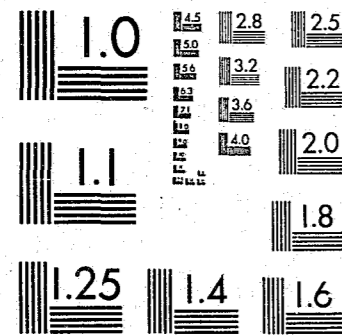

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APPENDIX D: FREQUENCIES AND UNIVARIATE STATISTICS FOR PART ONE OF THE DATASET

DATA COLLECTION DESCRIPTION

In 1983 the National Prisoners Statistics program on admissions and releases (NPS) and the Uniform Parole Reports (UPR) were combined into one reporting system, the National Corrections Reporting Program (NCRP). The NCRP evolved from the need to improve and consolidate data on corrections at the national-level. Its objective is to provide a consistent and comprehensive description of prisoners entering and leaving the custody or supervision of state and federal authorities.

The NCRP is sponsored by the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS), the U.S. Department of Justice. The United States Bureau of the Census acts as the data collection agent. Thirty-two states reported data in 1983. A list of these states can be found in Appendix A on page 66.

The NCRP is a calendar year report covering the dates January 1, 1983 through December 31, 1983 except for the states Kentucky, Maine, Missouri, and New Hampshire which reported data for only half the year. Data collection began in June 1983 and was completed a year later. Data refer only to these prisoners admitted to prison, released from prison, or released from parole in 1983. The data were processed and edited by the Bureau of the Census.

DATA COLLECTION PROCEDURES

Thirteen states supplied data manually, by completing NCRP forms on all prisoner movements. All forms were sent to the Census Bureau's data processing center in Jeffersonville, Indiana, where the data were coded, keyed and edited. Editing procedures were employed to ensure that the information provided by each of these manual states met NCRP guidelines.

Nineteen states supplied data on magnetic tape. These data were recoded and reformatted to a standard NCRP format by the Bureau of the Census. These data were merged with the data from the manual reporting states and then checked for duplicate movements, inconsistencies and invalid codes. Additional variables were also calculated and added to the data set. Further details on the editing procedures and the specially calculated variables are reported in Appendix B.

CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

The NCRP applied uniform measurement rules to the data from the states, using the following concepts and definitions:

Prison

A prison was defined as a state or federal correctional facility having custodial authority over persons sentenced to confinement.

Calendar Year Reporting

NCRP collected data for the total number of admissions to prisons, releases from prison and releases from parole for the dates January 1, 1983 through December 31, 1983. Data were not collected on a fiscal year basis. Records were rejected on individuals if the year of prison admission, prison release or parole release was not reported.

Custody Criteria for Prison Admissions and Releases

The NCRP collected data on all prisoners admitted or released while under the physical custody of state correctional authorities. The NCRP data included prisoners under the immediate control of state authorities, regardless of the jurisdiction in which the prisoners were originally sentenced.

Starting in 1983, all sentenced inmates were counted, including those with sentences of a year or less. Prisoners sentenced to a state prison, but admitted to or released from the custody of a local jail, were also included in the NCRP.

Jurisdiction Criteria for Parole Releases

Parole release information was reported for those offenders under the jurisdiction of the paroling authority. Jurisdiction was determined by the legal authority controlling the offender's release from parole supervision, rather than by the authority assuming physical custody of the offender. Parole jurisdiction was defined, for NCRP purposes, as that agency having primary responsibility for supervising an offender who was conditionally released from prison after having served a portion of the original sentence. The paroling agency has jurisdiction over an offender if it has the legal power to revoke the parole or to decide when parole supervision is to be terminated.

Prisoner Movements

The NCRP included prisoner movements that increased or decreased the custody counts of each reporting state. Additions to the custody count, such as the arrival of new inmates, the return to prison of parole violators, and transfers from other jurisdictions, were classified as admission movements. Removals from custody, such as the release of those completing their sentences, the release to parole and death, were considered release movements.

Multiple admissions or releases per person during the year were recorded as separate movements.

Parole and Mandatory Parole Release

Parole signifies the status of an offender who is conditionally released from prison to community supervision. An offender is required to observe the conditions of parole and is under the supervision of a parole agency. Parole differs from probation: unlike parole, probation is determined by judicial authority and is usually an alternative to confinement. Offenders conditionally released from prison to parole are classified in the NCRP as parole admissions movements.

The NCRP also includes mandatory parole release, i.e., those persons released from prison to parole supervision by virtue of statutes that determine the length of time prisoners are incarcerated. Unlike other prisoners released to parole, these prisoners were not released as a result of a parole board decision.

Offenders released from the jurisdiction of a parole authority were classified as parole release movements. Types of release movements included completion of parole, revocation, absconding, transfer and death.

FILE STRUCTURE

NATIONAL CORRECTIONS REPORTING PROGRAM, 1983: [UNITED STATES] is available from the ICPSR in two formats: card image and OSIRIS. The card image file contains several decks per case in a format based on 80 column punched cards. The data are sorted by case with all decks for a case together in ascending order.

The OSIRIS dictionary gives the format and other information for each variable in the OSIRIS data file. The dictionary or dictionary-codebook file is used in conjunction with the OSIRIS software package. The OSIRIS data file is constructed with a single logical record for each case. There are four parts in the NATIONAL CORRECTIONS REPORTING PROGRAM, 1983: [UNITED STATES]. Each part consists of 95 variables. Part 1, Prison Admissions, Prison Release, and Parole Release data, consists of 326,606 cases. Part 2, Prison Admissions data, consists of 139,649 cases. Part 3, Prison Release data, contains 130,531 cases, and Part 4, Parole Release data, contains 56,426 cases.

The OSIRIS data file can be accessed directly through software packages or programs which do not use the OSIRIS dictionary by specifying the tape locations of the desired variables. These tape locations are given in the OSIRIS dictionary-codebook.

CODEBOOK INFORMATION

The example below is a reproduction of information appearing in the machine-readable codebook for a typical variable. The numbers in brackets do not appear but are references to the descriptions which follow this example.

 [1] Indicates the variable and reference numbers. A variable number and a reference number are assigned to each variable in the data collection. In the present codebook which documents the archived data collection these numbers are identical. Should the data be subsetted or rearranged by an OSIRIS program (e.g., MMP to intersperse data from another source, or TCOT to produce an analysis deck), the variable numbers would change to reflect the order of the new data collection, while the reference number would remain unchanged to reflect the variable number in the codebook describing the archived data collection.

- [2] Indicates the abbreviated variable name (maximum of 24 characters) used in the OSIRIS system to identify the variable for the user. An expanded version of the variable name can be found in the variable description list.
- [3] Indicates the code values of missing data. In this example, code values equal to 95 or greater than or equal to 98 are missing data (MD=95 OR GE 98). Alternative statements for other variables are "MD=0," "MD GE 9," or "NO MISSING DATA CODES." Some analysis software packages (including the OSIRIS software package) require that certain types of data which the user desires to be excluded from analysis be designated as "MISSING DATA," e.g., inappropriate, unascertained, unascertainable, or ambiguous data categories. Although these codes are defined as missing data categories, this does not mean that the user should not or cannot use them in a substantive role if so desired.
- [4] Indicates the starting location and width of this variable when the data are stored on a magnetic tape in the OSIRIS format. If the variable is of a multiple-response type, the width referenced is that of a single response. In this example the variable named "Item 10 JURISD ON ADMIS DATE" is 02 columns wide and is located in the 49th column within the record.
- [5] Indicates the location by deck and column(s) of this variable when the data are stored on cards or in card-image format (80-column format)
- [6] A variable containing data with implied decimals is denoted by the message "IMP DEC= dd," where dd is the number of decimal places implied in the variable.
- [7] This is the full text (question) supplied by the investigator to describe the variable. The question text and the numbers and letters that may appear at the beginning reflect the original wording of the questionnaire item.
- [8] Indicates an additional comment or explanation appended to the variable description.

- [9] A variable which has a footnote associated with it is denoted by the message, "SEE NOTE(S) 2" where 2 is the number of the footnote referenced.
- [10] "Actual number is coded" would appear in the codebook if the variable was continuous. In this example, the variable is categorical.
- [11] Indicates the code values occurring in the data for this variable.
- [12] Indicates the textual definitions of the codes. Abbreviations commonly used in the code definitions are "DK" (Do Not Know), "NA" (Not Ascertained), and "INAP" (Inappropriate).

ICPSR PROCESSING INFORMATION

The data collection was processed according to the standard ICPSR processing procedures. The data were checked for illegal or inconsistent code values which, when found, were recoded to OSIRIS missing data values. No consistency checks were performed. Statements bracketed in "[" and "]" signs in the body of the codebook were added by the processors for explanatory purposes.

National Corrections Reporting Program, 1983: [United States]

The following data miscodes and notes should be taken into consideration when using these data.

Errors:

1. V17, admission type: Five states were unable to report data on admission type; however, all cases in these states were incorrectly coded 10 (from court) rather than 99 (unknown). These states were Alabama, Maryland, Mississippi, Nebraska, and North Carolina.
2. V53 and V54, prior jail and prison time: Zeroes (no prior time) were improperly coded as missing data (88888 or 99998).
3. V83, total prior time: 88888 (inappropriate) should be 99998 (calculation could not be performed).
4. V86, total time served: Calculations were incorrectly generated for parole violators (from V17) whose data on prior time in prison were invalid. For these cases, total time served (V86) and all calculated variables based on total time served (V87, V88, V94, and V95) should have been coded as missing (99998 or 9998).
5. V86, total time served: Calculations were improperly performed on cases with valid data on total prior time (V83) but with invalid data on current time served (V85). These cases should be coded as missing (99998).
6. Release data should not be tabulated separately for Maryland. The release data exclude the records of prisoners who were admitted and released during the year. In checking the data with NCRP respondents, we have found that approximately 1,158 release records were excluded in Maryland.
7. Admission data in Montana and Oregon exclude prisoners who were admitted and released during 1983. Data on these prisoners in these states may be obtained from the admission variables on the release records of those prisoners with admission dates in 1983. If release records are used to produce admission records, a check for duplicate records should be made.

Additional data notes:

1. Data on education (V13) in Alabama are not the highest grade completed; they are a level of competence, which was determined by corectional officials at the time of admission.
2. Data on sentence length (V56 and V84) in South Dakota should be treated as missing (99999).
3. Data on Hispanic origin and prior felony incarceration were only partially reported in some states. In these states, the data were reported only for prisoners who were Hispanic or had been incarcerated for a felony; other prisoners were coded as missing data.
4. Manual reporting states provided data for only part of the year in 1983.

