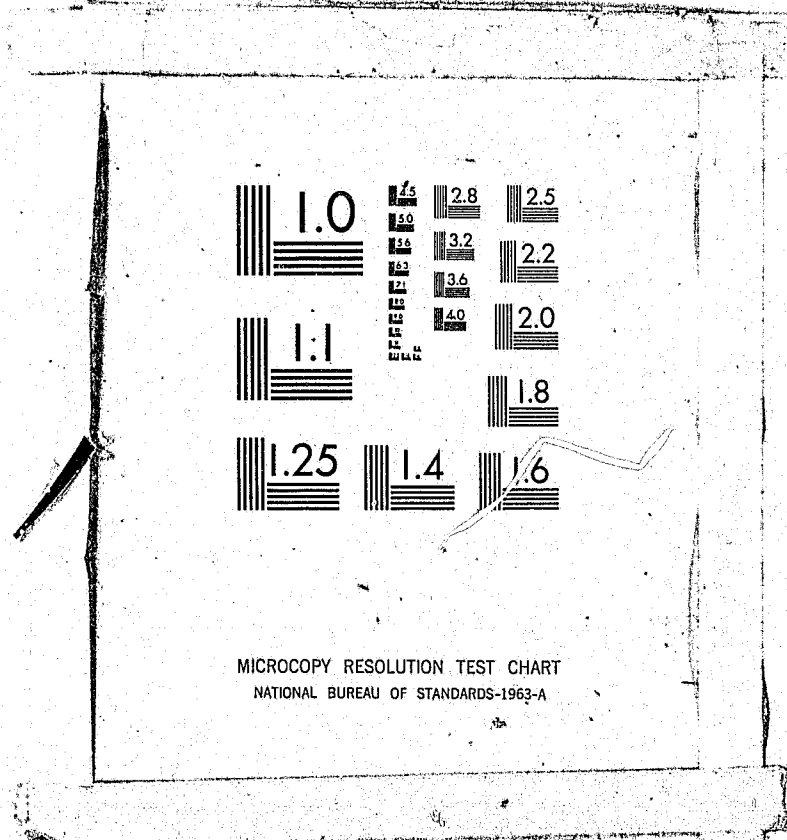


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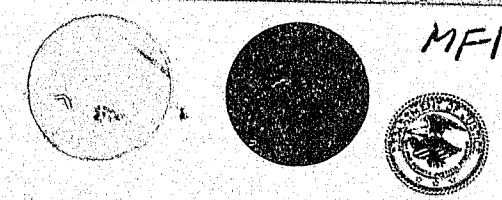
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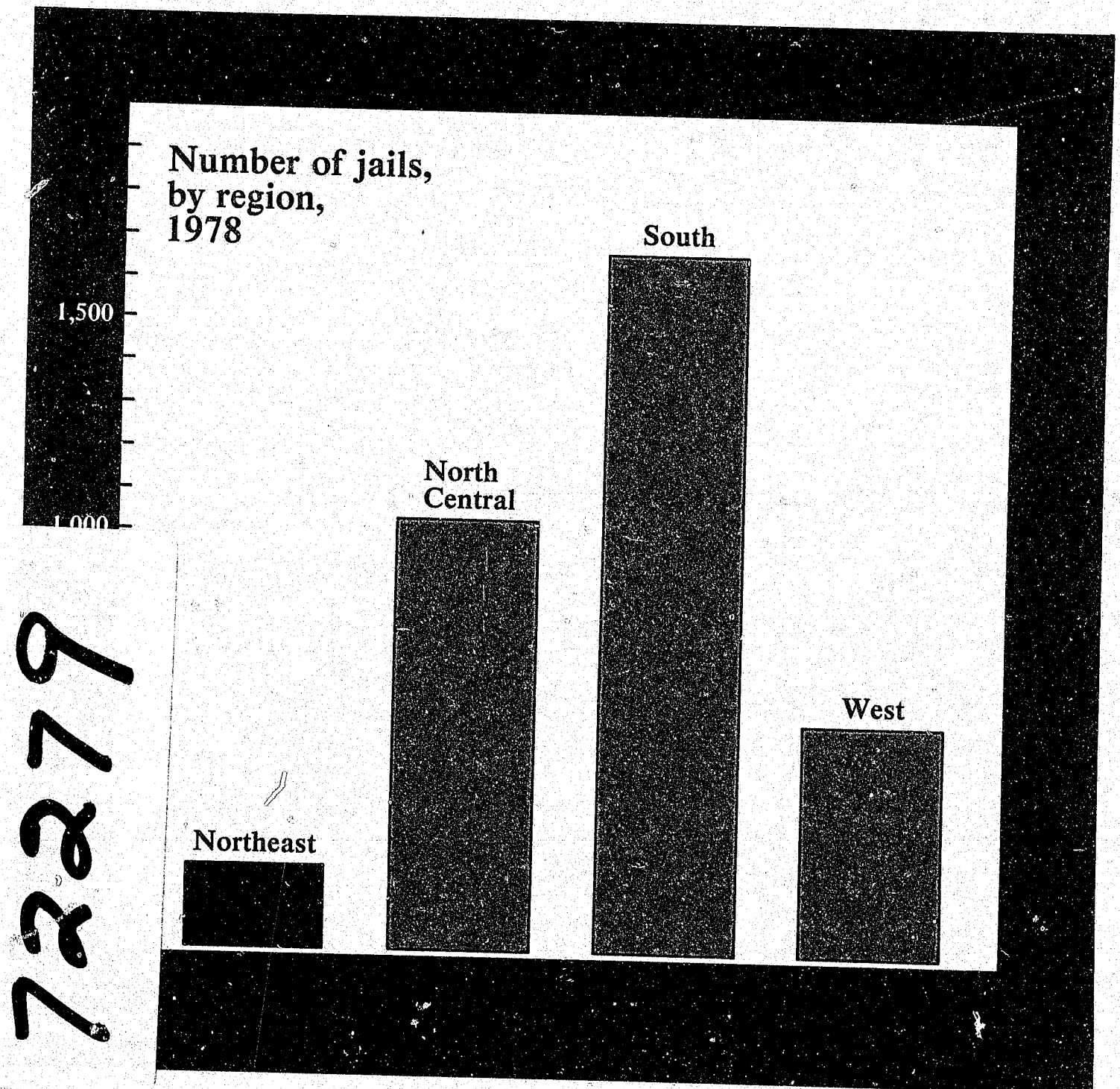

## **Selected findings**

The Northeast region had only 6 percent of the total number of locally administered jails in the U.S. (table A).

Jails in the Northeast held 15 percent of the Nation's total jail population on February 15, 1978 (table B).

Jail capacity in the Northeast was 13 percent of the total in the Nation; 42 percent of all beds were located in one-inmate units (table C and D).

The ratio of inmates to total employees (full-time and part-time) in this region was 1.8 to 1; the ratio of inmates to custodial personnel was 2.6 to 1 (table E).

Over 80 percent of the jails in the Northeast reported giving inmates a health interview or screening upon admission (table F).

## Introduction

This report presents data from the 1978 National Jail Census for the jails in the Northeast region. It is one in a series of four reports on local jails. The other three reports are for the North Central, South, and West regions.

The 1978 National Jail Census and the companion Survey of Inmates of Local Jails were conducted for the Bureau of Justice Statistics by the Bureau of the Census. Summary results of these two surveys were published in a preliminary report released in February 1979. Additional data from the 1978 National Jail Census will be published in subsequent reports. Data from the 1978 Survey of Jail Inmates is presented in the report *Profile of Jail Inmates*.

### Organization of this report

This report is designed as a ready reference for data for individual local jails in the U.S. during 1978, specifically the Northeast region. The text begins with an overview of the 1978 National Jail Census and the Survey of Inmates of Local Jails and their historical development.

