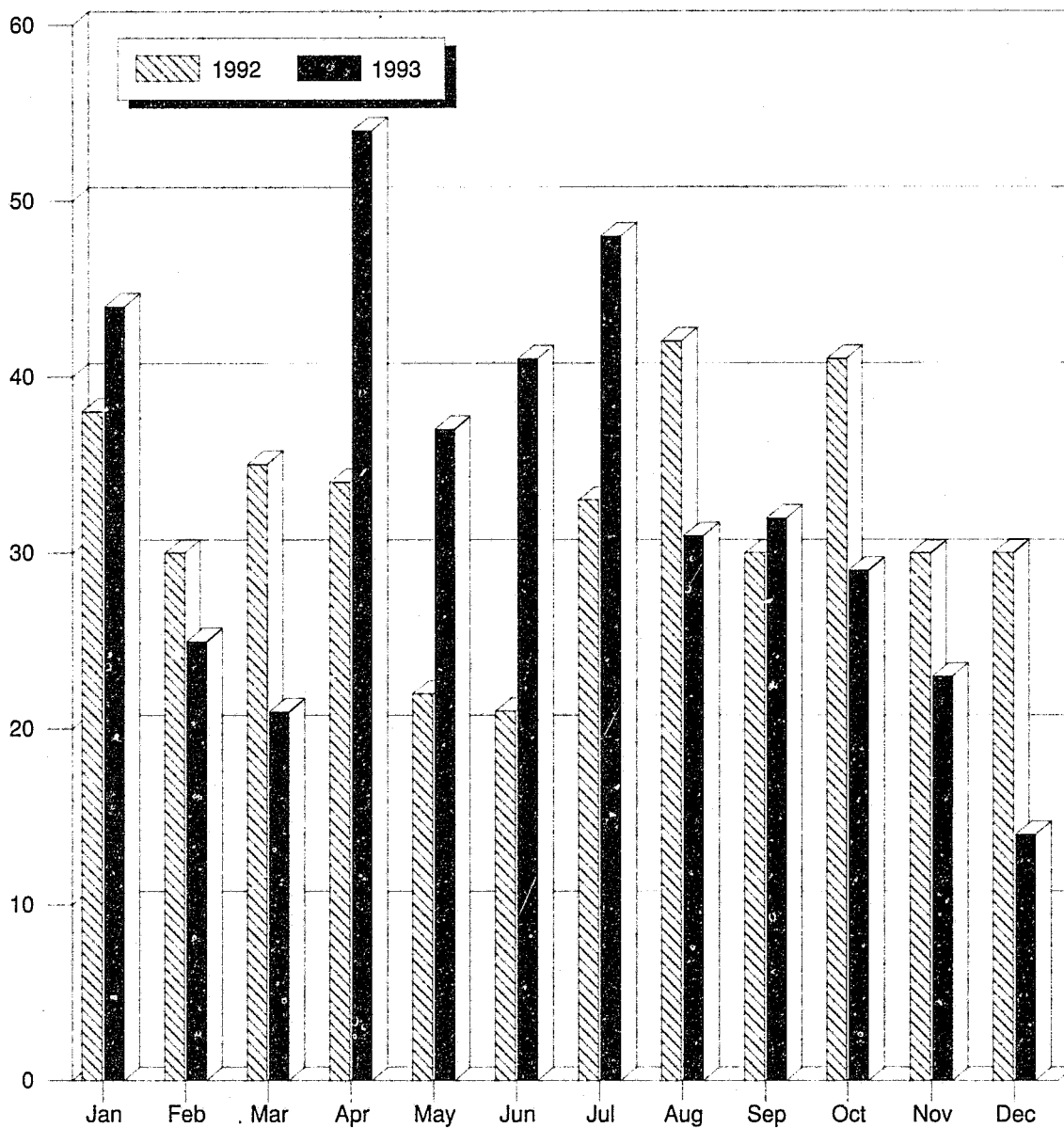

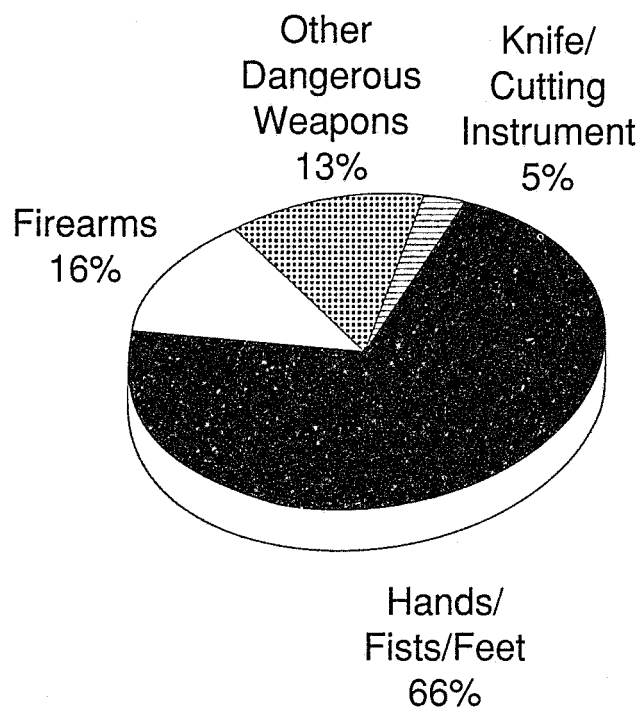

Section 9

Glossary

Glossary of Terms

Actual Offense - A violation of the law which has been confirmed to have happened by law enforcement personnel.