OFFENSE CODES

The offense codes are three digit codes which consist of two parts: one which indicates the general category of offense and the other which indicates the specific nature of the offense. An example of this coding scheme is the murder offenses. There are three codes which indicate a murder, 010, 011, and 012. The "01" segment of the code indicates the offense in this instance has been a murder. The remaining digit (0, 1, or 2) provides more information about the offense. A zero is used for non-differentiated offenses; a one indicates that it was attempted; a two indicates that the offense was part of a conspiracy. This coding scheme is used for the remaining offenses which are listed below.

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Introduction

The National Corrections Reporting Program (NCRP) evolved from a basic need to improve and consolidate corrections reporting at the national level. The NCRP is under the sponsorship of the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS), with the Bureau of the Census acting as the data collection agent. In 1983, the NPS Admissions and Releases Program and UPR combined under one reporting system, the NCRP. The NCRP represents a collaborative effort by the BJS and Bureau of the Census to link prison population movement data (NPS) to parole population information (UPR). The anticipated result is a more consistent and comprehensive description of convicted persons as they enter and leave correctional custody and supervision.

The 1983 NCRP, which is a calendar year report, was fielded in June of 1983 with data collection ending a year later. There were 31 states that participated in 1983; 13 states reported manually and 18 reported on ADP tape. The data was processed and edited by the Bureau of the Census and a public use tape was sent to the University of Michigan Archives in March, 1985.

This documentation contains a copy of the 1983 User's Guide, the clerical edit, the computer processing specifications, and state-specific footnotes. The User's Guide was compiled to introduce the program to all potential respondents as well as to assist each state in their participation. The decision to include the User's Guide in this survey documentation came out of both the need to use it as an explanatory tool, and to allow future data users an inside look at what each state used to formulate and submit their data. The User's Guide has five (5) chapters with seven (7) appendices. The chapters were structured to walk each respondent through all phases of the NCRP and the appendices were structured to give detailed information concerning NCRP offense codes, preferred record layouts, etc.

The clerical edit was used by the Census Bureau's data processing center in Jeffersonville, Indiana. All manual reporters were instructed to send their completed NCRP forms to Jeffersonville so as to edit, code, and key all data for transmittal to Washington, D.C. This editing and coding procedure was needed to ensure that the information provided on each questionnaire adhered to NCRP guidelines and data requirements.

The computer processing specifications illustrate how all data, both manual and automated, were processed and edited. The data submitted on ADP tapes were first reformatted and recoded into a standard NCRP format. At that time, all manual and ADP data were merged in order to go through a preedit and a range/consistency check. These specifications provide details on how data inconsistencies were resolved and documented. In addition, there is a description of specific variables which were calculated and added to each record subsequent to the edit.

Lastly, the footnotes included in this documentation highlight data variations and definitional differences among the states. They are structured to move from general or overall data problems to item-specific data problems. The BJS will use these footnotes to explain any idiosyncracies in a states data.

It is hoped that this survey documentation will enable each data user to accurately utilize the NCRP in order to understand and view prison admissions, prison releases, and parole releases throughout the country.

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CHAPTER 1. INTRODUCTION

This USER'S GUIDE presents the new National Corrections Reporting Program (NCRP) incorporating a Prisoner Admission Report (Form NCRP-1A), a Prisoner Release Report (Form NCRP-1B), and a Parole Release Report (Form NCRP-1C) into a single reporting system. Its purpose is to provide each respondent with a brief outline of basic concepts, as well as detailed definitions and instructions for the data elements to be reported. This manual should be utilized both as a training guide and a reference document. In order to meet the needs of all respondents, separate instructions are included for manual and ADP reporters, and an additional chapter is devoted exclusively to ADP operations. NCRP staff will update this USER'S GUIDE periodically in order to respond to feedback, make enhancements, and expand data coverage.

The NCRP has evolved from a basic need to improve and consolidate corrections reporting at the national level as well as to reduce the reporting burden for the states. Prior to the formation of the NCRP in 1983, the National Prisoner Statistics Admissions and Releases Program and the Uniform Parole Reports were separate data collection efforts under the sponsorship of the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS).

NATIONAL PRISONER STATISTICS

The National Prisoner Statistics (NPS) program was established in 1926 by the Bureau of the Census in response to a congressional mandate to compile national information on the populations confined in correctional institutions. This program described the characteristics and counts of prison inmates during each calendar year. Since its initiation, responsibility for this program has shifted among several agencies--in 1950 it was transferred to the Federal Bureau of Prisons and to the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration in 1971. Since 1972, the Bureau of the Census, under agreement with the Department of Justice, has had responsibility for compiling the statistical data. Census staff negotiates directly with each state, assembles and edits the data, and prepares the data for analysis and publication.

UNIFORM PAROLE REPORTS

In 1966 the National Council on Crime and Delinquency (NCCD), with funds from the National Institute of Mental Health, implemented the Uniform Parole Reports (UPR) as an experimental project. At that time, UPR was limited to gathering parole outcome data from selected state parole boards but was eventually expanded into an ongoing program collecting statistics which describe parole populations nationwide. Funding by the National Criminal Justice Information and Statistics Service (renamed the BJS in 1980) has been in effect since 1973. Since 1983, the Bureau of the Census has had responsibility for collecting parole data.

NATIONAL CORRECTIONS REPORTING PROGRAM

In 1983, the NPS Admissions and Release Program and UPR combined under one reporting system, the NCRP. The three forms presented in this manual represent a collaborative effort by the BJS, the Bureau of the Census, and NCCD to link prison population movement data (NPS) to parole population information (UPR) toward the goal of an integrated "National Corrections Reporting Program". The anticipated result is a more consistent and comprehensive description of convicted persons as they enter and leave correctional custody and supervision.

The materials included in this guide represent the product of four regional conferences held in the fall of 1982, in which all states were invited to participate. The conferences served as a forum for reactions to the proposed reporting forms which combined prison admission, prison release, and parole release data elements. The issues and recommendations raised during these sessions were all considered during the final design stages of NCRP. The NCRP forms and this USER'S GUIDE represent the integration of the various comments received from the states.

CHAPTER 2. BASIC NCRP CONCEPTS

THE NEED FOR STANDARDIZED MEASURES ACROSS STATES

The concepts and definitions utilized in NCRP are designed to apply uniform measurement rules across states. That is, though consistency is sought, of analytic importance is the need to recognize and identify differences from one state to another. These definitions reflect the collective experience of gathering data over a number of years and represent the results of cooperative state and federal efforts to consider the fundamental measurement goals for corrections.

The existence of a national data base serves both needs--providing an overall description of persons under correctional supervision, and assuring the availability of pertinent corrections data.

If, after reviewing any questionnaire items on the supporting document, your state is clearly unable to conform, please inform Census or NCCD and document the problem to assure the proper annotation of your state's data.

NCRP TERMS

The following is a list of basic NCRP terms which you should use when reporting data. These are critical elements in the overall goal of establishing an integrated uniform reporting system, and we encourage you to familiarize yourself with these concepts.

Calendar Year Reporting

NCRP collects data for the total number of admissions to prison, releases from prison, and releases from parole for each calendar year. An admission to or release from prison, or release from parole must occur during the calendar year for which data are being collected for each offender reported to NCRP. NCRP does not collect data on a fiscal year basis.

Custody Criteria for Prison Admissions and Releases

Beginning in 1983, the NCRP will be collecting data on all sentenced persons admitted or released while under the physical custody of a state prison system. The NPS program formerly counted populations for which a correctional agency had legal responsibility (jurisdiction), whereas the new NCRP will count populations under immediate control (persons in physical custody regardless of jurisdiction.)

In addition, include that portion of the prison population housed in or remanded to local jails. Thus, a prisoner sentenced to a term of state prison confinement but remanded to a local jail (due to overcrowding, for example) to serve that sentence would be a reportable admission. Similarly, a person released from a local jail while serving a state prison sentence would be a reportable release.

Jurisdiction Criteria for Parole Releases

Parole release information should be reported for those offenders under the jurisdiction of the paroling authority. Jurisdiction is not determined by an offender's physical location; it is determined by the legal authority controlling his release from parole supervision. For NCRP purposes, parole jurisdiction should be interpreted as that agency having primary responsibility for supervising an offender while on conditional release after serving a portion of that sentence in confinement. As a working concept, your state paroling authority has jurisdiction over an offender if it retains the legal power to revoke the offender's parole or to decide when parole supervision is to be terminated.

Movement

Movements are additions to and subtractions from a custody count of your state's prison system. Additions to custody, i.e., the arrival of new inmates, violators returned, etc., increase the count and are called prisoner admission movements. Removals from custody, i.e., paroles, deaths, etc., decrease the count and are called prisoner release movements.

Parole and Mandatory Parole Release

Offenders conditionally released from prison to the jurisdiction of a parole authority comprise parole admission movements. Offenders released from the jurisdiction of a parole authority decrease their count and constitute parole release movements. Parole signifies the status of an offender conditionally released from a prison to community supervision other than probation. The offender is required to observe conditions of parole, and is placed under the supervision of a parole agency. Parole differs from probation in that parole status is determined by an executive authority and follows a period of confinement, while probation status is usually determined by judicial authority and is usually an alternative to confinement. Mandatory parole releases are those persons released from prison to supervision without a discretionary decision by the parole authority. Rather, they are released by virtue of a statute which determines the length of time they are to be incarcerated.

Sentenced Inmates

For purposes of insuring comparability, reporting should be limited to sentenced persons admitted to or released from prison or parole. In past years, the NPS program has limited the admission and release populations to those inmates with a maximum sentence greater than one year. Starting in 1983, report data on all sentenced inmates admitted to or released from the custody of state or federal prison systems regardless of length of sentence.

State Prison

A prison can be defined as a state or federal correctional facility having custodial authority over persons sentenced to confinement. A state prison system is an administrative entity that acquires physical custody of offenders admitted to prisons.

CHAPTER 3. REPORTING PROCEDURES

The Bureau of the Census, Demographic Surveys Division, collects prisoner admission and release data; similarly, the Bureau of the Census, Governments Division, collects parole release data. The BJS provides funding and oversight of the overall statistical collection and reporting programs for corrections. The collaborative efforts of Census and BJS to integrate these programs have led to procedural changes in the collection of data.

Following is a basic outline depicting the flow of operations and delineating specific reporting procedures for manual and ADP respondents.