The general overview is followed by a summary of findings of all local jails in the Nation, highlighting findings for the jails in the Northeast region. The methodology section documents the survey coverage, survey period, data collection, data limitations, and definitions. In addition, information on how to obtain the local jail listing is included.

The final section is comprised of eight tables presenting facility characteristics data for each of the individual jails in the Northeast region:

- Table 1 presents data on the jail's retention authority, the average inmate population, and the number of inmates on February 15, 1978, by detention status;
- Table 2, the design/rated capacity, the number and average floor space of various size confinement units, and age of jail and planned changes by 1982;
- Table 3, the number of jail employees by occupation category and full-time or part-time status;
- Table 4, medical services;
- Table 5, work-release and weekend sentence programs;
- Table 6, the number of inmates held for other authorities;
- Table 7, drug- and alcohol-related services for the 99 jails with an average daily population of 50 or more inmates; and
- Table 8 lists the jails reporting inmate deaths during calendar year 1977, the number of inmates who died, and the cause of death.

Appendix A provides a listing of each of the jails that were closed for renovation on the census reference day (February 15, 1978) that were scheduled to reopen before December 31, 1982. Appendix B contains a listing of each of the jails that were closed on February 15, 1978, that have definite plans to build

or acquire a new jail before December 31, 1982. Appendix C exhibits the two questionnaires used in the 1978 National Jail Census.

### Historical development

#### 1970 Jail Census

The first National Jail Census was conducted in the Spring of 1970 for the Statistics Division (now the Bureau of Justice Statistics) of the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration by the Bureau of the Census. The census identified 4,037 locally administered jails in the United States with a retention authority of 48 hours or more. The jail population on the census reference date (March 15, 1970) was 160,863.

Information was also obtained for all jails on the composition of the inmate population by type of retention, by sex and by whether adult or juvenile; design capacity; retention authority; age of institution; and employment and expenditure data. Additional information for all county jails and jails in cities of 25,000 population or greater was collected on the age of the cells and the presence of recreational, educational, medical, and visiting facilities.

The results of the census were published in *1970 National Jail Census*, which presented summary data for the United States and State-by-State totals and *Local Jails: A Report Presenting Data for Individual County and City Jails from the 1970 National Jail Census\**, which presented inmate, institutional, and expenditure and employment data for each of the jails canvassed.

#### 1972 Jail Census

Another jail census in 1972 was conducted in conjunction with the first survey of jail inmates. The 1972 census obtained additional information on the types and characteristics of jail employees; the availability of medical facilities, recreational facilities, federally funded manpower and training programs, and various counseling and treatment programs; and the extent of participation in work-release, weekend sentence, and pre-trial intervention programs. The facility data from the 1972 census were published in *The Nation's Jails\**, and the inmate data in *Survey of Jail Inmates, 1972: Advance Report\**.

#### 1978 Jail Census

The 1970 and 1972 efforts laid a strong foundation for the 1978 National Jail Census and its companion Survey of Inmates of Local Jails. In addition to updating the basic facility data collected in 1970 and 1972, the 1978 census obtained for the first time detailed data on the confinement units in the Nation's jails. For each jail, information was collected on the number of cells, rooms, dormitories or other units where inmates spend the night, reported by design size (designed for 1, 2, 3 to 4, or 5 or more inmates); the average floor space of one unit of each size; and the total number of inmates assigned to all units of each size on the census day. These data were collected in response to a congressional mandate for an assessment of the Nation's correctional system. Similar data were obtained for State prisons and community facilities during the 1979 Census of State Correctional Facilities, also conducted by the Bureau of the Census for the Bureau of Justice Statistics. Together, these two data sets provide for the first time a comprehensive inventory of confinement space in the Nation's State and local adult correctional facilities.

The 1978 census also obtained considerable information on the availability of medical facilities and services, including admission health screenings, admission physical examinations, medical facilities and medical personnel within the jail, number of inmates receiving prescription medication, and number of inmate deaths during calendar year 1977 by cause of death.

