	<p>Misuse of existing credit card account</p>	<p>Unauthorized access to a credit card account</p>
	<p>Misuse of existing bank account</p>	<p>Unauthorized access to a bank account</p>
	<p>Misuse of existing email/social media account</p>	<p>Unauthorized access to an email or social media account, e.g., Gmail or Facebook</p>
	<p>Misuse of other existing account</p>	<p>Unauthorized access to another type of existing account, e.g., a telephone, internet, utilities, or a medical insurance account</p>
	<p>Open a new account</p>	<p>Opening a new account using someone else's personal information</p>
	<p>Other misuse of personal information</p>	<p>Misuse of someone else's personal information to commit other fraudulent behavior, e.g., misidentifying to police or applying for a job</p>
