

#### **CJ-5**

Confinement facilities usually administered by a local law enforcement agency, intended for adults but sometimes holding juveniles.

- If actual numeric answers are entered, the drop-down menu should remain as "ACT".
- If the answer to a question is "not available" or "unknown," select "DK" from the drop-down menu.
- If the answer to a question is "not applicable," select "NA" from the dropdown menu.
- If exact numeric answers are not available, provide estimates and select "EST" from the drop-down menu.

#### Entering Data [top]

You do not need to complete the questionnaire all at once. When you enter data and click the save button, a message will appear indicating that the data are being saved. **CLICK** "**OK**" and continue. If you plan to leave your application for an extended length of time, be sure to save your work before leaving.

If you enter data and attempt to go to another page without clicking the save button, a message will appear informing you that the data values have been changed. You can either click "OK" to "Save and Continue" or click "Cancel" to continue without saving.

Do not use commas or periods when entering data.

If you have any comments, click "Notes" option on the menu bar. Describe the data problem or issue in the notes box limited to 254 characters.

To assist you in completing the form, every item will include an automated sum feature. Check your total against the sum provided.

#### Checking Data [top]

The data that you enter will be checked for addition accuracy. If there is an error in the data that you have entered, a message will appear indicating the nature of the problem. You may either correct the data or choose to ignore it by closing the window and continuing.

To check for blanks and internal consistency, click the "data check" option on the menu bar. You may print a list of errors at any time by clicking the "File/Print" option on the menu bar.