#### Jails in the Northeast

The Northeast region had fewer jails than any other region of the country, constituting only 6 percent of the total number of jails (Table A). Three States in the Northeast region (Connecticut, Rhode Island, and Vermont) have no locally operated jails; an integrated jail-prison system is operated by the State. Unlike jails in the other regions, most jails in the Northeast (over 70 percent) average more than 20 inmates a day.

### Number of jail inmates

Jails in the Northeast held 15 percent of the total jail population on February 15, 1978—the smallest number of the four regions (Table B). As in the other three, the jail population was predominantly adult male (95 percent). The Northeast had proportionately the smallest number of juveniles—less than half of 1 percent—and its juvenile population was more evenly distributed between males and females (55 and 45 percent) than in the other regions.

### Bed capacity

Jails in the Northeast had 13 percent of the total jail bed capacity. The Northeast is the only region that anticipated a net decrease (0.6 percent) in the number of beds between 1978 and 1980 (Table C). This can be attributed to an 868-bed decrease planned for New York State, which offset increases in other States of the region. The decrease was expected to be temporary, however; plans for 1982 showed a net increase in beds of 1 percent for the region as a whole.

### Number of beds by size of unit

Although only 13 percent of the beds in general-purpose confinement units were in the Northeast, this region had 42 percent of all beds in one-inmate units (Table D). It is the only region with a majority of its beds in the one-inmate category—66 percent.

### Jail employment

The Northeast region had 19 percent of the jail employees compared with 15 percent of the jail population (Table E). The ratio of inmates to total employees (full-time and part-time) in this region was 1.8 to 1; the ratio of inmates to custodial personnel (i.e. guards, correctional officers, etc.) was 2.6 to 1—the lowest of all the regions. The Northeast had the highest proportion of its jail employees in the custodial category—68 percent. In contrast with the other regions, only 8 percent of its employees were in the administrative category; this is largely because it was the only region where a majority of the administrators were full-time rather than part-time. The ratio of inmates to service and other professional/technical employees was also lowest in the Northeast.

**Health assessment for jail admissions**

Over 80 percent of the jails in the Northeast reported giving inmates a health interview or screening upon admission (Table F). This was the highest percentage of any region. The Northeast also had the highest percentage of jails administering a physical examination. Over 40 percent of the jails reported giving a medical physical examination upon admission in addition to a screening.

**Inmates held because of overcrowding**

A small portion of the jail population in the Northeast (3 percent) consisted of inmates held because of overcrowding elsewhere (Table G). A majority of these (74 percent) were State prisoners who were either awaiting transfer to a State facility when space became available or were being housed under formal agreements with State authorities.

**Jail census methodology: Sources and limitations of the data**

**Coverage**

The 1978 National Jail Census covered all locally administered jails in the Nation. In this census, a jail was defined as a confinement facility intended for adults but sometimes holding juveniles that holds persons detained pending adjudication and/or persons committed after adjudication, usually for sentences of a year or less. Specifically excluded from the census were drunk tanks, lock-ups, and similar "holding facilities" that do not hold persons after they have been formally charged. State-operated jail systems in Connecticut, Delaware, Hawaii, Rhode Island, and Vermont were also excluded, as were juvenile institutions, community-based prerelease facilities (halfway houses, work-release or study-release facilities, etc.), hospitals for the criminally insane, treatment facilities for drug addicts and/or alcoholics, and jails located in United States territories.

The mailing list used for the census was derived from the National Justice Agency List, which is maintained by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Justice Statistics. This list was reviewed against the following sources:

- The 1978 edition of *American Correctional Association Directory of Juvenile and Adult Correctional Departments, Institutions, Agencies and Paroling Authorities*, and
- The 1978 State Comprehensive Law Enforcement Plans prepared by each State for the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration.

**Survey period**

This report reflects jails operating on February 15, 1978. Information on inmate deaths is for calendar 1977.