MANUAL RESPONDENTS

CATEGORIES OF OFFENDERS TO REPORT - 1983

The NCRP forms are designed to reduce the reporting burden of our manual respondents. Since 1983, the gathering of NCRP data has been with a three-part packet printed on "no carbon required" (NCR) paper (refer to Appendix A, Sample Questionnaire). Each packet contains a Prisoner Admission Report (NCRP-1A), a Prisoner Release Report (NCRP-1B), and a Parole Release Report (NCRP-1C). By using NCR paper, reporting burdens should decrease for manual respondents. For example, once an inmate's date of birth is filled in on a Prisoner Admission Report (NCRP-1A), the date will automatically be recorded on the Prisoner Release Report (NCRP-1B) and the Parole Release Report (NCRP-1C). Thus, each form builds on the information acquired in a cumulative fashion.

There are a few procedures that should be adhered to carefully if the new forms are to be utilized correctly:

- All responses (numbers, words, or "X's" in boxes) should be recorded legibly and firmly in order to imprint on the other two forms clearly and accurately. Use of ball point pen is preferable.
- Submit forms with all information as complete as possible. If, for any reason, information is not available at the time of admission and is available at the time of release please fill in the relevant items. While this system was designed to reduce the reporting burden with respect to duplicate information, we still are interested in receiving the most complete information possible when each movement (admission to prison, release from prison, or release from parole) occurs.

Following is an outline of items unique to each form. All completed forms should be sent to Census/Jeffersonville, Indiana.

The integrated system was fully operational in 1983. Both admissions to prison and releases from prison will have occurred for many offenders prior to the start-up date and the corresponding NCRP forms will not have been filled in. There are five unique categories of offenders to report for 1983.

PRISON ADMISSIONS

1. Offenders admitted to prison in 1983

For all offenders admitted to prison in 1983, Items 1 through 17 of Form NCRP-1A should be filled in. Mail the completed Form NCRP-1A to Jeffersonville, Indiana, and store the remaining Forms NCRP-1B and NCRP-1C intact in the inmate's folder. These forms should be retained for later completion at the time of release.

PRISON RELEASES

2. Offenders admitted to prison in 1983, and released from prison in 1983

For all offenders admitted to prison in 1983, Items 1 through 17 of Form NCRP-1A should have been filled in at admission. For those offenders also released in 1983, fill Items 18 through 25 of Form NCRP-1B and mail the report to Jeffersonville, Indiana. If Item 25 on Form NCRP-1B is a conditional release (values 1 through 4), mail the third report, Form NCRP-1C, to your state's parole authority. If Item 25 on Form NCRP-1B is any release other than conditional (values 5 through 17), discard Form NCRP-1C.

3. Offenders released from prison in 1983, but admitted to prison prior to 1983

For those offenders who are released from prison in 1983, but who were admitted to prison prior to 1983, Form NCRP-1A will be blank and should be discarded. Complete Items 1 through 25 of Form NCRP-1B, and mail it to Jeffersonville, Indiana. If Item 25 on Form NCRP-1B is a conditional release (values 1 through 4) mail the third report, Form NCRP-1C, to your state's parole authority. If Item 25 on Form NCRP-1B is any release other than conditional (value 5 through 17), discard Form NCRP-1C.

PAROLE RELEASES

4. Offenders released from parole in 1983, and released from prison in 1983

For those offenders who were released from prison to parole in 1983 Form NCRP-1B should have been completed and mailed to Jeffersonville, Indiana. Form NCRP-1C should then be forwarded to the state's parole authority for completion. However, most information (Items 1-25) should already be filled out. At the time of release from parole, Items 26, 27, and 28 should be completed and the form mailed to Jeffersonville, Indiana.

5. Offenders released from parole in 1983, but released from prison prior to 1983

For those offenders who are released from parole in 1983, but who were released from prison to parole prior to 1983, a Parole Release Report (Form NCRP-1C) will need to be filled out in its entirety. Single forms will be distributed for these offenders and all Items (1 through 28) should be completed and mailed to Jeffersonville, Indiana.

NOTE: If you have a parole release which results in a return to prison, both a Parole Release Report (Form NCRP-1C) and a new Prisoner Admission Report (Form NCRP-1A) must be completed. The admission information on Form NCRP-1C should reflect the original sentence that led to the parole release being reported.

DO NOT report on the parole release form any new admission information.

SCHEDULE

Early in January of a reporting year, blank questionnaires along with a letter will be mailed out to all manual respondents requesting that year's data. Submission of data to the NCRP should occur on a flow basis as soon as possible after receipt of the questionnaires. If you prefer to submit data on a monthly or quarterly basis, this type of reporting schedule is also acceptable. Close-out for receipt of 1983 data is March 31, 1984.

TO WHOM TO DIRECT QUESTIONS

NCRP staff are anxious to resolve reporting difficulties as quickly and efficiently as possible. Any problems with prisoner admission and release reports may be addressed to the Census staff, Demographic Surveys Division, (301-763-2061). Any questions regarding parole reports should be directed to the Census staff, Governments Division, (301-763-7789).

Upon request by a state, Census staff will visit a respondent state to assist them during implementation of NCRP, to resolve reporting difficulties, or to aid efforts to convert to ADP.

In addition, Census staff will regularly consult with a state contact who coordinates data gathering operations for all manual reporting states. For specific prisoner admission, prisoner release, and parole release reporting problems not covered in this chapter, contact your state's coordinator. Appendix B contains the most recent list of the names, addresses, and phone numbers of state coordinators for prison and parole data.

Prisoner Admission Reports (Form NCRP-1A), Prisoner Release Reports (Form NCRP-1B), and Parole Release Reports (Form NCRP-1C) should be mailed directly to:

Pre-addressed franked envelopes will be provided for you to mail completed Forms NCRP-1A, NCRP-1B, and NCRP-1C to the Census data collection center. You will also be provided franked address labels to affix to boxes for larger mail-ins.

ADP RESPONDENTS

CATEGORIES OF OFFENDERS TO REPORT - 1984

ADP respondents are requested to report data for three unique movement groups.

1. Prison admissions

Data should be reported for all offenders admitted to prison during 1984. The record layout for the Prisoner Admission Report is provided in Appendix C.

2. Prison releases

Data should be reported for all offenders released from prison during 1984. The record layout for the Prisoner Release Report is provided in Appendix C.

3. Parole releases

Data should be reported for all offenders released from parole during 1984. The record layout for the Parole Release Report is provided in Appendix C.

SCHEDULE

In December of each reporting year, a letter will be mailed out to all ADP respondents requesting submission of that year's NCRP data. Files (tapes, cards, disk) should be mailed no later than March 31 following the close of each reporting year. For example, all movements for calendar year 1984 should be reported in one submission by March 31, 1985. In order to meet this deadline, it is critical that the extraction programs to strip off NCRP data from your state's files be written and tested well in advance.

TO WHOM TO DIRECT QUESTIONS

During the process of converting to the NCRP reporting system, some states may need assistance in defining variables and clarifying procedural issues. We will help resolve any reporting difficulties as efficiently as possible and lend assistance where needed. Any problems related to prisoner admission or prisoner release reports should be addressed to Census, Demographic Surveys Division, and any questions regarding parole release reports should be directed to Census, Governments Division.

We encourage continual communication throughout all stages of your efforts to implement the NCRP. Officials in each state have been contacted, and permission to gather data has been obtained by Census. Working level state contacts who coordinate the gathering of prisoner admission, prisoner release, and parole release data have also been established. A list of respondents for prison and parole data is provided in Appendix B.

TO WHOM TO REPORT

Three data files should be prepared for submission: 1) a file of prisoner admission records; 2) a file of prisoner release records; and 3) a file of parole release records. Details of these file structures and data tape specifications are included in Chapter 5 of this USER'S GUIDE; Appendix C contains preferred record layouts. States may submit multiple tapes for each data set or submit a single tape containing prison admissions and releases.

If your state decides to submit a single tape containing prisoner admission records and prisoner release records, files and documentation should be mailed directly to the Census Bureau, Demographic Surveys Division.

Parole release data should be submitted on a separate tape and mailed directly to Census Bureau, Governments Division.

Files may be mailed COD or transmitted via United Parcel Service. Pre-addressed franked labels will also be provided.

CHAPTER 4. PRISONER ADMISSION, PRISONER RELEASE, AND PAROLE RELEASE ITEMS

This chapter defines each item to be reported in the new NCRP questionnaire. Examples and descriptions are provided.

Please become familiar with the National Corrections Reporting Program definitions. An accurate corrections picture depends upon each state reporting each item correctly. Always be sure to point out and describe how your data differ from our definitions. We will be able to assist you in resolving the discrepancy or documenting the difference.

Items 1-17 are included on Forms NCRP-1A, NCRP-1B, and NCRP-1C.

ITEM 1. COUNTY IN WHICH SENTENCE WAS IMPOSED

1. County in which sentence was imposed				

Definition:

The county in which the court imposing the current sentence is located. If there are multiple counties of commitment, enter the ONE which corresponds with the offense for which the person received the longest maximum sentence.

For independent cities, i.e., cities that are not part of a county, indicate the city name and code. Refer to Appendix D, County Codes, for the 5-digit code identifying the county or independent city in which the court imposing the current sentence is located.

Manual Instructions:

Appendix D contains the county and independent city codes in alphabetical order by county name for each state. Enter this 5-digit code in the appropriate boxes on the questionnaire.

ADP Instructions:

Refer to Appendix D, County Codes, for the 5-digit code identifying the county or independent city in which the court imposing the current sentence is located. Enter the 5-digit county code in fields 1-5.

ITEM 2a. INMATE IDENTIFICATION NUMBER

2. Inmate identification											
a. ID number

Definition:

One number (12 digits or fewer) which clearly identifies a single offender. This is the number that enables you to locate individual records and allows us to identify problem and duplicate records.

Do not use sequence numbers for true identification numbers unless you can locate each inmate by the sequence number and use that same sequence number each time the inmate moves.

NOTE: The Bureau of the Census is mandated by law (Title 42, U.S. Code, Section 3789g to hold confidential the identity of any offender reported in this program. Identification numbers are used solely to identify problem records and remove duplicate records from the file.

Manual Instructions:

Enter the inmate's identification number (not to exceed 12 digits) in the appropriate boxes.

ADP Instructions:

Record the inmate's identification number in fields 6-17. If the identification number is less than 12 characters, right-justify the number and blank-fill unused positions.

ITEM 2b. INMATE NAME

Definition:

The last name, the first initial, and middle initial of the inmate.