Adult - For Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) purposes, a person 18 years of age or more (Arkansas Statutes define an adult the same as UCR).

Aggravated Assault - An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury.

All Other Offenses - All violations of state or local laws not specifically covered in the Part II offenses, except traffic.

Arrest Rate - The number of arrests reported for each unit of population (per 100,000 in this publication). The arrest rate is computed by dividing the number of arrests in a particular category by the population and multiplying that answer by 100,000.

Arson - Any willful or malicious burning or attempting to burn, with or without attempt to defraud.

Burglary - The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft.

Classifying - Determining the proper crime categories in which to report offenses for UCR based on the facts contained in the police investigation report.

Clearance by Arrest - An offense is considered cleared when at least one person involved in the commission of the offense has been (1) arrested, (2) charged, and (3) turned over for prosecution.

Clearance by Exceptional Means - An offense in which some element beyond law enforcement control prevents placing of formal charges against the offender, but the police have: (1) definitely established the identity of the offender, (2) enough information to support arrest, charge, and turn over to the court for prosecution, and (3) knowledge of the location of the offender so that he could be taken into custody.

Clearance Rate - The percentage of offenses cleared by arrest. This is computed by dividing the number of clearances in a particular offense category by the number of offenses reported in that category.

Crime Factor - Conditions which affect the amount and type of crime that occurs in a geographical location.

Crime Index - The total of eight major offenses chosen because of their seriousness and frequency with which they occur (Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson).

Crime Rate - The number of index offenses reported for each unit of population (per 100,000 in this publication). Crime rate is computed by dividing the number of index offenses by the population and multiplying that answer by 100,000.

Crime Trend - A percent change of an offense over a comparable previous period. A negative indicates a decrease and a positive an increase.

Curfew and Loitering - Violation of local curfew or loitering ordinances (persons under 18).

Disorderly Conduct - A breach of the peace.

Driving Under the Influence - Driving or operating any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.

Drunkenness - Drunkenness or intoxication.

Embezzlement - Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

Forgery and Counterfeiting - Making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent-to-defraud anything false which is made to appear true or the attempt to do any of the above.

Fraud - Fraudulent conversion and obtaining of money or property by false pretenses. Includes bad checks except forgeries and counterfeiting.

Gambling - Promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling.

Hierarchy Rule - A standard UCR scoring practice in which only the most serious offense is counted in multiple offense situations. This is determined by crime index offense order (The exception to this is arson. It is always counted, even in multiple situations).

Hotel Rule - A standard UCR scoring practice which limits to one the number of burglaries which can be counted when more than one room is entered for the purpose of committing a felony or theft within a structure generally intended to house transients.

Jurisdiction - The area for which a city, county, or state law enforcement agency is responsible. In UCR: (1) police report offenses which occur within their city, (2) county and state report offenses which take place in the county, (3) agencies report only those arrests made for offenses committed within their jurisdiction, and (4) the recovery of property is reported only by the jurisdiction from which it was stolen.

Juvenile - For UCR purposes a juvenile is defined as a person under 18 years of age (Arkansas Statutes define a juvenile the same as UCR).

Justifiable Homicide - The killing of a felon by a peace officer in the line of duty or the killing (during the commission of a felony) of a felon by a private citizen.

Liquor Laws - State or local liquor law violations, except driving under the influence.

Manslaughter by Negligence - The killing of another through gross negligence.

Motor Vehicle Theft - The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

Murder - The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Narcotic Drug Laws - Offenses relating to narcotic drugs, such as unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs.

Non-Aggravated Assault - All assaults and attempted assaults which are not of an aggravated nature and do not result in serious injury to the victim.

Offense - A violation of the law.

Offenses Against Family & Children - Non-Support, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.

Part I Offenses - The first of two main groupings of UCR crime classifications consisting of eight index offenses.

Part II Offenses - The second of two main UCR groupings of crime classifications not already designated in Part I. Part II offenses are limited to arrest information only with the exception of simple assault.

Property Crimes - Unlawful acts with the intent of gaining property, but do not involve force against a person (Theft, Burglary, Motor Vehicle Theft, Arson).

Prostitution & Commercialized Vice - Sex offenses of a commercialized nature, such as prostitution, procuring or the transportation of women for immoral purposes.

Rape - The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.

Robbery - The taking of property or things of value from a person by use of force or threat of force.

Runaway - Limited to juveniles taken into custody under the provisions of local statutes.

Scoring - Counting the number of offenses after they have been classified.

Sex Offenses - Statutory rape; offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like.

Stolen Property; Buying, Receiving, Possessing - Buying, receiving or possessing of stolen property as well as all attempts of the above.

Suspicion - Arrested for no specific offense and released without formal charges being placed.

Theft - Unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence, or fraud.

Unfounded Offenses - Offenses which are determined through investigation to be false or baseless.

Vagrancy - Vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc.

Vandalism - Willful and malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or persons having custody or control.

Violent Crime - Unlawful acts that involve the use or threat of force against a person (Murder, Rape, Robbery, and Aggravated Assault).

Weapons; Carrying, Possessing, etc. - All violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing, and manufacturing of deadly weapons.
