Nonresponse in the NCVS

Types of item nonresponse

- Residue
- Out of universe
- Item invalid until
- Item invalid after



Residue

- A **residue** nonresponse occurs when there is an out of range, unusable, or blank entry.
- Census may recode residue into a valid code.
- Coded as 8, 98, or 998.



Out of universe

- An out of universe nonresponse occurs due to a question being skipped because of the survey skip pattern.
- That question does not apply to the respondent.
- Coded as a 9 or series of 9s.



Item invalid until YYYY Q#

• An item invalid until nonresponse occurs when a

question added to the NCVS.

- Respondents were no longer in the sample when the question was added.
- Coded as-1



Item invalid after YYYY Q#


- An item invalid after nonresponse occurs when a question is removed from the NCVS.
- Respondents not asked a question because the question was dropped before they were in the sample.
- Coded as-2.



Refused/don 't know

- Respondents may refuse to answer a question or say they don't know a response.
- Not considered missing by NCVS.
- May be treated as residue.