NOTE: The Bureau of the Census is mandated by law (Title 42, U.S. Code, Section 3789g) to hold confidential the identity of any offender reported in this program. Inmate names will only be used to identify records of inmates entering parole. If state privacy or confidentiality requirements prevent the use of the inmate name, leave this item blank.

Manual Instructions:

Enter the inmate's last name, the first initial, and middle initial on the line provided.

ADP Instructions:

This field does not appear on ADP records.

ITEM 3. DATE OF BIRTH

Definition:

Self-explanatory

Manual Instructions:

Enter the month (January = 01, February = 02, etc.), day (01-31), and last two digits of the year in the appropriate boxes. If inmate was born before the year 1901, enter "00" in the boxes for year.

ADP Instructions:

Record the month of birth (January = 01, February = 02, etc.) in fields 18-19, the day of birth (01-31) in fields 20-21, and the last two digits of the year of birth in fields 22-23. If the inmate was born before the year 1901, enter "00" in fields 22-23. If the month, day, or year of birth are unknown, record a 99 in the respective fields.

EXAMPLES:

- a) If a person was born May 26, 1942, the date of birth would be recorded as:

Mark the ONE most appropriate category which corresponds to the highest grade completed by the offender. DO NOT include any educational work completed during incarceration on the current sentence.

ADP Instructions:

Enter in fields 27-28 the 2-digit designation for highest grade completed prior to admission.

ITEM 8. DATE OF ADMISSION TO PRISON

The most recent date for which the inmate was admitted into the custody of the state prison system on the current sentence.

Do not enter sentencing date as date of admission unless correctional custody began immediately upon sentencing. Report prior jail time or prior prison time for readmissions in Items 11 and 12.

NOTE: Prison Overcrowding and Use of Local Jails

Complete a Prisoner Admission Report for state prisoners housed in local jails to ease prison overcrowding. Admission date is the date on which the custody begins. Admission date should NEVER be prior to sentencing date. If you report prisoners held in local jails in your state as admissions, do not later report their transfers from jail to prison as a new admission.

Manual Instructions:

Enter the month (January = 01, February = 02, etc.), day (01-31), and last two digits of the year in the appropriate boxes.

ADP Instructions:

Record the month of admission (January = 01, February = 02, etc.) in fields 29-30, the day of admission (01-31) in fields 31-32, and the last two digits of the year of admission in fields 33-34. If the month, day, or year of admission are unknown, record a 99 in the respective fields.

EXAMPLES:

- a) A person held in a local jail is sentenced on April 3, 1983. Due to prison overcrowding, he begins serving his sentence in the local jail immediately after sentencing. A Prisoner Admission Report is filed and "Date of admission to prison" is recorded as:

b) A prisoner held in a local jail is sentenced on April 3, 1983. Due to prison overcrowding, he begins serving his sentence in the local jail immediately after sentencing. A Prisoner Admission Report is filed with April 3, 1983 as the date of admission. He is transferred and physically enters prison on October 28, 1983. No report of any kind is filed in October.

c) A person was admitted originally on June 11, 1979. He was released on parole in 1983 and is being readmitted August 7, 1983 as the result of a parole revocation. "Date of admission to prison" is recorded as:

Definition:

Reason an offender most recently entered into the physical custody of a correctional facility.

1. Court commitment:

The entry into prison of a person who is being admitted on one or more new sentences to confinement and is not being readmitted on any previous sentences still in effect.

NOTE: Probation, Shock Probation, Split Sentences, 120-Day Cases

Include as a court commitment all persons who have violated probation and are being admitted to prison for the first time in relation to a given conviction. Also include as a court commitment those inmates sentenced to prison for brief periods of time, usually 90-180 days, after which they are either released to probation or remain in prison. If, at the end of the "shock" period, the court commits the offender to prison to continue serving sentence, do not report him again as an admission.

Exclude from the court commitment category all revocations from parole or other conditional release with or without a new sentence for a new offense, all transfers unless the inmate is beginning to serve time on a new sentence, and all returns from escape or unauthorized departures.

If the offender is received from court and at the time of admission it is known that the offender is also on parole or mandatory parole release, but a formal revocation has not occurred, "Other - Specify" (code 8) should also be checked and his supervision status should be specified. If the offender is received from court as a result of a probation revocation or the imposition of a previously suspended sentence, also indicate under "Other - Specify", code 8.

EXAMPLES:

- a) A person is sentenced by the court for murder and transported to a state correctional institution to begin serving his sentence. This admission is a "court commitment."
- b) A person is sentenced in 1975 to serve three years for burglary. He is conditionally released after one year and completes his time on parole. He is now being incarcerated for a burglary committed in 1983 for which he has never served a sentence. This admission is a "court commitment."
- c) An offender receives a sentence of five years, the first 120 days to be served in prison, the remainder on probation. A Prisoner Admission Report should be completed at the time of admission and Item 9 recorded as "court commitment".

2. Returned from appeal or bond:

An offender's reentry into prison after an absence on appeal or bond during which his sentence time was not running. If an inmate's sentence time continues to run while on appeal or bond, no report should be filed.

EXAMPLE:

An inmate in prison is granted an appeal and released on bond. His sentence time is not running. His guilt and sentence are later reaffirmed and he returns to prison to resume service. His admission constitutes a "return from appeal or bond".

3. Transfer:

The admission of a person from the custody of one correctional authority to another while still serving the same sentence.

Do not report movements from prison to prison within your state.

Inmates who have completed a sentence in another state and are transferred to your state to begin serving a new sentence should be recorded as court commitments, parole revocations, or as appropriate.

EXAMPLES:

- a) An inmate serving a prison sentence in 1982 is declared insane and surrendered to the custody of the state's Department of Mental Health. This movement constituted a transfer release. In March of 1983, the inmate is found sane and returns to prison to resume serving the sentence. A Prisoner Admission Report should be completed and the correct response in Item 9 is "Transfer".

- b) An inmate is sentenced in California to serve 5 years for burglary and enters a California prison in 1981. In 1983, he is transferred to a Nevada prison for protective custody. This movement is a release transfer (Form NCRP-1B) for California and an admission transfer (Form NCRP-1A) for Nevada.

ADMISSION CATEGORIES 4 THROUGH 7:

NOTE: For admission categories 4 and 5 you should also respond to categories 6 or 7 to indicate whether the parole or mandatory parole release violator is being admitted on a new sentence or being readmitted on a current sentence. These four categories only apply to parole or mandatory parole release violators who have received a formal revocation. If, at the time of admission, it is not known whether the inmate is being admitted for a new sentence, leave categories 6 and 7 blank. That is, simply specify whether the type of admission is a parole revocation (code 4) or a mandatory parole release revocation (code 5).

Persons pending parole or mandatory parole release revocation are to be reported in the "Other - Specify" category (code 8).

The difference between parole and mandatory parole is when an inmate by LAW must be conditionally released rather than by the DECISION of the paroling authority. This type of release may also be called "mandatory conditional release" or "supervised mandatory release".

4. Parole revocation:

The administrative action of a paroling authority removing a person from parole status in response to a violation of required conditions of parole.

This category is limited to those cases where revocation proceedings have been completed. Persons pending parole revocation should not be reported here but in the "Other - Specify" category (code 8).

5. Mandatory parole release revocation:

The administrative action of a paroling authority removing a person from mandatory parole release in response to technical violations of release conditions. Only include in the category persons who were conditionally released from prison to mandatory parole release.

This category is limited to those cases where revocation proceedings have been completed. Persons pending mandatory parole release revocation should not be reported here but in the "Other - Specify" category (code 8).

6. With new sentence:

The person, while on parole or mandatory release, committed an offense resulting in a new sentence, and is being reincarcerated to begin serving time on the new sentence while completing time on the sentence for which he was originally on parole.

7. No new sentence:

The person violated the terms of his parole or mandatory parole release and is being reincarcerated due to the violation to continue serving time on his original sentence.

EXAMPLES OF CATEGORIES 4 THROUGH 7:

- a) A man, while on parole, commits an armed robbery and is sentenced to serve time for that offense. His parole is revoked, and he enters prison to begin serving time on the new sentence. Codes 4 and 6 are the appropriate responses.
- b) A man, while on mandatory parole release, fails to report to his parole authority. His parole is revoked and he returns to prison to continue serving time on the original sentence. Codes 5 and 7 are the correct responses.
- c) A parolee violates the conditions of his parole and is accused of committing a new offense. His parole is revoked and he is returned to prison. The new charges are still pending; therefore, the correct response is code 4, "Parole revocation" and codes 6 and 7 should be left blank.

8. Other - Specify:

Include in this category those inmates admitted in some other manner other than those listed above, e.g., pending revocation. Also include those persons admitted as a court commitment (code 1) who were known to be on parole or mandatory parole release at the time of admission but had not had their conditional release revoked. Revoked probation cases and those for whom a previously suspended sentence is now being imposed should also be specified in this category. Be sure to specify either type of admission or the type of supervision status on the line provided.

EXAMPLES:

- a) A man is released to parole in 1981. On March 1, 1983 he is charged with another offense and returns to prison to await a revocation hearing and a trial on the new charges. Code his admission as "Other - Specify" and write on the line provided "pending revocation and new charges".
- b) A person is sentenced by the court for murder and is transported to a state prison to begin serving his sentence. At the time of admission, it is known that he is also currently on parole for a previous offense. "Court commitment" (code 1) should be checked as well as "Other - Specify" (code 8). "On parole at time of admission" should be written on the line provided.

99. Not known:

Information not available.

Manual Instructions:

Check the appropriate boxes. If code 1 is checked, you may also check code 8. If code 4 or 5 is checked, you may also check either 6 or 7.

ADP Instructions:

Refer to Appendix C, Record Layout, for the 2-digit designation which describes the types of admission and enter the appropriate code in fields 35-36.

Definition:

The state having the legal authority to enforce a prison sentence.

1. This State's jurisdiction:

The inmate is in the physical custody of the same state that imposed his sentence. Persons under federal jurisdiction and housed in federal facilities should be checked here.

2. Another State's jurisdiction:

The inmate is in the physical custody of a state other than the one which imposed his sentence. Please specify the state which has jurisdiction on the line provided.

For persons housed in federal facilities but under a state's jurisdiction, check here and specify the state on the line provided. For persons housed in a state facility but under federal jurisdiction, check here and specify federal on the line provided.

99. Not known:

Information not available.

Manual Instructions:

Check the appropriate box and specify state if applicable.

ADP Instructions:

Refer to Appendix E, State Codes, and enter in fields 37-38 the 2-digit state code identifying the state having jurisdiction on date of admission.