**Data collection**

The census was conducted by mail, with an initial mailout of 3,761 questionnaires in February 1978. (The final universe of 3,493 was reached after eliminating facilities that were not in operation on the census reference day or did not meet the criteria for a jail.) Two survey questionnaires were used—a CJ-3 form sent to 651 jails with an average daily inmate population of 50 or more and a CJ-4 form sent to 3,110 jails with an average daily inmate population of less than 50. (The average daily population figure was based on the 1977 Directory Survey of Law Enforcement Agencies and Jails). Nonrespondent jails were sent second mail requests and then mailgrams. Telephone contact was made if necessary. A response rate of 99 percent was achieved. The mail questionnaires used in the census are exhibited in the appendix.

Telephone followup procedures were also used to clarify inadequate and inconsistent census returns.

**Limitations**

Because a complete census was conducted of all local jails meeting the selection criteria, the data are not subject to sampling error. The data are subject to response error, however. Such error was kept to a minimum through quality control checks. In this regard, it should be noted that for any items on the census questionnaire unobtainable from available records, reasonable estimates were requested.

The data reported in this publication do not reflect changes that have taken place since February 1978.

All data reflect State-by-State variation in legal codes and procedures governing a jail's retention authority and facility-by-facility variation in inmate classification and housing practices. Thus caution is required when making comparisons.

**Definitions**

**Local jail.** A confinement facility administered by a unit of local government (county or city) intended for adults but sometimes holding juveniles that holds persons detained pending adjudication and/or persons committed after adjudication, usually for sentences of a year or less. Temporary holding facilities ("lock-ups") that do not hold persons after they have been formally charged in court (usually within 48 hours of arrest) are excluded.

**Adult.** A person who is within the original jurisdiction of a criminal, rather than a juvenile, court because his or her age at the time of an alleged criminal act was above a statutorily specified limit.

**Juvenile.** A person subject to the exercise of juvenile court jurisdiction for purposes of adjudication and treatment based on age and offense limitations as defined by State law. Persons above the statutory age limit for juveniles who are being held under special "youth statutes," e.g., "youthful offenders" in California, "adolescents" or "minors" in New York, etc. are classified as adults.

**Confinement unit.** Any cell, room, dormitory, or other unit where inmates spend the night. Confinement units are further categorized as:

- **General purpose units.** Units intended to house the general inmate population.

- **Special purpose units.** Units intended to meet specialized housing needs, e.g., an infirmary, trustee cells, isolation cells, etc. Special purpose units can include both units with beds and those without beds, e.g., "drunk tanks," "bull-pens," etc.

**Bed capacity.** The number of beds in a jail calculated by multiplying the number of confinement units of each design size (e.g., 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 or more persons) by its design size and summing the results for all size categories. Includes beds in general purpose units and special purpose units with beds.

**Jail employees.** All payroll and nonpayroll personnel who work at a jail full-time or part-time.

- **Full-time personnel.** Personnel who work full-time at the jail.

- **Part-time personnel.** Personnel who work part-time at the jail including full-time employees who perform other duties in addition to those at the jail. Jail employees are further categorized as:

- **Administrative.** Chief jailer (or sheriff or chief of police), deputies, and/or assistants who work at the jail in an administrative capacity.

- **Custodial officers.** Guards, jailers, etc. who supervise the inmate population.

- **Clerical and maintenance personnel.** Typists, secretaries, janitors, cooks, ground-keepers, etc.

- **Service personnel.** Teachers, social workers, counselors, psychologists, doctors, and other medical personnel, etc. who provide professional services to the inmates.

- **Other.** Personnel who can not be classified as one of the above.

- **Health interview/screening.** An initial assessment of an inmate's health from observation and medically related questions, made at the time of admission.

- **Medical physical examination.** A health assessment based on medical tests such as

taking blood pressure, blood or urine samples, chest x-ray, eye and ear examination, etc.
