






Tribal Victim Service Providers (VSPs)

Tribal VSPs include VSPs located within tribal governments, organizations, or entities serving tribal, American Indian, or Alaska Native populations.






Unique services provided by tribal VSPs. This is more than any other type of VSP.

Most common services provided by tribal VSPs

-  Emergency, transitional, or relocation housing **57%**
-  Assistance filling a restraining order **50%**
-  Transportation assistance **34%**
-  Assistance meeting other basic needs **32%**
-  Online or phone referrals to other organizations or programs **31%**

Most difficult services for tribal VSPs to obtain for victims

-  Shelter or housing **91%**
-  Mental health services **48%**
-  Compensation or monetary assistance, and material or financial advocacy or support **38%**
-  Other services including transportation, substance abuse or drug treatment, child care, affordable legal services, and language services **23%**
-  Civil justice-related assistance **19%**