EXAMPLES:

a) An inmate is convicted of murder in Maryland and sentenced to a 10 year prison term. He begins serving his sentence in the state penitentiary. "This State's jurisdiction" is the correct response.

b) An inmate is convicted of murder in Maryland and sentenced to a 10-year prison term. He begins serving his sentence in a Virginia prison to ensure protective custody. A Prisoner Admission Report would be completed by Virginia authorities since the inmate is in Virginia's custody. "Another State's jurisdiction" would be recorded for Item 10 and "Maryland" would be specified.

c) An inmate is convicted of armed robbery in the District of Columbia and is sentenced to prison for 6 years. Due to his previous incarceration history, he is going to serve his sentence in a federal prison. Therefore, a Prisoner Admission Report will be filled out by federal authorities. The correct response to Item 10 is code 2, "Another State's jurisdiction" and District of Columbia would be specified on the line provided.

The length of time served IN JAIL prior to the date of admission entered in Item 8 and credited to prison service for the current sentence.

If an inmate did not serve any time in jail on the current sentence check "none"; otherwise, enter the actual number of years, months, and days that the inmate spent in jail. If not known at the time of admission leave blank. If Item 11 was left blank at the time of admission and the information is known at the time of release, please fill in to update.

ADP Instructions:

Enter the number of years in fields 39-40, the months in fields 41-42, and the days in fields 43-44. Record 9's in fields 39-44 if prior jail time is not known.

EXAMPLES:

a) An inmate enters prison on March 1, 1983. He was arrested and charged with burglary on January 1, 1983 and spent 2 months in jail awaiting trial. He was convicted on March 1, 1983 and was sentenced to serve two years in prison. The judge allows his time in jail to be credited toward his total sentence. The correct response in Item 11 is:

b) An inmate enters prison on March 1, 1983. He was arrested and charged with burglary on January 1, 1983 and spent two months in jail awaiting trial. He was convicted and sentenced on March 1, 1983. The judge states that his prison time begins running as of his date of sentencing. The correct response in Item 11 is code 0, "None"; no time in jail was credited toward his total sentence.

c) On July 1, 1979 an inmate was admitted to a local jail to begin serving a 5-year sentence for drug trafficking. He was released to parole on December 15, 1980. He is now being admitted to prison on a parole revocation and must serve the remainder of his drug trafficking sentence in prison. The time he served in jail for this offense, prior to his parole, counts toward his total time incarcerated on the current sentence. Therefore, it must be reported. The correct response in Item 11 is:

If it is known that some prior credit had been served but it cannot be distinguished, include it in this category. Do not include any time other than time spent in confinement and credited against the sentence.

Manual Instructions:

If inmate did not serve any time in prison on the current sentence, check "none"; otherwise, enter the actual number of years, months, and days that the inmate spent in prison. If not known at the time of admission, leave blank. If Item 12 was left blank at the time of admission, and the information is known at the time of release, please fill in to update.

ADP Instructions:

Enter the number of years in fields 45-46, the number of months in fields 47-48, and the days in fields 49-50. Zero-fill any field not applicable. Record 9's in fields 45-50 if prior prison time is not known.

EXAMPLES:

a) A man is admitted to prison on June 1, 1975 to begin serving a 10-year term for armed robbery. He is paroled July 10, 1982. He violates the conditions of his parole and returns to prison January 1, 1983 to complete his sentence. The time he served in prison prior to his parole counts toward his total time served for this offense. Therefore it must be reported. The correct response in Item 12 is

b) A man is admitted to prison on June 1, 1975 to begin serving a 10-year term for armed robbery. He is discharged early on July 10, 1982 unconditionally. The correct response in Item 12 is code 0, "None".

Definition:

Crime(s) which resulted in the offender being admitted to prison to serve time on the current sentence(s). For those persons returning to prison, the original offense resulting in the current offense should be indicated.

NOTE: The nine most frequent types of offenses committed are listed in this item. All other offenses including "attempts" or "conspiracies" should be distinguished and entered in "Other - Specify".

Burglary (code 190):

The unlawful entry of any fixed structure, vehicle, or vessel used for regular residence, industry, or business, with or without force, with intent to commit a felony or larceny.

Robbery/armed (code 090):

The unlawful taking of property that is in the immediate possession of another by force or threat of force using a deadly or dangerous weapon.

Forgery/fraud (code 220):

Forgery:

The creation or alteration of a written or printed document which, if validly executed, would constitute a record of a legally binding transaction with the intent to defraud by affirming it to be the act of an unknowing second person; also, the creation of an art object with intent to misrepresent the identity of the creator.

Fraud:

Offenses which share the elements of practice of deceit or intentional misrepresentation of fact, with the intent of unlawfully depriving a person of his property or legal rights.

Aggravated assault (code 120):

Unlawful intentional inflicting of serious bodily injury upon another person by means of a deadly or dangerous weapon.

Larceny/theft (See Appendix F for specific codes):

Unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away by stealth of property, other than a motor vehicle, from the possession or constructive possession of another. (If known, specify the value).

Murder (code 010):

Intentionally or willfully causing the death of another person without legal justification or extreme provocation or causing the death of another while committing or attempting to commit another crime.

Non-vehicular manslaughter (code 030):

Causing the death of another by recklessness or gross negligence other than by a motor vehicle.

Drug trafficking (See Appendix F for specific codes):

The unlawful sale, distribution, or manufacture of a controlled or prohibited drug. (If known, specify the drug).

Forcible rape (code 050):

Carnal knowledge of another person against his/her will, through the use of force or the threat of force.

Other - Specify:

Include all attempts and conspiracies of the above offenses as well as any other offenses not listed. See Appendix F, NCRP Offense Codes, for definitions and codes of all other offenses.

Manual Instructions: Pre-printed Offense Categories

For the nine pre-printed offense categories enter the number of counts for each offense type. Enter a 1 for a single count, and a 2, 3, 4, etc., for multiple counts of the same offense. Do not report offense information on expired sentences, e.g., sentences which the inmate has already completed.

Manual Instructions: "Other - Specify"

Refer to Appendix F, NCRP Offense Codes, and enter the code for the first offense (fields 51-56), the number of counts of that offense (fields 57-58), the amount of larceny/theft if applicable (fields 59-64), and a code describing the drug type and activity if a drug violation (fields 65-70). The correct response in Item 14a is code 190 (burglary), and in Item 14b, 5 years.

- b) A man enters prison to begin serving time for two sentences. He received 5 years for burglary and 5 years for drug trafficking, both sentences to be served concurrently. In your state, burglary is determined to be the "controlling" offense. Therefore, the correct response in Item 14a is code 190 (burglary), and in Item 14b, 5 years.
- c) A woman enters prison to begin serving time for three counts of burglary. She received 6 years for the first count, 6 for the second, and 4 for the third all to be served consecutively. The correct response in Item 14a is code 190 (burglary) and in Item 14b, 6 years. Each count is to be considered separately when they carry their own sentence length.

Suspended Sentences:

If all or a portion of a maximum sentence has been conditionally suspended, that is, the sentenced person may in the future be required to serve the suspended sentence or a portion of the suspended sentence under certain circumstances, report as "Maximum Sentence" the sum of the unsuspended and the suspended portions of each maximum sentence.

If all or a portion of a maximum sentence has been unconditionally suspended, that is, the person cannot be required to serve the suspended sentence or portion under any circumstances, report as "Maximum Sentence" only the unsuspended sentences or portions of sentences. DO NOT REPORT UNCONDITIONALLY SUSPENDED SENTENCES.

Split Sentences/Shock Probation

For split sentences or shock probation, enter as the maximum sentence the SUM of the prison and probation segments.

Manual Instructions:

Check either "Life", "Death", or enter the number of years and months in the appropriate boxes.

ADP INSTRUCTIONS

Record the years (fields 122-124) and months (fields 125-126) indicating the maximum sentence length for all offenses. Enter '99996' if that maximum sentence length is Life, a '99997' if the sentence is Death, or a '99999' if the maximum sentence length is not known.

EXAMPLES

- a) An inmate receives a sentence of three years for possession of marijuana, two years conditionally suspended. He will be placed under the supervision of a parole officer after being imprisoned for one year. The correct response for Item 15 is 3 years; that is, if his behavior is not satisfactory, he may serve 3 years in prison.
- b) A person receives a sentence of 5 years for burglary, one year unconditionally suspended. He will receive no supervision during the one year regardless of his behavior. The correct response for Item 15 is 4 years.
- c) A person receives a 10-year sentence for armed robbery, is paroled after 3 years, but returns to prison on a technical violation 6 months later. The correct response for Item 15 is 10 years, reflecting his original maximum sentence.
- d) A first offender receives a 5-year sentence for manslaughter, 90 days to be served in prison and the remainder on probation. The correct response for Item 15 is 5 years.
- e) An offender enters prison to serve 6 years on a burglary conviction and 5 years on a drug conviction. The two sentences are to be served consecutively. The correct response for Item 15 is 11 years.
- f) An offender enters prison to serve 6 years on a burglary conviction and 5 years on a drug conviction. The two sentences are to be served concurrently. Therefore, the correct response for Item 15 is 6 years.

- a) An offender enters prison to serve a 2 to 10 year sentence for robbery, 2 years of which are mandatory regardless of his behavior. The correct response in Item 16 is 2 years.
- b) An offender receives a maximum sentence of 10 years for robbery. State statutes provide that parole eligibility is possible after one-fourth of the sentence is served. The correct response is:

A confinement facility administered by an agency of the local government, intended for adults but sometimes also containing juveniles, which holds persons detained pending adjudication and/or persons committed after adjudication, usually those committed on sentences of a year or less.

3. Other- Specify:

All facilities except state prisons or local jails which house sentenced prisoners. Federal prisons are to be included in this category and should be specified as such.

Information not available.

Manual Instructions:

Check box 1 or 2 if appropriate, or specify type of facility where the inmate is to serve his/her sentence on the line provided.

ADP Instructions:

Enter code 1 or 2 as appropriate in fields 132-133 or supply your own coding scheme to indicate location of inmate. Enter a 99 if the location where the inmate is to serve sentence is not known.

EXAMPLES:

- a) An offender is sentenced to serve 5 years for a burglary conviction. Due to prison overcrowding he is to be housed in the local jail. The correct response is "Local jail".
- b) An offender is admitted to prison to serve 5 years for a burglary conviction. He is then placed in an alcohol treatment facility and will stay there until completion of the program--a minimum of 1 year. The correct response is "Other" and "Alcohol treatment facility" should be specified.

If there is no additional time, check "None". If there is additional time, enter the number of years and months or check "Life" or "Death" in the appropriate boxes.

ADP Instructions:

Record the years (fields 146-148) and months (fields 149-150) indicating the additional sentence time the inmate must serve. Enter '99996' if the additional sentence is Life, a '99997' if the additional sentence is Death, or a '99999' if the additional sentence is not known. Zero-fill all fields (146-150) if there is no additional sentence time.

EXAMPLE:

- a) A parolee is readmitted to prison for violating his parole with 6 months remaining on his sentence. After three months in prison, he receives an additional 5-year sentence for a new burglary conviction to be served consecutive to the current sentence. The correct response is:

- b) A parolee is readmitted to prison for violating his parole with 5 years remaining on his sentence. After being admitted to prison, he receives an additional 5-year sentence for a new burglary conviction to be served concurrent to the current sentence. The correct response is "None".

ITEM 20. PRIOR FELONY INCARCERATIONS

20. Prior felony incarcerations. Was this person ever incarcerated for a felony prior to the admission date shown in item 8?

Definition:

An offender who had ever been previously sentenced to confinement for a felony as a juvenile or adult prior to his current prison admission (Item 8).

Do not report detentions before trial or sentencing.

Do not report nonincarceration sentences such as probation, unless at some point prison service occurred.

Manual Instructions:

Check the appropriate box.

ADP Instructions:

Enter the appropriate code in field 151.

EXAMPLE:

Ten years ago, a man served 3 years in prison for robbery and was released, having satisfied the conditions of his sentence. He is once again being admitted to begin serving time on a new sentence. The correct response is "Yes".

Manual Instructions:

Check appropriate box.

ADP Instructions:

Enter the appropriate code in field 152.

EXAMPLE:

An offender has completed his prison term of 5 years for larceny. During the first year of his sentence, he escaped from prison and was returned soon after. The correct response is "Yes".

2. Local jail:

A confinement facility administered by an agency of the local government, intended for adults but sometimes also containing juveniles, which holds persons detained pending adjudication and/or persons committed after adjudication, usually those committed on sentences of a year or less.

3. Other - Specify:

All facilities except state prisons or local jails which house sentenced prisoners, e.g., halfway house, mental facility, hospital. Federal prisons are to be included in this category and should be specified as such.

Manual Instructions:

Check box 1, 2, or 3 if appropriate. If 3 is checked, specify the type of facility from which the inmate was released.

ADP Instructions:

Enter the appropriate code (01 = State prison facility, 02 = Local jail) OR your own code to indicate the location of the inmate in fields 163-164. Enter a 99 if the facility from which the inmate is released from is not known.

EXAMPLES:

- a) An offender served a 2-year prison term for burglary in the local jail due to overcrowding at the state penitentiary. The correct response is "Local jail".
- b) An offender was sentenced to 18 months for a drug offense. The first 12 months were served in a drug rehabilitation program in a county hospital. The offender then served the rest of his sentence in prison. "State prison facility" is the correct response.

Definition:

Type and location of agency which is assuming custody (physical or supervisory) over an inmate's freedom at the time of release.

NOTE: For each of the 5 categories shown, specify whether the agency is within your state, outside of your state, or within the Federal system. Include agencies assuming physical custody, e.g., prisons, as well as supervisory custody, e.g., parole.

Other prison:

The inmate, at the time of release, is going to be incarcerated in a correctional facility operated by another state (code 01) or the federal prison system (code 02).

Parole:

The inmate, at the time of release, is being placed under the supervision of a parole authority within your state (code 03), outside your state (code 04), or in the federal system (code 05).

Probation:

The inmate, at the time of release, is being placed under the supervision of a court or probation authority within your state (code 06), outside your state (code 07), or in the federal system (code 08).

Mental/Medical Facility:

The inmate, at the time of release, is under the supervision of a social service agency or medical hospital within your state (code 09), outside your state (code 10), or in the federal system (code 11), which diagnoses, monitors, or treats mental, emotional, and/or physical problems. Therapeutic drug/alcohol facilities which have authority over the inmate's freedom are included here.

5. Other - Specify:

Any other agency or facility which is going to have custody over a released inmate's freedom and is located within your state (code 12), outside your state (code 13), or in the federal system (code 14).

Manual Instructions:

If there was no agency that assumed custody of the inmate at time of release check "None". Otherwise, check all agencies assuming custody (either supervisory or physical) using the appropriate codes to specify within state, outside state, or federal.

ADP Instructions:

Refer to Appendix C, Record Layout, to determine the appropriate fields for the various agencies. For each agency that is not applicable, enter a 99.

EXAMPLES:

- a) An inmate is released from a state prison to a detainer from federal authorities. He is transported to a federal prison in another state. "Other Prison, Federal" (code 02) is the correct response.
- b) After serving two-thirds of his sentence, an offender is required by law to be placed on parole. He will be supervised by the paroling authority of that state. "parole, Within State" (code 03) is the correct response.

Definition:

Method of departure from your prison system's custody.

Conditional:

The release from a federal or state correctional facility of a prisoner who has not completed his or her sentence, and whose freedom is contingent upon obeying specified rules of behavior while in the community. The offender can be reincarcerated on current sentence(s).

01. Parole board decision:

A conditional release by a board or commission which has the authority to release on parole adults committed to prison, to revoke parole, and to discharge from parole.

EXAMPLE:

An inmate is granted a release by the Parole Board after serving 3 years of a 10 year sentence. "Parole board decision" is the correct response.

02. Mandatory parole release:

A conditional release from prison not determined by a Parole Board.

NOTE: Persons receiving mandatory supervised parole are usually subject to the same conditions as parolees, and can be returned to prison by a parole board decision for technical violations of release conditions. The difference is that the release is not a paroling authority discretionary decision.

EXAMPLE:

An inmate served a 3 year sentence for heroin possession. The law requires that the inmate be released at this time to parole. "Mandatory parole release" is the correct response.

03. Probation release:

A conditional release to court supervision or supervision by a probation authority following commitment to usually brief confinement in a prison facility. These cases are often called "split sentence" or "shock probation".

EXAMPLE:

An offender serves 180 days in prison and returns to court for a hearing. The judge allows him to serve the remainder of his sentence on probation. The correct response is "probation".

04. Other conditional releases - Specify:

All other conditional releases not covered by the preceding categories. Always describe the nature of the release.

NOTE: THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE INCLUDED ON FORM NCRP-1B (PRISONER RELEASE REPORT). IF ANY OF THE ITEMS BELOW ARE MARKED, DISCARD FORM NCRP-1C (PAROLE RELEASE REPORT).

Unconditional:

The final release of an offender from the custody of a correctional agency. The offender cannot be reincarcerated on sentence(s).

05. Expiration of sentence:

The termination of the period of time during which an offender has been required to be under the custody of a state prison as the penalty for an offense.

EXAMPLES:

- a) A person given a maximum sentence of 5 years for robbery is released, without parole supervision, after serving 5 years. His release is an "expiration of sentence".
- b) A person given a maximum sentence of 5 years for robbery is released, without parole supervision, after serving 3 1/2 years and receiving 1 1/2 years of irrevocable "good time". His release is an "expiration of sentence".

06. Commutation/pardon:

A reduction of the term of confinement or a Governor's pardon resulting in immediate unconditional release or reduction of remaining time to be served.

EXAMPLE:

After the legislature reduced marijuana offenses from felonies to misdemeanors, the 15-year sentence of a person is reduced by the Governor to actual time served, 2 1/2 years, and the inmate is unconditionally released. The correct response is "Commutation/pardon".

07. Release to custody, detainer, or warrant:

In releasing an inmate to custody unconditionally, the original prison authority relinquishes all claims upon him or her.

A detainer is an official notice from a government agency to a correctional agency requesting that a person wanted by the first agency, but subject to the correctional agency's jurisdiction, not be released or discharged without notification to the first agency. The placing of a detainer is often, but not always, subsequent to the issuing of a warrant. Typical reasons for detainers are that the person is wanted for trial in the requesting jurisdiction or is wanted to serve a sentence.

Example:

A man is serving three years for armed robbery in Maine. Extradition papers from Texas on another armed robbery charge await him, however, so he is released to Texas custody.

08. Other unconditional release - Specify:

All other unconditional releases not covered by the preceding three categories. Always describe the nature of the release.

DEATH: If an inmate dies while in the custody of this state prison system, report his death using one of the six categories below. All deaths, regardless of the nature, are to be included.

09. Natural causes:

Death due to illness, old age, etc.

10. Suicide:

Self-explanatory

11. Homicide by another inmate:

Self-explanatory

12. Other homicide:

Causing the death of an inmate, by a person other than an inmate, without legal justification or excuse.

13. Execution:

Self-explanatory

14. Other - Specify:

All other deaths not covered by the preceding five categories. Always specify the manner of death.

NOTE: Accidental self-injury or accidental injury by another person (whether caused by another inmate or not) should be included in "Other - Specify".

OTHER RELEASES

15. Transfer:

The movement of a person from the custody of your state's correctional facility to the custody of another authority while serving the same sentence. Do not report movements from prison to prison within your state.

EXAMPLE:

An inmate is found to be endangered by other inmates. He is transferred to the custody of another state to complete his sentence. "Transfer" is the correct response.

16. Release on appeal or bond:

The release of an offender who is no longer credited with prison time while out on appeal or bond. If the inmate's time remaining on the sentence continues to run, do not file a release report.

NOTE: Do not report temporary movements to court, for example, in order to testify or appear at a brief hearing.

17. Other - Specify:

All other releases not specifically defined among the above categories. Always clearly specify the kind of release.

Verify that all releases reported in this category are:

- a) releases from the custody of this prison system.
- b) releases of sentenced persons.

Manual Instructions:

Check the appropriate box.

ADP Instructions:

Enter the appropriate 2-digit code in fields 171-172.

Enter the month of release from parole in fields 173-174, the day in fields 175-176, and the year in fields 177-178. If the month, day, or year is not known, enter a 99 in the respective fields.

EXAMPLE:

A person is released from prison to serve the remaining three years of his sentence on parole. He completes his sentence on April 1, 1983 and parole jurisdiction is terminated. A Parole Release Report is filed and "Date of Release from Parole" is recorded as:

Definition:

The most recent reason for termination of parole jurisdiction.

01. Discharged, completion of term:

The release of parolees who have served full-term sentences or who have been released early due to a parole decision, commutation, or pardon.

EXAMPLE:

A parolee, released from prison, is required to serve three years on parole. He finishes the three years and is discharged by the Adult Parole Authority. "Discharged, completion of term" is the correct response.

02. Discharged, absconder:

The release of parolees while known to be on absconder status, regardless of whether a warrant has been issued. This category should be used if the parolee has been formally discharged from the paroling agency, or if parole jurisdiction has been terminated. Absconders who have been released from parole and returned to jail or prison should also be recorded in one of the codes 04-07.

EXAMPLES:

- a) A parolee in Wyoming moves to New Mexico in December 1982 without the permission of the Wyoming Board of Parole. After six months, jurisdiction is relinquished. "Discharged, absconder" is the correct response.
- b) A parolee in Wyoming moves to New Mexico in December 1982 without permission of the Wyoming Board of Parole. Jurisdiction has not been relinquished as of December 31, 1983. No Parole Release Report is filed for this parolee.

03. Discharged, to custody, detainer, or warrant:

The release of parolees from parole jurisdiction to the custody of a non-correctional agency, e.g., mental hospital. In this category, a detainer is an official notice from a government agency to the Parole Authority requesting that a person wanted by the first agency not be released from parole jurisdiction without advance notification to the first agency. The placing of a detainer is often, but not always, subsequent to the issuing of a warrant. Typical reasons for detainers are that the parolee is wanted for trial in the requesting jurisdiction. If a person has been released from parole jurisdiction to custody, detainer, or warrant and returned to jail or prison, one of the codes 04-07 should be marked.

EXAMPLE:

A Wisconsin parolee is discharged as a result of an extradition request from Texas. He is released to Texas custody on a warrant. "Discharged, to custody, detainer, or warrant" is the correct response.

NOTE: Codes 04, 05, 06, and 07 should only be checked if parole jurisdiction has been terminated and the person has been returned to prison or jail.

04. Returned to prison or jail, new sentence:

The readmission of a parolee into the custody of a prison or jail after receiving a sentence for an additional offense(s). If a person whose parole has been revoked is admitted to prison or jail with a new sentence, "Returned to prison or jail, new sentence" (code 04) should be checked.

EXAMPLE:

While out on parole an offender commits a crime and is sentenced to serve two years in prison. Parole jurisdiction is terminated. "Returned to prison or jail, new sentence" is the correct response.

05. Returned to prison or jail, parole revocation:

The readmission of a parolee into the custody of a prison or jail due to the violation of the conditions of his parole. If a parolee with charges pending has had his parole revoked, "Returned to prison or jail, parole revocation" (code 05) should be checked.

EXAMPLE:

A parolee in Wisconsin violates the conditions of his parole. The Adult Parole Board formally revokes his parole and the offender is returned to the county jail to continue serving his sentence. "Return to prison or jail, parole revocation" is the correct response.

06. Returned to prison or jail, revocation pending:

The readmission of a parolee into the custody of a prison or jail for the alleged violation of the conditions of parole, to await a revocation hearing, or to receive a final disposition from a revocation hearing. Count only persons returned to prison or jail with revocations pending if this involves termination of parole jurisdiction in your state.

EXAMPLE:

A parolee in Ohio is accused of violating conditions of his parole. Parole jurisdiction has been terminated and he is sent to the state prison to await a decision from the Parole Authority concerning possible revocation. "Return to prison or jail, revocation pending" is the correct response.

07. Returned to prison or jail, charges pending:

The readmission of a parolee into the custody of a prison or jail for the alleged commitment of a new offense, to await trial, or imposition of a new sentence. Count only persons returned to prison or jail with charges pending if parole jurisdiction is terminated.

EXAMPLE:

A parolee in Florida is charged with committing a new offense. Parole jurisdiction has been terminated and he is held in the local jail to await trial for the new charge. "Returned to prison or jail, charges pending" is the correct response.

08. Transferred to another parole jurisdiction:

The movement of a parolee to another state when parole jurisdiction is terminated. Do not include those interstate compact cases where only supervisory responsibility is transferred but legal jurisdiction is retained by your state, e.g., parole termination is still determined by your state.

EXAMPLES:

a) A parolee in Mississippi finds a new job in Alabama. The Mississippi Parole Board arranges for the parolee to be supervised in Alabama through an interstate compact agreement. Jurisdiction is not terminated therefore no Parole Release Report is filed.

b) A parolee in Mississippi find a new job in Alabama. The Alabama Board of Pardons and Paroles agrees to assume jurisdiction for the parolee; Mississippi then terminates jurisdiction. "Transfer to another jurisdiction" is the correct response.

09. Death:

Self-explanatory

10. Other - Specify:

All other removals from parole jurisdiction not covered in the previous categories. Please clearly describe this type of release from parole.

99. Not known:

Information not available.

Manual Instructions:

Check the appropriate box. If "Other - Specify" is checked, specify the type of release.

ADP Instructions:

Enter in fields 179-180 the appropriate codes. If type of release from parole is not known, enter 99.

1. Active:

Contact (in person, by mail, or telephone) at least once a month during the last year of parole supervision.

EXAMPLES:

- a) A parolee in Oregon visits his parole officer the first Friday of every month. "Active" supervision status would be the correct response.
- b) A parolee in Maryland receives a form once a month in the mail from his parole officer. He completes it and sends it back regularly. "Active" supervision status would be the correct response.

2. Inactive:

All parolees who did not report at least once a month during the last year of parole supervision, but were held accountable and remained under your agency's jurisdiction.

EXAMPLE:

An offender has been out on parole for five years. After three years of active supervision, no active contact is required. "Inactive" is the correct response.

3. Absconded:

All parolees who fail to report to the Parole Authority or leave the geographical area of supervision without permission.

EXAMPLE:

A parolee in Wyoming moves to New Mexico without the permission of the Wyoming Parole Board. Parole jurisdiction is soon relinquished. "Absconded" is the correct response.

4. Supervised out of State:

All parolees who served their parole in a different state other than yours but at discharge are subject to your jurisdiction.

EXAMPLE:

A parolee in Arizona finds a new job in Texas. The Texas Board of Pardons and Parole agrees to monitor his parole although the Arizona Board of Pardons and Parole does not relinquish jurisdiction. Parole supervision is terminated by Texas with Arizona approval. "Supervised out of State" is the correct response.

5. "Other - Specify":

All other parolees not covered by the above categories. Please specify the nature of their supervision status.

Manual Instructions:

Check the appropriate box. If "Other - Specify" is checked, specify the supervision status.

ADP Instructions:

Refer to Appendix C, Record Layout, and enter the appropriate 2-digit code in fields 181-182.

CHAPTER 5. ADP PROCEDURES

TYPE OF FILES

The Bureau of the Census requests that you submit ADP data on magnetic tapes.

NOTE: Blank tapes will be supplied upon request.

FILE SPECIFICATIONS

A "Data File Specifications Sheet" must accompany each file transmitted. Multiple "Data File Specifications Sheets" are provided in Appendix G.

General Comments:

- document data sets as thoroughly as possible, including codes used, field descriptions, and a listing of offense codes.
- standard IBM or ANSI labels are acceptable; otherwise, no labels.
- all numeric data should be right justified and alpha-numeric data should be left-justified; positions not used should be blank-filled.
- any variable for which you do not have the information should be filled with 9's, e.g., 9 for a single-character field, 99 for a two-character field, 999 for a three-character field, etc.
- include, if possible, a printout of the first 25 records on the tape. Printed output of the job control language of the process used to create the tape would also be helpful.

DOCUMENTATION OF DATA

Each state is requested to submit ADP files in the NCRP record layout with NCRP codes. Appendix C contains record layouts for the Prisoner Admission Report (NCRP-1A), the Prisoner Release Report (NCRP-1B), and the Parole Release Report (NCRP-1C).

Item and Code Interfaces

The "User Record Description" document (Appendix H) will allow you to describe each variable on your NCRP files. If you cannot provide your data in the preferred record format (Appendix C), please complete a "User Record Description" document (Appendix H). If your file is in the requested NCRP record layout and utilizes NCRP codes, completion of the "User Record Description" document will not be necessary.

We encourage each state to convert their state's offense coding scheme to the NCRP offense codes as presented in Appendix F. If this is not possible, please remember to include a current set of your state's offense codes.

Annotating Discrepancies

All differences between a state's system and the NCRP system are significant, possibly biasing outputs. Please inform us about any discrepancies. Crucial differences may include:

- a. Particular kinds of movements--unable to be reported or distinguished from other kinds.
- b. Dates--close to, but different from, those required by NCRP
- c. Offenses--unable to distinguish or recode

Please call Census Staff to discuss any definitional or reporting problems you encounter with prisoner admission or release data on 301-763-2061 or with parole release data on 301-763-7825.

Common ADP Errors

The following errors have been found to occur most frequently among ADP respondents.

1. Attempting to prepare NCRP files using only master files:

These files may be insufficient for three reasons: 1) the master files contain only currently (at time of file run) active records, and therefore miss entirely the movements of persons released before the computer run date; 2) even for active person records, only one movement, the most recent, is recorded, thus missing earlier NCRP defined movements in the same year by the same person; and, 3) since master records typically display only the most recent movement, reports generated from master files cannot reliably report type of admission, an essential element in NCRP outputs. Most states have been able to avoid these problems by using HISTORY files.

2. Neglecting to verify and compare outputs:

Unfortunately, data submitted to NCRP by a state has sometimes disagreed significantly with the state's own publications. Before sending us your files, please compare NCRP file counts to those shown in your state's own report. Where differences occur, please correct the NCRP file or thoroughly document the differences.

Resolution of Difficulties

NCRP staff are anxious to resolve difficulties as quickly and efficiently as possible. Problems with prison admission and release data not covered by this manual should be addressed to the Bureau of the Census either by letter or telephone.

CONVERTING FROM MANUAL TO ADP REPORTING SYSTEMS

Please contact NCRP staff if you plan to convert your manual reporting system to automated. Technical assistance can be provided that may help in this conversion process. Occasionally states will continue reporting on a manual basis until the ADP file has been reviewed by NCRP and problems or quirks are worked out. It is hoped that this review can be accomplished quickly and that this procedure will not cause you any problems.

A INTRODUCTION

This procedure provides clerical editing and coding instructions for the 1983 National Corrections Reporting Program (NCRP) questionnaires. Approximately 12,000 Prisoner Admission Reports (NCRP-1A's), 10,000 Prisoner Release Reports (NCRP-1B's) and 8,000 Parole Release Reports (NCRP-1C's) will be forwarded to CPB for processing.

C GENERAL INFORMATION

National Corrections Reporting Program (NCRP)

- 1 In 1983, the National Prisoners Statistics (NPS) Admissions and Release Program and the Uniform Parole Reports (UPR) combined under one reporting system, the NCRP.
- 2 The NCRP reporting form consists of a 3-page no carbon required (NCR) questionnaire.
 - a The first page is the NCRP-1A (Prisoner Admission Report).
 - b The second page is the NCRP-1B (Prisoner Release Report).
 - c The third page is the NCRP-1C (Parole Release Report).

NOTE: These three types of NCRP reports will be batched into separate work units.

D GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1 Use a red lead pencil for editing and coding entries.
- 2 Use a green pencil for recording data provided by the site contact during follow-up calls.

- 15 Refer to Appendix L for Special Editing Instructions by State.

a For each inmate listed in Appendix L, correct the NCRP report according to the instructions in item E of Appendix L ("Corrections Needed").

b Complete the corrections in Appendix L before applying the "Specific Instructions" in Section E of this procedure.

- 16 If a correctional site forwards a mostly blank NCRP report to CPB, call the site to obtain the missing items.

18 "Same as above" entries

If an entry for an item indicates "same as above," interpret this entry to mean the entry for the current item should be identical to the previous item. This instruction applies to such items as 11 and 12 or 14b, 15, and 16. Proceed as follows:

- a Delete the "same as above" entry.
- b Make the current item the same as the previous item.

20 Units of Time

- a When converting units of time, perform all calculations manually.
- b If fractions or decimals are entered, convert the fraction or decimal to a whole number.

(1) If the year is entered in fractions or decimals:

- (a) Delete the fraction or decimal.
- (b) Convert the fraction or decimal to a whole number by multiplying the fraction or decimal by 12 (months).
- (c) Enter the answer in the boxes for months.

22 Problem Referral

a Complete a Problem Referral form DP-92 dated 12-15-83, (see Appendix I) for the following:

- (2) Items which are referred to the supervisor

EXCEPTION: Do not complete a Problem Referral form for an item with a write-in entry on the log (Appendix K).

- (3) Items which require a telephone call to the reporting site.

- (7) Enter your initials and date in item 7.
- (8) Enter your initials and date in item 8, if you resolve the problem.
NOTE: The problem may be resolved by the clerk after telephoning the site, by the supervisor after reviewing the DP-92 Problem Referral form, or by the Washington staff.
- (9) For each item with a problem, enter:
 - (a) the sequence number from the upper right-hand corner of the NCRP report to item 9(a),
 - (b) the inmate ID number to item 9(b),
 - (c) the item number to item 9(c),
 - (d) the description of the problem to item 9(d),
 - (e) the resolution to the problem will be entered by your supervisor without necessitating your telephoning, by you after telephoning, or by someone in Washington, to item 9(e). Washington resolutions will be entered in blue ink.

- (f) Mark "X" in item 9(f) to indicate that the Jeffersonville staff called the site but the site did not understand the item listed in 9(d) of the Problem Referral Form. Therefore, the "X" indicates further follow-up is required by the Washington staff.

NOTE: When a work unit has been edited and coded, give the work unit with the completed Problem Referral forms to the supervisor. The supervisor will assign the work unit for verification.

23 Verification

- a Verify all work units 100%.
- b Correct all detected errors.
- c Sort the reports (by state and site) which require telephone calls or referring to Washington.

- (1) If there are Washington referrals in the work unit, enter that count in the item 3 "Number" box of the Work Unit Transmittal Folder (Appendix J).

NOTE: The NCRP-1A and NCRP-1B reports will be forwarded to Irenita Assensoh, MPQC Branch, in Demographic Surveys Division. The NCRP-1C reports will be forwarded to Diana Cull in Governments Division.

- (2) Indicate the number of reports which require a telephone call by entering the number of reports in the item 6 "Number" box of the Work Unit Transmittal Folder.

- (1) Call the site after the supervisor has determined that an appropriate number of referrals, for a site, has been accumulated.

However, if the site contact insists on calling Jeffersonville, it is acceptable for the site contact to call Jeffersonville collect.

b Contacting the Institution

- (1) Refer to Appendix A for the names and telephone numbers of the institutional contacts which are listed by state and site. Locate the state and site of your telephone assignment and call the contact listed for that state and site.

(2) When you reach the contact person:

- (a) Identify yourself and say that you are calling from the Bureau of the Census to clarify some items on the National Corrections Reporting Program report (specify either NCRP-1A, NCRP-1B or NCRP-1C) which you received from the institution.
- (b) Provide the person with:
- 1 Type of report (NCRP-1A Prisoner Admission Report, NCRP-1B Prisoner Release Report, or NCRP-1C Parole Release Report)
 - 2 Inmate ID (item 2a)
 - 3 Problem item(s) on the report .
- (c) Do not lead the contact in any manner that could possibly bias his/her response. Do provide him/her with any information that has already been received from the institution which might help him/her to complete the form or find additional records.
- (d) If a contact cannot understand an item on the NCRP report, inform the contact person that a person from the Bureau of the Census in Washington will call him/her to clarify the problem item. Check () item 9, column (e) "Follow-up call required by Wash." on the DP-92 Problem Referral form.

(3) Record any information provided by the contact person in green in the appropriate data location on the report and in item 9(d) of the Problem Referral form.

(4) When you have completed the call to the contact:

- (a) Complete item 9(d) ("Resolution") and item 8 ("Resolved by").

NOTE: If the site contact cannot provide information to resolve the problem, enter the reason in column (d) ("Resolution") and also enter your initials in column (d).

- (b) Sort the completed reports from those which still require Washington referral work. Maintain the Washington referrals in the same sequence as they appear on the DP-92, Problem Referral form.
- (c) Return the sorted reports and corresponding Problem Referral forms to your supervisor for review and transmittal to Washington. NCRP-1A and NCRP-1B reports will be referred to Irenita Assensoh in MPQC Branch. NCRP-1C reports will be referred to Diana Cull in Governments Division.

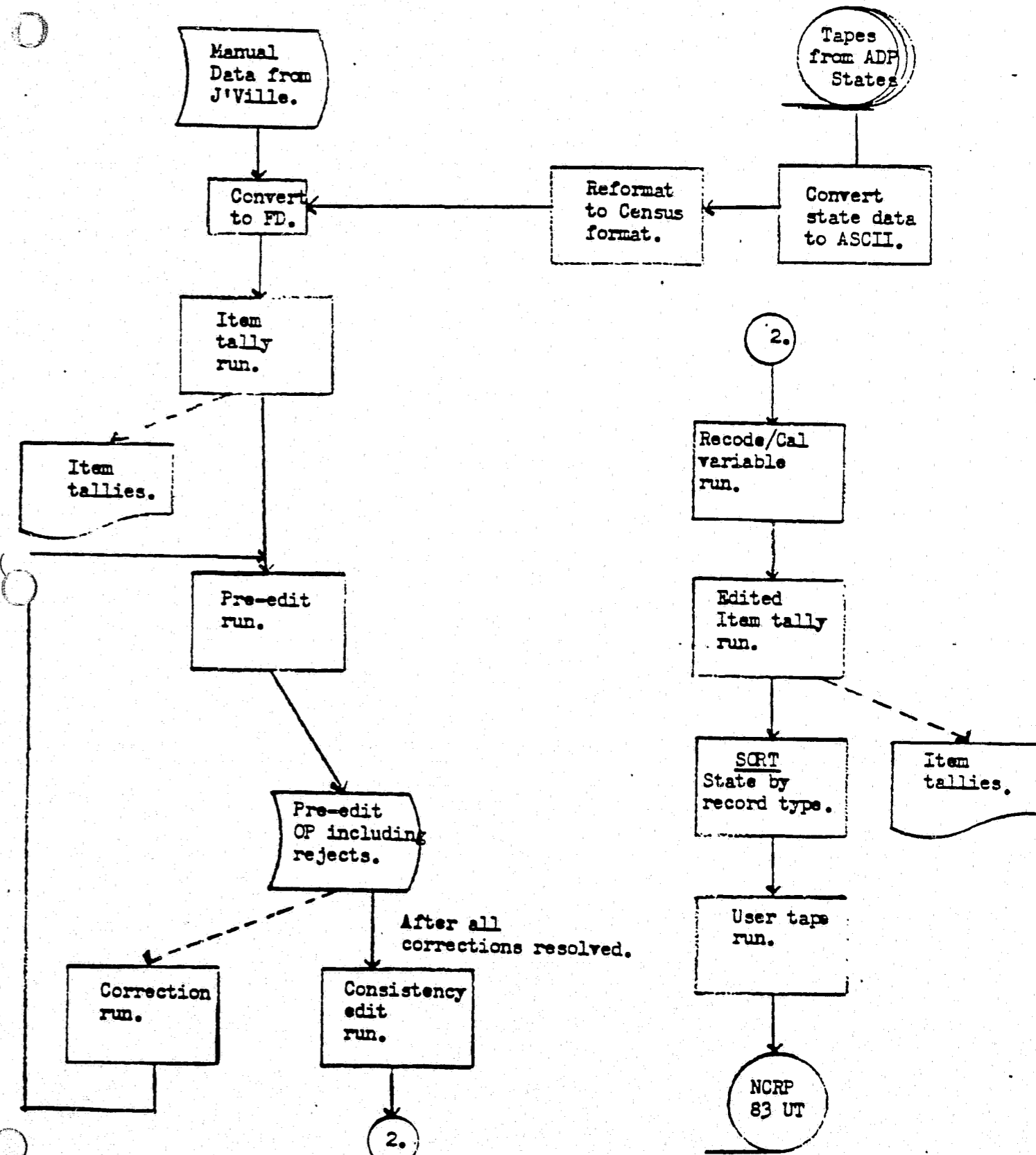

Pre-edit Specifications

A. Check for Duplicates and Consecutive Movements

The function of this check is to identify and remove duplicate records and to help determine if multiple records for the same inmate represent plausible chronological movement into and out of the correctional system. For the following situations take the action specified and provide a print-out of each record deleted.

B. Critical Entry Check

The purpose of the critical entry check is to identify records missing significant information. If the responses for items included in this check are illegal, not known, or blank (95, 98, or 99), we may not be able to identify duplicates, verify consecutive movement or calculate the special variables. Counts of records failing the critical entry check will be reviewed to determine the impact of the omission or error on the individual records as well as on the State's entire submission. Corrections to the file may or may not be made depending upon the seriousness of the problem.

Every record must be checked against each of the error descriptions provided below. If one or more of the descriptions fit, reject the record. All errors should be identified and appropriately flagged. Sort the reject file by state, record type, and I.D. Provide a count of the number of records rejected by flag by state.
